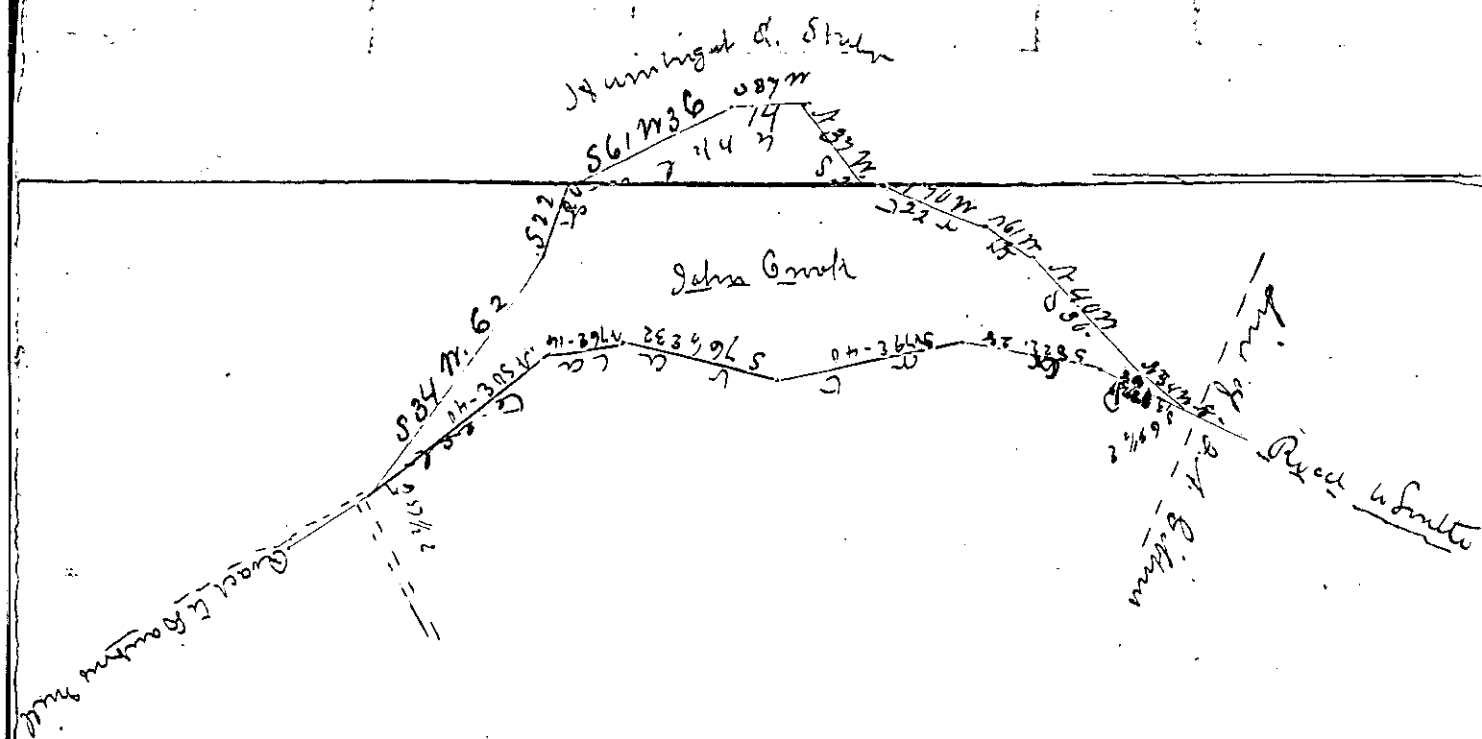

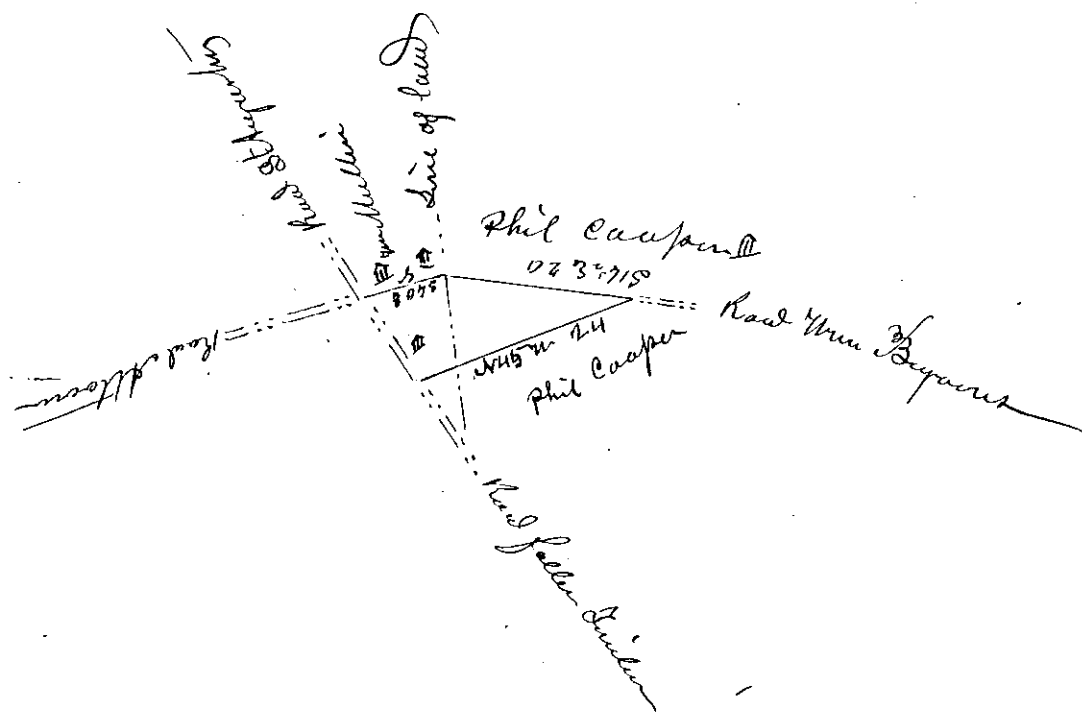

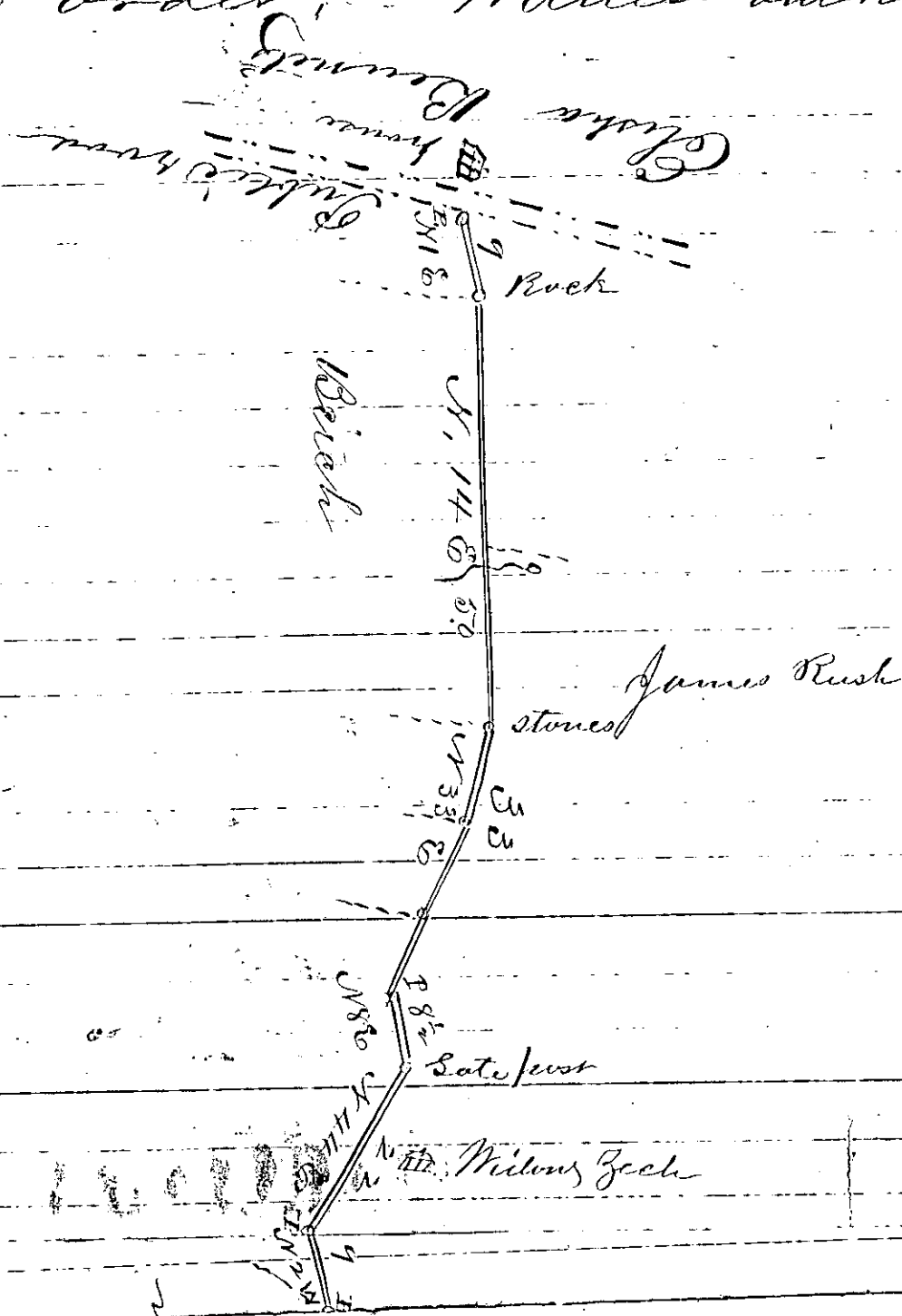

Report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same
proper for Public or Private Road, together with a Plan
or Draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and
reference to the improvements thereof which it may pass, to the
next County Quarter Session to be held for the said County.

been from a former.

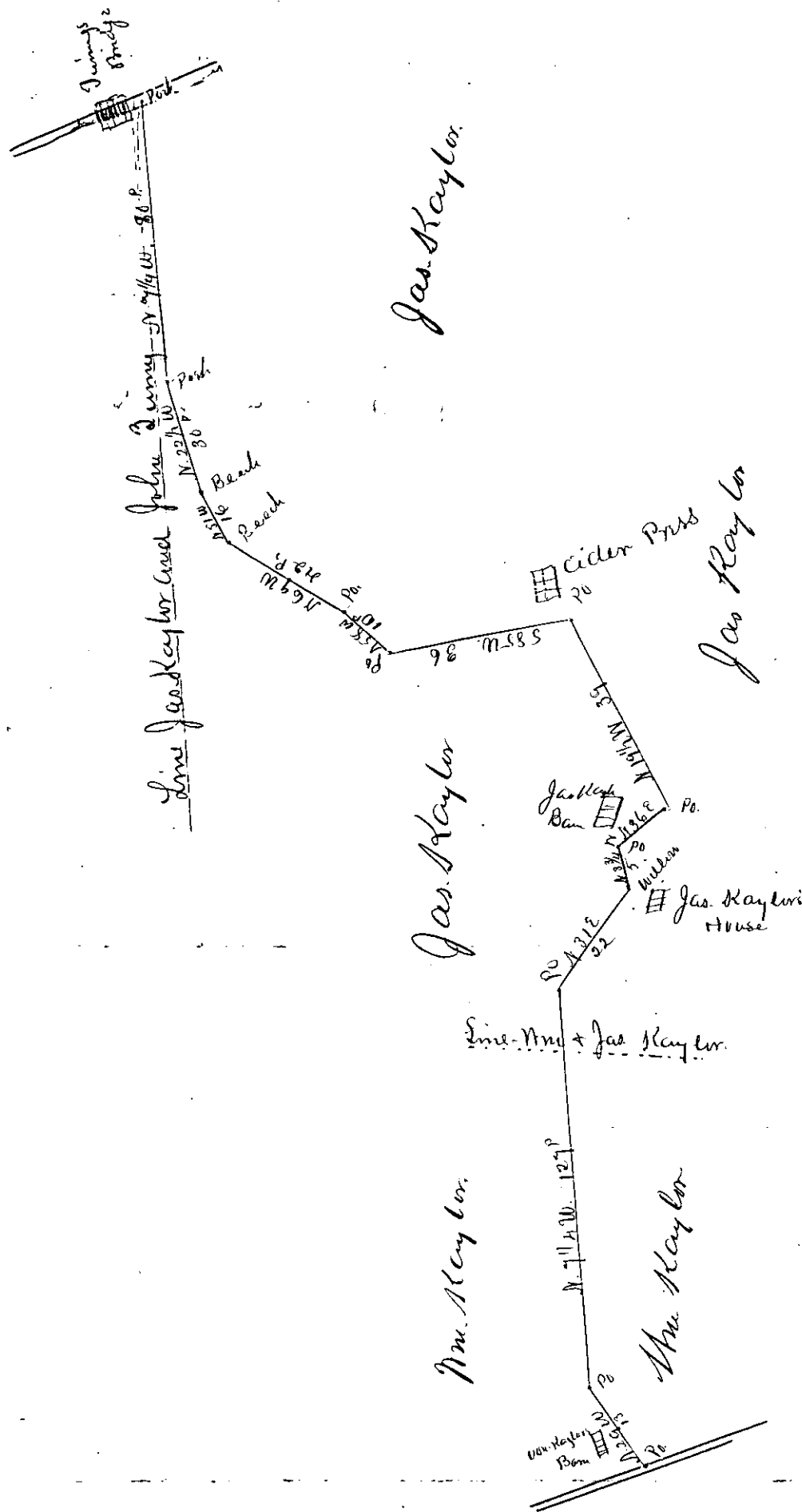
