stream to the place of beginning.

Assembly in such case made and provided.

ORIGIN OF CAMBRIA COUNTY

It may be of interest to you as a citizen, to know something about the origin of Cambria County. I have prepared for you, from the records in my office, and other research records the following data:

The territory comprised within the limits of Cambria County was formed in to a separate county by an Act of Assembly passed the 26th day of March, 1804. The territory comprising it was taken from the counties of Huntingdon and Somerset. The Act provided "That so much of the Counties of Huntingdon and Somerset, included in the following boundaries, to-wit: Beginning at the Conemaugh river, at the southeast corner of Indiana County, thence by a straight line to the Canoe Run on the West Branch of the Susquehanna; thence westerly along the line of Clearfield County to the northwesterly corner of Centre County, on the heads of Moshannon Creek; thence southerly along the Allegheny mountain to Somerset and Bedford Counties; thence along the lines of Somerset and Bedford Counties about seventeen miles until a due West course thence will strike the main branch of Paint Creek; thence down said Creek, the different courses thereof it empties into Stoney Creek; thence down Stoney Creek the different courses to the mouth of Mill Creek; thence a due West line till it intersects the lines of Somerset and Westmoreland counties; thence northerly along the line to the place of beginning; be and the same is hereby erected into a separate county, to be foreverth called Cambria County." It is bounded by Clearfield on the North, Blair and Bedford on the East, Somerset on the South and Westmoreland and Indiana on the West. It was originally divided into three townships, Allegheny, Cambria and Conemaugh. The existing present townships were formed out of the three:

2. There are a total of 30 Townships in Cambria County. "Cambria" is derived from the name word for Wales, Cymri or Gymra.

In 1788 Michael McGuire built a cabin on Clearfield River.

In 1793 Joseph Johns settled at mouth of Clearfield river.

In 1795 settlement of Beula founded along the Clearfield River.

In 1796 a Welsh colony settled where Eben stands.

In 1805 Ebensburg chosen as the County seat by special Act passed March 29, 1805.

In 1807, Jan. 26 Cambria County by Act of Assembly was given complete status.

In 1808 John Young was First President Judge of Cambria County.
