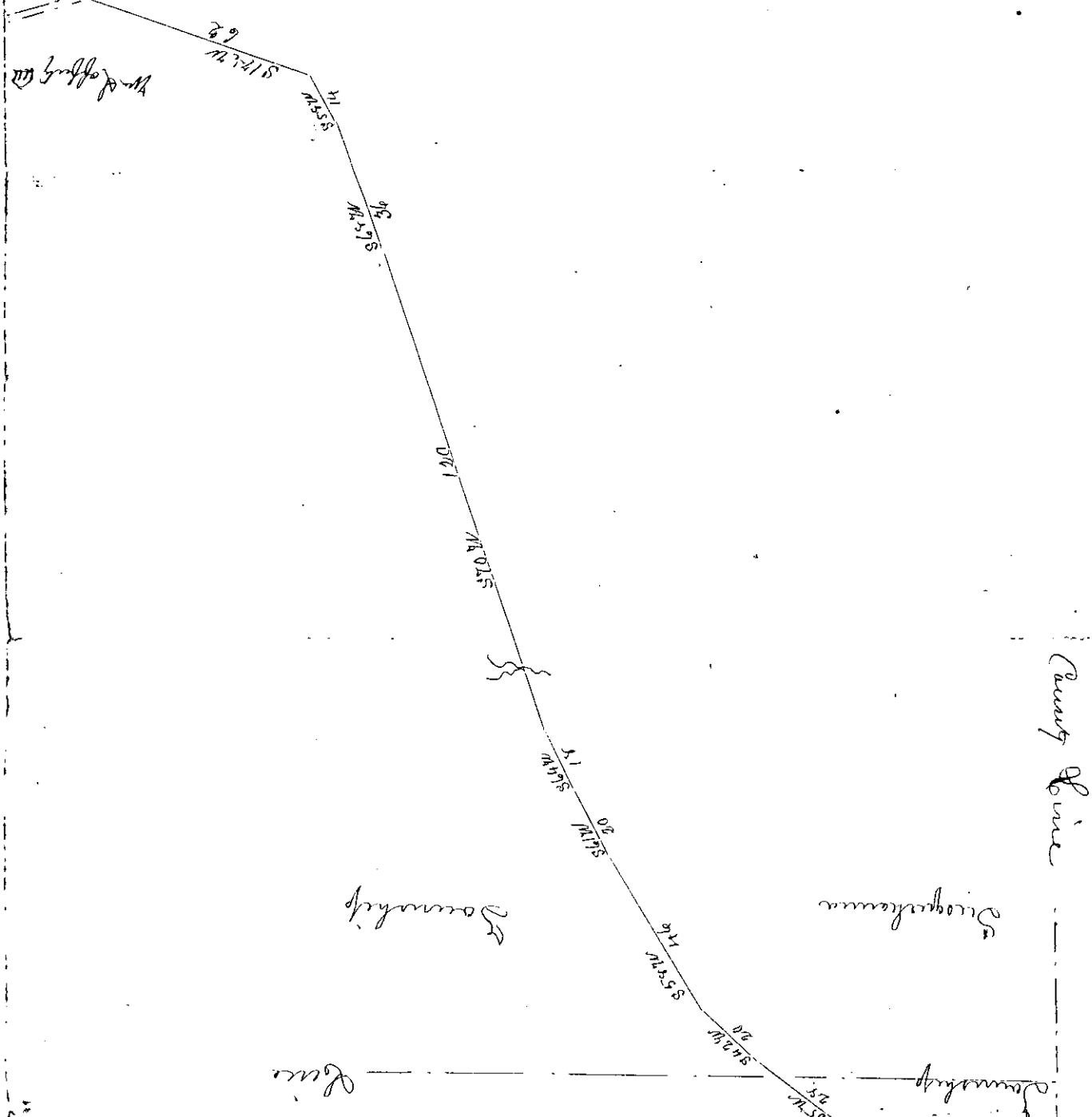

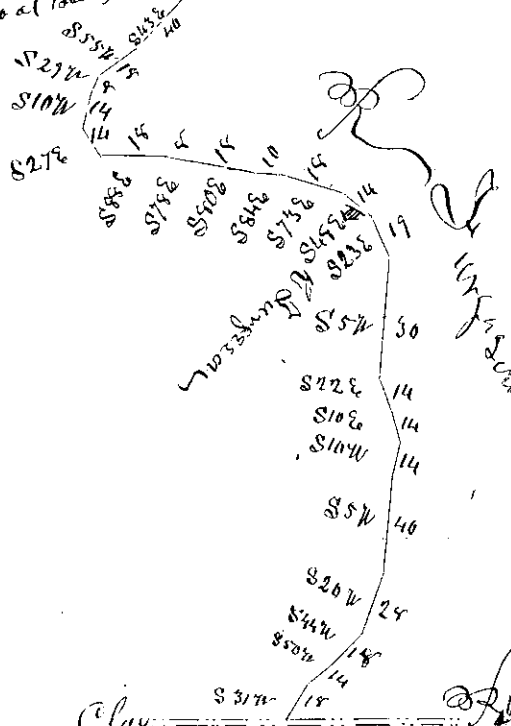

proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises

duly sworn or affirmed according to law to perform the duties of
this appointment with fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for
said road; and if they or any five of them view the same, and

grade for road and the shortest distance, and in such
