of Petitioners of said Allegheny Township.
Praying the Court to appoint proper

or to vacate and supply a part of the
Public road leading from Chest Springs
to Gallitzin Commencing at a Point
near where a Steam saw mill formerly
was on said road to intersect at a
point on said road near Francis
Morans. which view was accordingly
done by viewers or by part of viewers
so appointed by this Court and said
part of road supplied not yet being
Granted by your honors nor is it yet
opened to travel and it appearing to your
petitioners to be useless and if opened
would become burdensome and expen-
sive to the Township running the whole
length as viewed and laid out through
a swamp and therefore would have to

be bridged very near the whole length
of road so supplied besides cutting off
a very narrow strip of land for about
perches of the Estate of James Doyle
Deen doing a great damage to said estate
if the road is so made. And your peti-
tioners further believing the old road
as now used to be a better route and
as now made to be kept in repair at
a less cost to the Township than the new
route as surveyed and laid out could
be opened and made passable and the
grade will be no less. Your petitioners
therefore pray your Honorable body not
to grant said road as vacated and
supplied by said viewers and they will
ever pray &c &c

ground. If one fourth the money, necessary to make the New road
passable for wagons and vehicles, were expended on repairing the
old road, it would make the old much better than the new one.

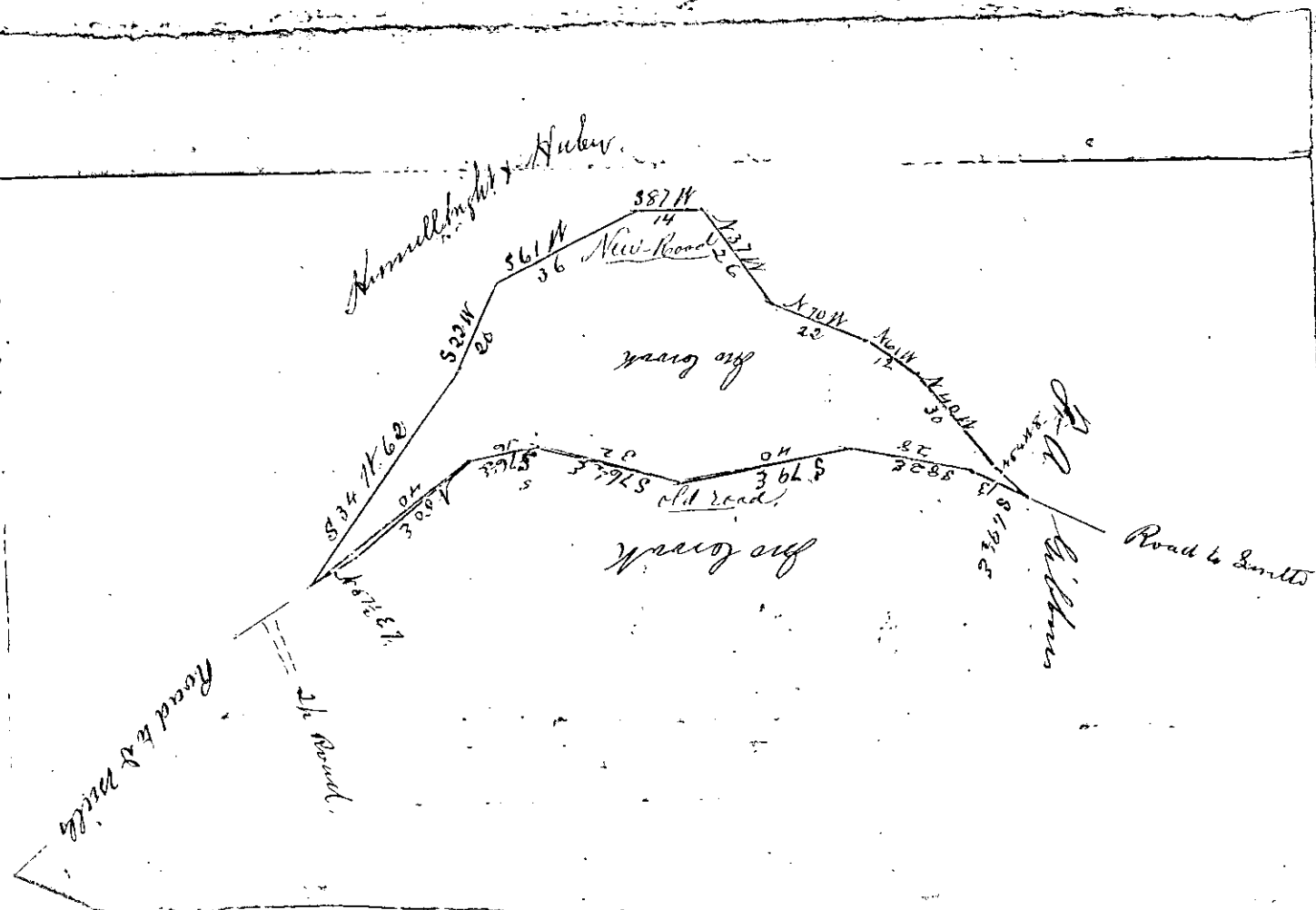

It is true the grade on the old road, is somewhat steeper than on the new, but in our opinion that difficulty would be more than counter-balanced by the good solid ground on which the old or shorter road is laid, compared with the swampy ground through which the new one passes. After consideration of all the circumstances, We are thoroughly convinced that the new or longer road (should) and ought to be vacated, and the old one used instead; a draft of both roads is hereto annexed, and submitted.

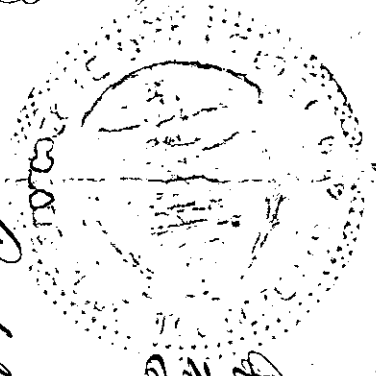
