That "An Act to change the manner of assessing dama-  
ges sustained by the owners of lands in the opening of public  
roads in the counties of Washington, Mercer and Fayette", ap-  
proved the 6th day of April, 1843, was extended to the Coun-  
ty of Cambria, by an Act approved the 12th day of March  
A. D. 1873, which provides that "If the viewers aforesaid shall  
"decide in favor of locating a public road or highway, it is  
"hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose  
"lands the road may pass, releases for any damages that may  
"arise to them in opening the same; and in every case where the  
"owners of such lands refuse releasing their claim to damages,  
"the said viewers shall assess the damages and make a re-  
"port thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and  
"transmit the same together with all releases to the next court  
"of quarter sessions, to be filed in said office with the papers  
"relating to said road."

That said road was laid out since the passage of  
the said Act, and the viewers thereof failed to take any re-  
leases, and did not assess any damages, as required by



said Act. The petitioners therefore pray the Court to take off the absolute confirmation of said view, and refer the same back to the same viewers with instructions to obtain such releases, or failing in that, to assess the damages occasioned by the laying out of said road, and to report the same to this Court as required by said Act. And they will ever pray, &c.
