At the Court of General Quarterly Session of the Peace.

Held at Eldon by the Commissioner City on the tenth day
of October A.D. 1843. Before the Honourable Judge of
the said Court.

The Petition of our inhabitants of the townships of Franklin, Sugdenham and Chest in
said City Mary, for aato Reporte That a road leading from the said
out from Eldon Mills in Chest township has sunk on the Elmsley and Sugdenham,
Road and part of Whis road. Beginning where it mad from E.R. Waller to st Joseph
Church. Making a new or New Mill of Brookhead to Bacons in any one of
these hills has become unsafe in concert and burden to the inhabitants of said
townships. And therefore praye the Court to appoint suitable persons to view and
propose the sum Aequally bill of Assembly in such case made and
provided. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises doth order
and appoint Messrs Seaman, S. J. Luther, Augustus Grand, Luther Ratt.
Archibald Kirkpatrick and Joseph Grey who having been first duly sworn
afford to display the dates of their appearance with fidelity as to how
the road improved to be vacated. And if they or any two of them view the same
and agree of the actual views agreed that the same be become unsafe
in concert and burden on the shall provide supply the same asembly
to the uses of the Public as may be here except to the best uses for roads
and the publick doles and in such manner as to do the least injury to
private property. And the said views are to be on R. Report of these proceedings
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions accompanying the Report with a
Pet or Draft being a like the last Vacated to be supplied.
