At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County on the 8th day of July A.D. 1891. before the Honorable Judges of the same Court. Upon the Petition of Citizens of Alleghany Township setting forth, That a Road was formerly laid out by order of the Court from Chest Springs to Gallatin Township in said County which road is laid out and open for use, now your petitioners pray the Court to appoint Viewers to vacate and supply part of said road beginning at a point on said road where there formerly was a saw Mill erected and known as the Westmoreland Company Mill thence to vacate and supply said road to a point at the forks of the road at Mount Morans for the reason that, that part of said Road now open is too Expensive to keep in repair and that your petitioners believe they can get a better Route with less Bridges and at better grade and that there is another public Road running near parallel with the same about one half the distance which is to be supplied which we believe will be used hence the two roads that distance is Expensive, Your petitioners therefore pray the Court that the same road, may be vacated and supplied. Whereupon the Court appointed Henry Scanlon Esq., John M. Coy, John Kellie, Jacob J. Stagle, Hugh Gallaher, James Peary, who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity and to view the said road so laid out and to consider and Judge whether in their opinion the said road, should be vacated and supplied or such parts thereof as they may consider useful, and hereunto is And

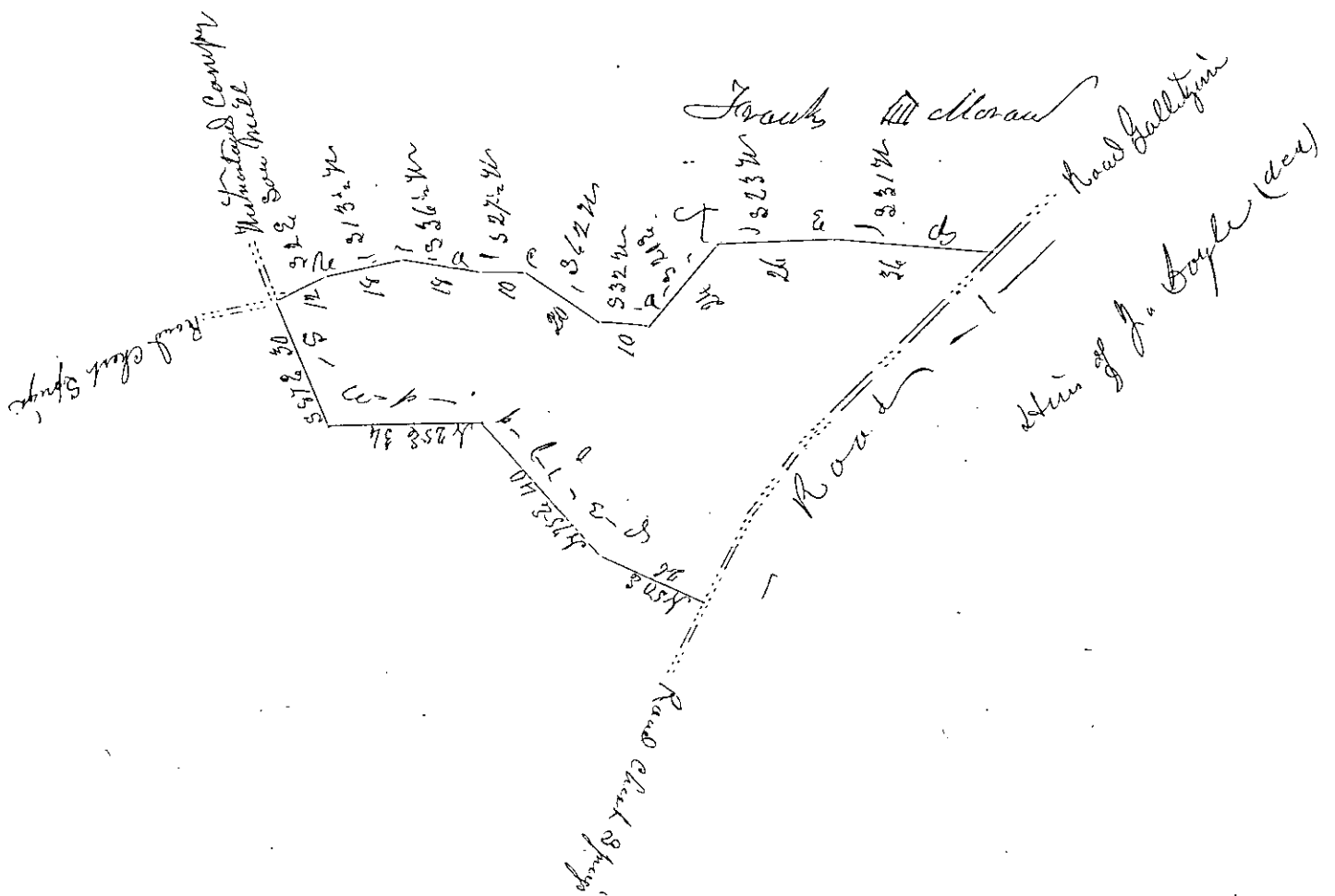

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Elmhurst on the 30th March 1871 before the Honorable Judges of the same Court. The petition of Sanbury Citizens of Saltzman Township of said County being presented, representing that the Court grant the privilege of the Old road that runs from Ashland Furnace to the Duck Horn Iron and not to substitute in its place a New Road, which the Court had previously granted and not yet opened, by opening said New Road: would entail a heavy tax on the citizens of said Township and would remain useless to any of them, praying the Court that the said road may be vacated and supplied according to the act of Assembly in such case made and provided. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint, Henry Scandalopp, Hugh L. Gallahue, Daniel Burke, William Dawson Long, Callahan & Samuel Sanker, Who being first duly sworn & affirmed according to law to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity: and to view that part of said road proposed to be vacated and supplied, and if they or any five of them view the same and any four of the actual viewers agree that said road or parts thereof is become useless inconvenient and burdensome they shall report accordingly to the next Court of Quarter Sessions and shall accompany their report with a plot or draft of their proceedings having with the same and distances: and reference to the improvements through which the same passes of that part vacated and supplied, in which report they shall state that they had been sworn

and affirmed according to law

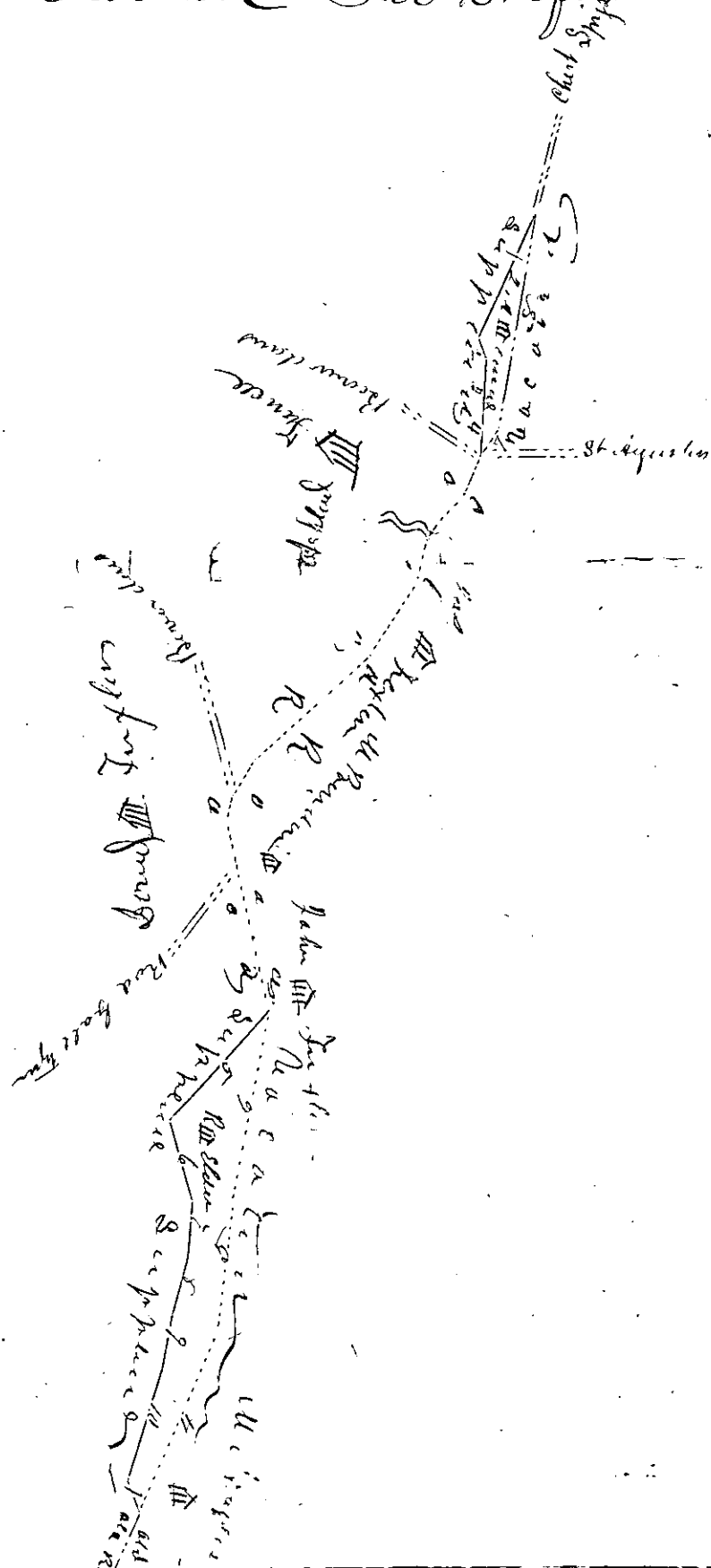

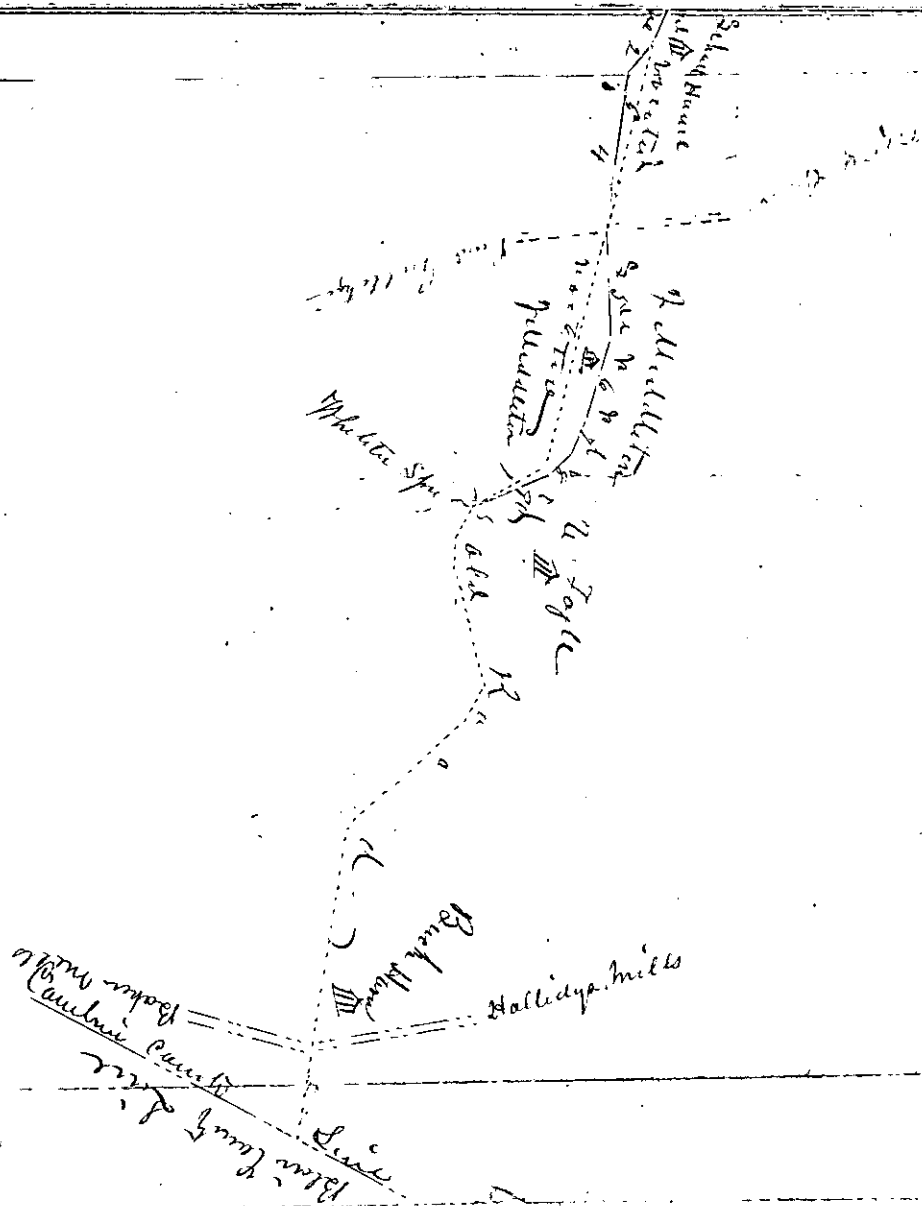

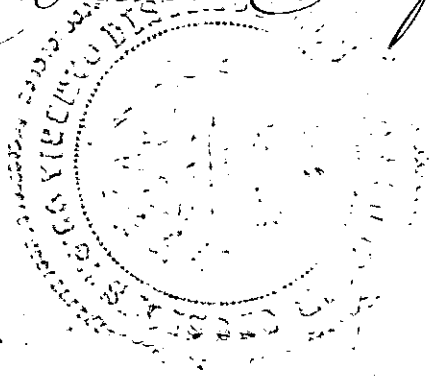

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the District Court of Cambria County at Johnstown in and for said District on the 2d day of January, A.D. 1871 upon the petition of H.P. Friedhoff, Burgess of Conemaugh borough of said County representing that the

Council of the said Borough of Conemaugh had passed the following Ordinance opening an Alley on the North bank of the Conemaugh river, to be called "Conemaugh Alley" which Ordinance is as follows: "Whereas there has been considerable damage done to the properties on River street and Portage street, in the Borough of Conemaugh caused by the overflow of water and ice from the Conemaugh river; and, Whereas, the Cambria Iron Company have commenced to make an embankment on the edge of the said river, so as to effectually stop the overflow of water and ice; therefore, —

Be It Ordained and Enacted by the Burgess and Ward Council of the Borough of Conemaugh, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, that there be an alley laid out twenty (20) feet wide and declared a "public alley" on the North bank of the Conemaugh river, beginning on the borough line of Johnstown and Conemaugh boroughs, thence along said river North eighty four and three fourth degrees East two hundred feet to the East side of Hurty alley — being one hundred and fifty feet from the corner next the river of the street known as River street; thence North eighty two and a half degrees East four hundred and fifty six feet to a post; thence North seventy eight and a half degrees East one hundred and sixty feet to a post at the East side of Center street, being forty six feet from the corner southwest from the river of said street; thence North seventy six degrees East eighty one feet to a post; thence North sixty four and a half degrees East hundred and eight feet to a post; thence North fifty six degrees East two hundred and twenty feet to a post; thence North sixty nine degrees East one hundred and twenty feet to a post on the old dam of said river; thence North seventy nine and one half degrees East nine hundred feet to Railroad street; at its Township ledge and twenty feet south of the wing wall of said ledge; said Alley to be located on the South side of the aforesaid line next the Conemaugh

river to be called "Conemagh Alley," and that the same be and is hereby declared a public Alley and all ordinances and parts of Ordinances relating to Alleys be and the same are hereby extended to said "Conemagh Alley."

Your petitioners further represent that the Council of said Borough by resolution adopted instructed him to take the proper legal steps to have damages and contributions assessed and the said "Alley" opened. Your petitioners therefore pray you Honor to appoint seven disinterested freeholders to assess damages and contributions in consequence of the opening of said "Alley" as provided by the supplement of the General Preamble last approved the 22d day of April 1886. Said names to make report as required by law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint John Devlin Patrick Sheehan John Wolfelt Andrew Allen Charles Helmes ^{August Dwyer} and William Jones who after having first been duly sworn or affirmed according to law to perform their duties under the Act of Assembly of 22d April 1886 to with impartiality and fidelity shall proceed to visit the premises described in said petition having due regard to both the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said "Alley" and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages; and shall also make an assessment for contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefited by the opening of said "Alley" such sums respectively as they may have been benefited ^{over} and above all disadvantages and make report of the proceedings or writing describing the properties in which assessments have been made, specifically stating for contribution or for damage with the amounts respectively as provided for in the Act of Assembly of 22d of April 1886 to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the District Court of Cambridge County in which report they shall state that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law

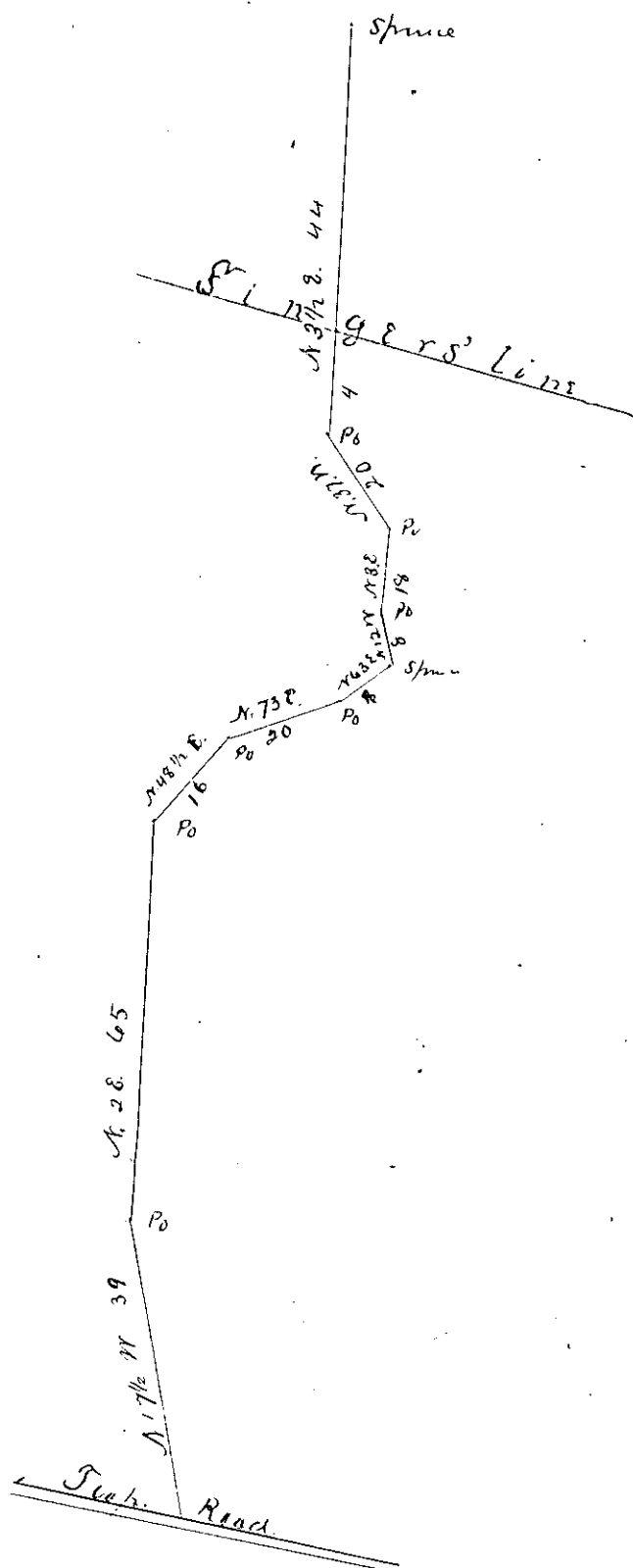

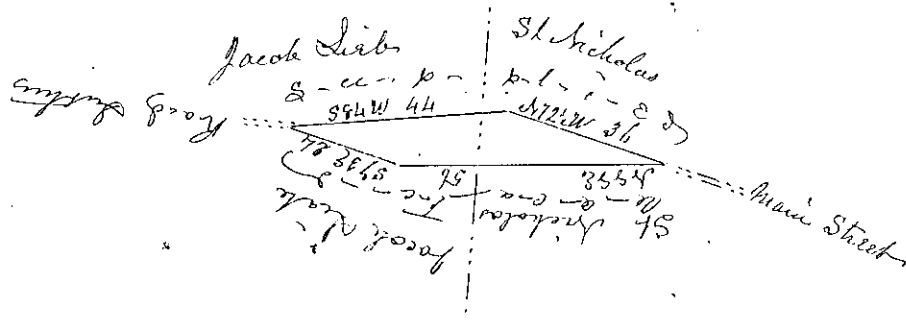

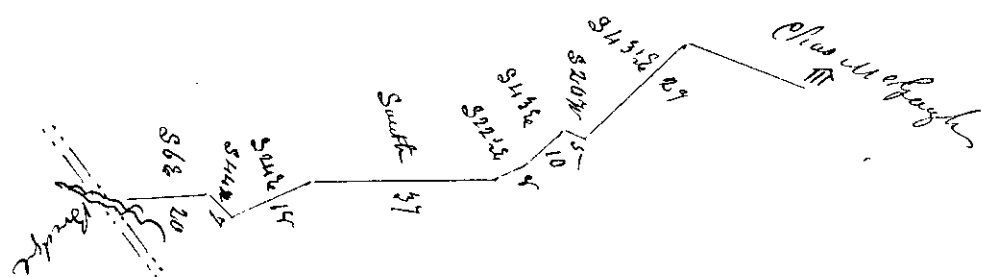
