

To The Honorable the Judges of The courts of
Quarter Sessions in and for the county of Cambria;

We, the undersigned, persons appointed
by the within order of Court, to view and lay out
the road therein mentioned, respectfully report:
That, notice having been given by the persons
interested in the road, in accordance with
the acts of Assembly in such case made and
provided of the time and place of meeting
of the viewers, we met at the sawmill of
Empfied and Bro. near the residence of Benj. James
in Cambria Township, on Friday the first day of
March A.D. 1877, and that, after having all been affirmed,
in pursuance of the said order we ~~have~~ viewed and
laid out and do return for public use the follow-
ing road, to wit: Beginning at a point on The Pittsburg
Stone pile near the Empfield steam saw-mill and
near corner of W. Stevens field, thence through land
of B. and J. James, North thirty nine degrees West
twenty and one half perches to a beech, thence North
seventy eight degrees West twenty four perches
to a beech, thence North seventy one degrees
West seventeen perches to a small beech,
thence North sixty degrees West twenty four perches
to a hemlock, North seventy five degrees West
twelve perches to a beech, thence North sixty eight
degrees West thirty three perches to a beech, and
line of Lewis James, thence through land of Lewis
James North eighty five degrees West thirty one perches.

to a small hemlock (blazed), Thence North
forty four degrees West seven perches to
a hemlock, Thence North sixty degrees West
twelve perches to a pine, Thence North forty
eight degrees West nine perches to a
walnut, Thence North forty one degrees West
fifteen perches to a white oak, Thence North

To a point on the road leading from Bethel
to the Pittsburg Stone Mills near the old
mill seat of Thomas E. Thomas, a plan or
draft of which said road is laid out
as aforesaid is hereto annexed.

The aforesaid viewers further report
that they have obtained from the persons
through whose lands the said road passes
releases from any damages that may
arise to them in opening the same, and the
said releases they have hereto annexed.

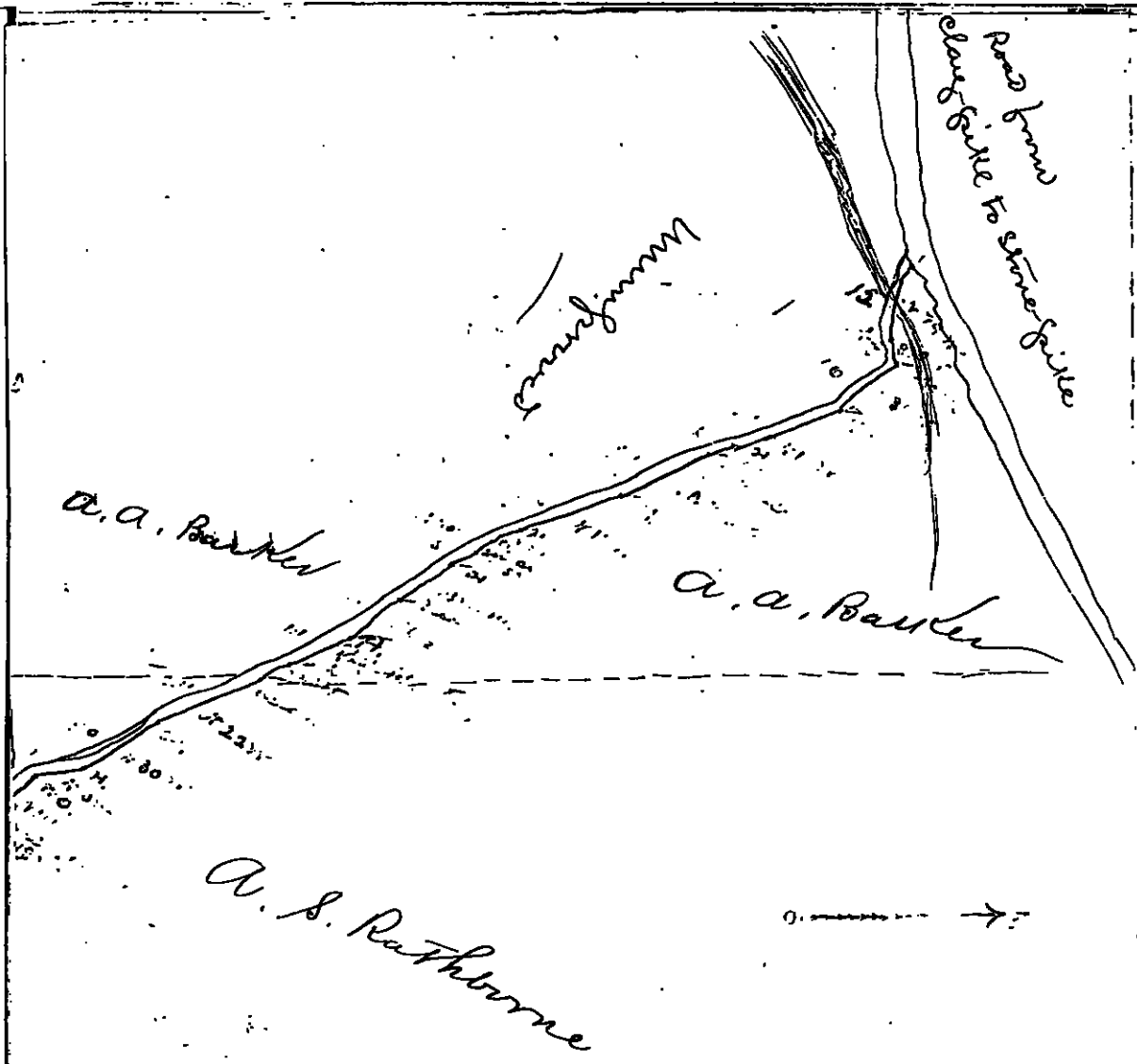

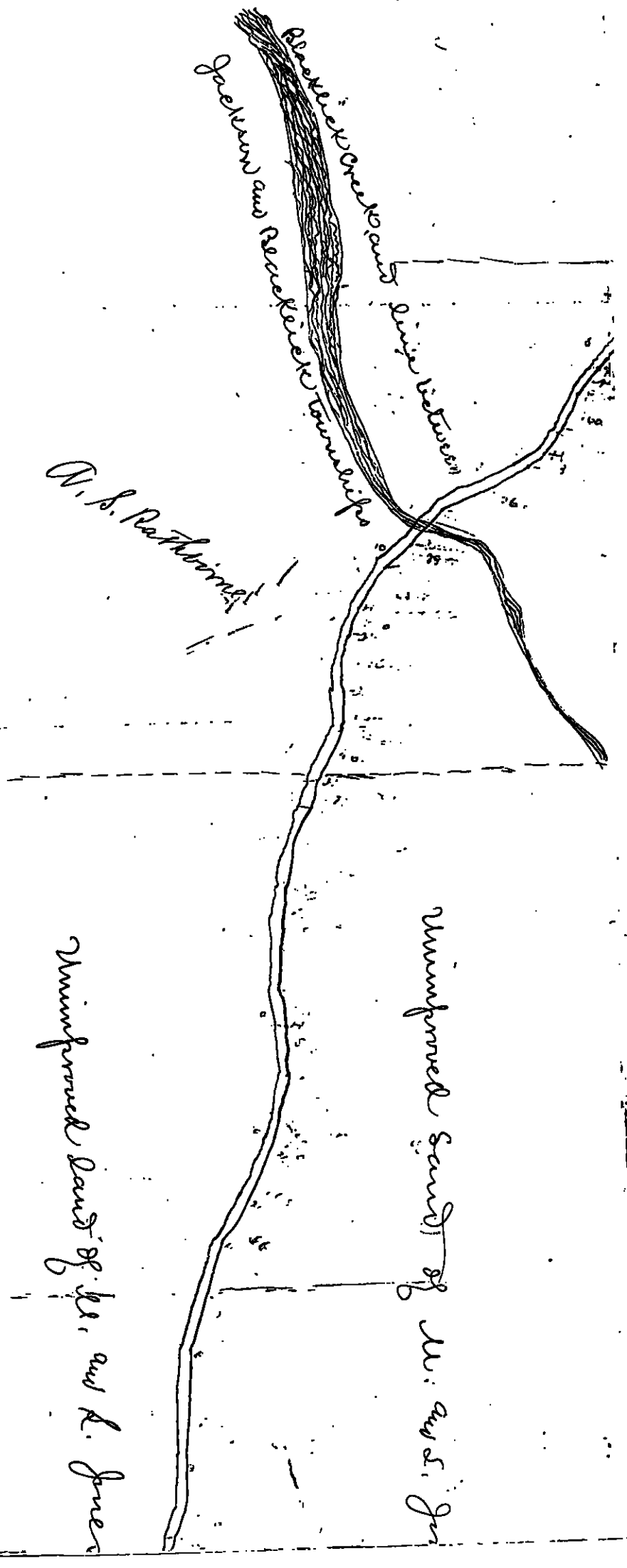

Cambridge County N.Y.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Elmsbury in and
for said County on the 6th day of December
A.D. 1876 before the Honorable the Judge &
the same Court.

The Petition of Citizens of said County was presented setting
forth that they labor under great inconvenience for
want of a Public Road: Beginning at a point on the
Pittsford Stone Pike, at or near the Empire Steam
Saw Mill in Cambridge townships, and to connect with
a Public Road leading from Rochester to said Pittsford
Stone Pike at or near the old mill seat of Thomas E. Thomas
in Blacklick township in said County of Cambridge: and
praying the Court to appoint suitable persons to view
and lay out said Road.

The Court, upon due consideration of the premises
do order and appoint A. V. Barker Esq. John Ingram
and Andrew Dunmyre to view the ground proposed for
said Road, who after having first been duly sworn
or affirmed to discharge the duties of their appointment
faithfully, shall proceed to view the same, and if
all the said Views appointed view the same,
and a majority of the said Views agree that
there is occasion for such Road they shall proceed
to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of the
Petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a
Road and the shortest distance. And in such manner

as to do the least injury to private property.

The person intended in said road having previously given public notice by letters of printed advertisements of the time and place when the said views shall meet for the purpose of locating said road at least ten days before such meeting.

If the views aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said road it is hereby made the duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands the road may pass release from any damages that may arise to them in opening the same: and in any case where the owner of such lands refuses to release the claims to damages the said views shall assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of the views present, and transmit the same together with all claims to the next Court of Quarte Sessions to be held in said Office with the papers relating to said road.

And the said views shall make report of the proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarte Sessions to be held for said County accompanying the same with a Petition or Draft of said road with reference to the improvements through which it passes, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed, and also which they judge the same necessary for a Public or Private road.
