

Lambia Land Co.

At a Court of General Quarters session of the
Peace held at Eberby for Lambie Co.
on the 12th May 1846. Before the Hon. Mr. the Judge
of the said Court.

The Petition of Jacob Stagle of Lambie Co. was
presented & read. That when appointed by the Court deputed
to the last term thereof that the said land was made and valued for
Purposes of the following Road to wit; Beginning at the dwelling
house of Mr. Stagle in Great Township and running East sixty
degrees South fifty eight rods to a white Oak stump thence East
fifty two degrees South eleven rods to a white Oak stump at the side of
the road leading from Stagle School House to David Ryman in
Lambie Township, the said Road will be of great damage
to your Petitioner, and that the Petitioner believes that a Road made
can be laid out between the said points without doing so much
damage to him. And the Petitioner prays the Court that
the party interested pray the Court to appoint three persons duly
qualified to view the ground proposed for said Road and to
make report of the proceedings at the next Term of the Court.

The Court upon due consideration thereof and
appoint Elias Adams, John Shulman and Henry Scalant
to view the said roads; who, after having been sworn duly
sworn to do duty the duties of their office with
fidelity. The party interested is said. Re-view says that your
legal and due notice of the time and place of the meeting of
the Court for the purpose of making said review, to the person
responsible, that where said the same may pass.

And make Report of the proceedings hereon

to the next Court of General Quarter Session of the Peace to be held
for said County. Accompanying the Report will be a Plan of
the length of said Road and the Survey and alterations and
References to the Improvements thereto which it can be seen
and shown to do and perform all things enjoined to them
by the Act of Assembly of this Commonwealth.

We the undersigned Jurors
appointed by the within order hereto annexed
who being all present on the ground pro-
posed and all being duly sworn according to
Law, have viewed, the owners of land adjoining
said road have due and timely notice, Beginning
at a Post in public road leading from Hagles
School House to David Ryan in Clearfield Sup
Cambria County. thence ^{through land of Jacob Hagle} North thirty eight degrees
West nineteen perches to Pine Stump, which same
we vacate it being to great a damage to
private property it being burdensome and
injurious to private property and supply
the same viz beginning at said Pine Stump
thence through land of Jacob Hagle South
twenty six and one half degrees East, sixteen perches
to a Post, thence South twenty four degrees
West, four perches to Post, in public road leading
from Hagles School House to John Ryan, in Clear-
field Sup Cambria Co. Pa. And which road as
supplied we are of the opinion is necessary for
a Private Road. And further we proceeded
to assess the damages. and respectfully report
damages due Jacob Hagle in the sum of
Thirty dollars. and that the said Hugh

Lynch shall erect and maintain the fence
along the North side of said road. A Draft
of said road as viewed, vacated, and sup-
plied is hereto attached

In the Quarter Sessions of Cambridge
County

Exceptions to the re-view of the private road
leading from the House of Hugh Lynch, to the
public road from Haglet School House to David
Ryan in Clearfield Township.

1st The re-view; or report of the viewers upon
the order to re-view, undertakes to vacate and
supply, whereas the order is merely to re-view;
and does not authorize the vacating and supplying
a part, merely of the original road.

2nd That the point of terminus of said re-view
is uncertain, and insufficient. The said re-viewers
setting forth the road to be re-viewed, as beginning
at a point in the public road leading from Haglet
School House to David Ryan; but the road as laid
out and reported for use by the re-viewers, is stated
as ending in a public road leading from Haglet
School House to John Ryan in Clearfield Township;
thereby rendering it uncertain as to the point of
the termination of said road as supplied, from
the record.

3rd That the expense of opening the said road as
reviewed, is unnecessarily and greatly increased, to the

to the amount of \$20.⁰⁰ or more: in consequence
of being laid out over a steep hill or bank, so
steep that a buggy cannot be driven over the same
without being empty: and that the view entirely
avoids this difficulty, and no greater damages are
allowed or assessed to Jacob Hagler by the re-view
than are allowed by the viewers of the original
road.

In the Quarter Session of Cambridge County,

In the matter of the view of the private road of Hugh Lynch in
Clearfield Township in said County, leading from the House of said
Hugh Lynch to the public road near Nagle School House: and in
the matter of the re-view of the same.

Now 5 February 1877, we agree to compromise and settle all
matters in controversy in the above view and re-view upon the following
terms to wit: the view of said road to be confirmed, and the said
re-view withdrawn, and that said road shall be opened only twenty
feet wide; the said Hugh Lynch to fence and keep in repair said fence on
the east side of said road: to pay said Jacob Nagle through whose land said
road passes thirty Dollars in full compensation for all damages in opening
said road: said Nagle to have the right to use the same, but if the
same is injured by said Nagle by heavy hauling said Nagle to repair the same.
