of said road

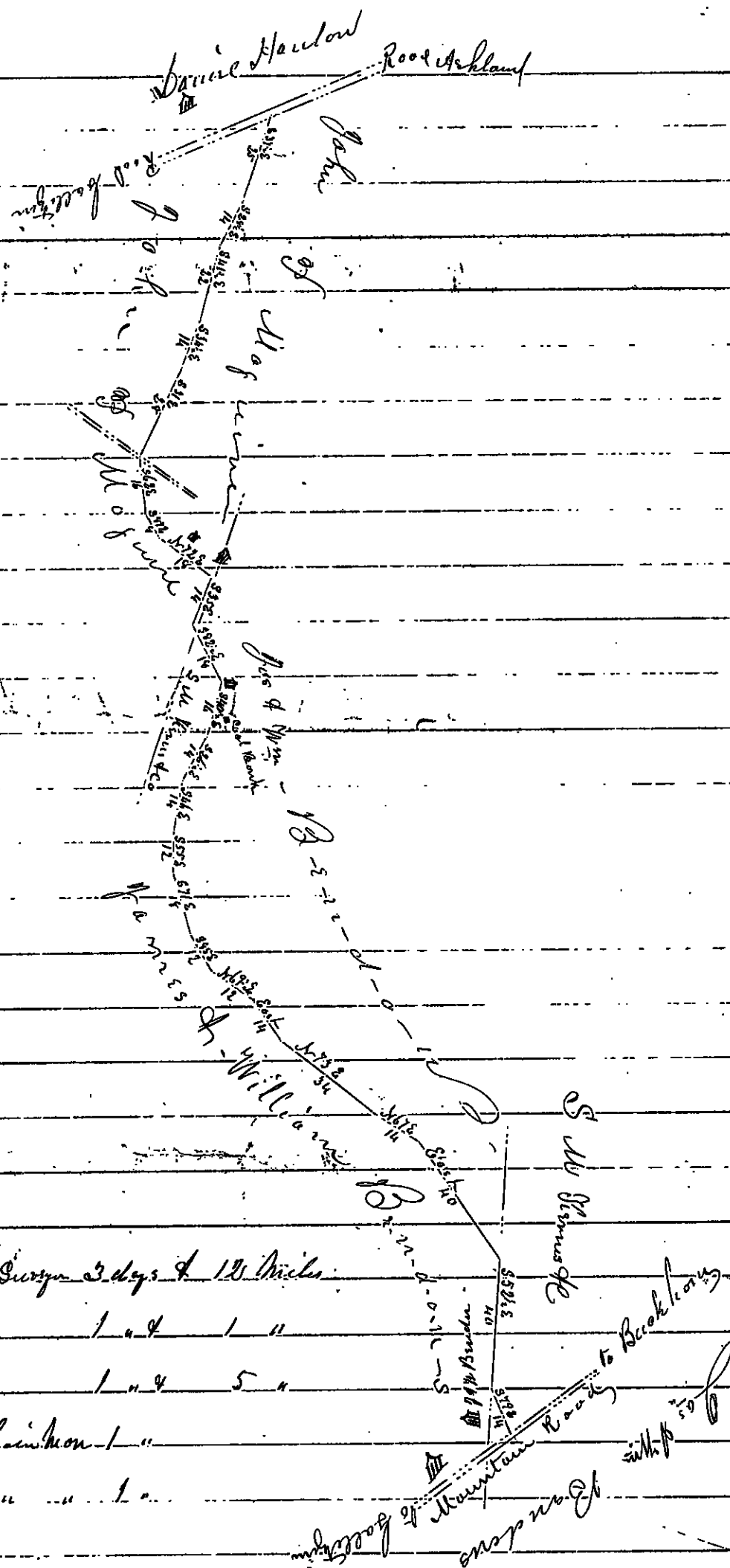

Judge and R. P. Lloyd & John Kilgus Esquires
his Associate Judges now Composing a Court of
Quorum, before and for the peace and for the County
of Cambridge at June Term A.D. 1876

We the undersigned this
was do report that having met at the time and place
agreeably to public notice given owners of Estate land over
which road passes and after first being all duly sworn
according to law we proceeded to the duties of our off-
appointment and did begin mark and lay out the following
for a Public Road or highway viz Beginning at a po-
int on Township Road leading from Arkland to Gallop
line
on land of Daniel Haulon and John Kilgus thence
through land of J. P. Kilgus South thirty seven and one half
degrees East twenty five perches Post thence South twenty eight
and one half degrees East fourteen perches Post thence South
forty one and one half degrees East twenty two perches Post
thence South thirty four and one half degrees East fourteen per-
ches Post thence South thirty one degrees East twenty eight
perches Post thence South sixty two degrees East sixteen perches
Post thence South eighty seven degrees East eight perches
Post thence North seventy two degrees East eighteen perches
thence South thirty five degrees East fourteen perches Post
thence South eighty two and one half degrees East eighteen
perches thence South forty and one half degrees East sixteen
perches Post thence South twenty six and one half degrees
East fourteen perches Post thence South forty six degrees

East fourteen perches East thence South fifty five degrees
East twelve perches East thence South Seventy one degrees
East Eighteen perches East thence South Eighty five degrees
East twelve perches East thence North Sixty nine and one half degrees

ther assump. no damages to owners of unimproved land
over which said road passes and further we do report
that in our opinion said road is necessary to accommodate
public travel and convenience thereof all of which

At a Court of General Quarter
Sessions of the Peace in and for
Cambria County, held at Ebensburg
on the sixth day of April 1876.

The Petition of James Pendron
of Gallitzin township, for a private Road in Gallitzin
township, Was presented, setting forth that he
labors under inconvenience for want of a Road from
the Ashland Road at a point near Daniel Hauland
in Gallitzin township, to a point in the Mountain
Road at or near William and James Pendron's
residence, and praying the Court to appoint three
persons qualified according to law, to view
the place where the said Road is requested
and make report to the said Court at the
next Term thereof &c

The Court upon due consideration had of the
Premises, do order and appoint Henry Scanlan
George Myers, and F. J. Parrish to view the
ground proposed for said road, who after
having first been duly sworn or affirmed to dis-
charge the duties of their appointment with fidelity
shall proceed to view the same, and if all the
said Viewers appointed, view the same, and a
majority of the said Viewers agree, that there is
occasion for such road, they shall proceed to
lay out the same, as agreeably to the Wishes of

the Petitioner as may be having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property. The persons interested in the said Road having previously given public notice by Written or printed advertisements of the time and place Where the said Viewers shall meet for the purpose of locating said Road at least Ten days before such meeting.

If the Viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said road it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands the road may pass releases from any damages that may arise to them in Opening the same and in every Case Where the Owners of such lands refuse releasing their Claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the damages and make Report thereof signed by a Majority of the Viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed in said office with the papers relating to said Road,

And the said Viewers shall make report of their Proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said Road with reference to the improvements through which it passes, in which report, they shall state that

they have been Sworn or Affirmed, and also
Whether they Judge said road necessary
for a public or private road.
