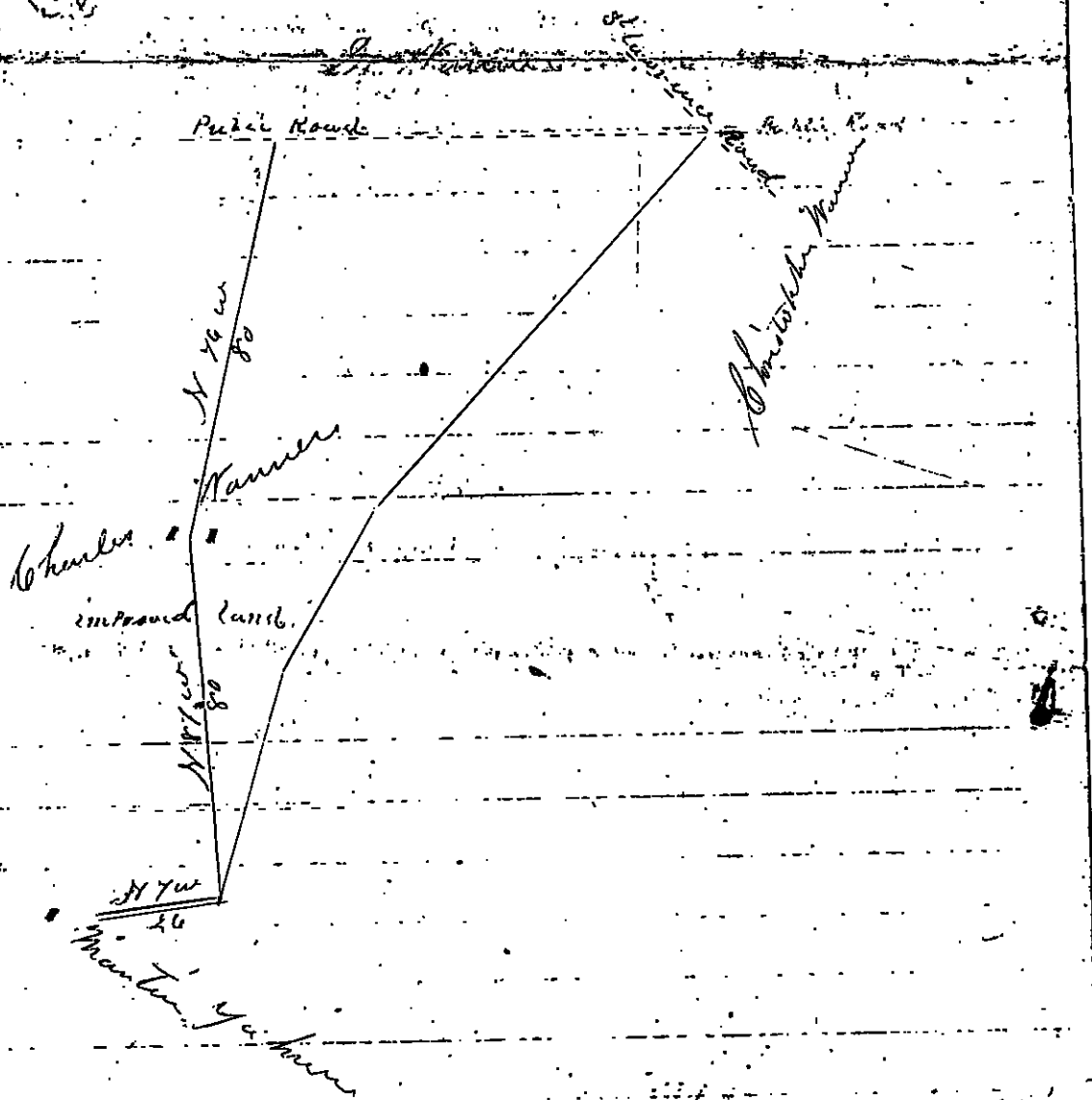


To the Honorable the judges within named

The location of the present view being changed from that of the first as shown by the annexed Draft.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions

for the County of Camden on the 14 day  
of June A. D. 1876. Before the Honorable  
John Steen, President Magistrate and Peers John Sledge and  
John Blanagan, Assistant Judges.

The Petition of Charles Warren and Christopher Warren  
was presented to the Court. Representing that Messrs  
appointed by this Court Reports to Charles Warren 1876  
that they had laid out and opened for Private use  
the following road viz; from line of A. Warren to a  
point near the residence of William Galton in  
Schock Township. and that the same is needed  
for private use. The Petitioners, shew that they are  
intended pray the Court to appoint three disinterested  
persons qualified as aforesaid to Renew the grant  
granted for said road and make report of their  
proceedings at the next Term of this Court.

The Court upon due consideration of the  
premises do order and appoint Jacob Kirk  
Patrick Joseph Surpe and Robert S. Gingen  
to Renew the grant where said private road  
has been located. And they, having been  
sustained sworn or affirmed to perform  
the duties of their appointments with fidelity are  
to go upon the ground proposed for said road

And if they all shall view the same and they or a majority of them agree that the Edition of the said map shall be changed they shall proceed to do so and make a Draft of part of their work with the Causes and distances and referen to the Improvements thereof which the same may pass and shewen do and perform such acts as are enjoyned upon them by the Acts of Assembly of the Government.

And make Reports of their proceedings therein to the next Court of Quarter Session to be held for and County of Cambridge
