

Cambria County Ss.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, in and for said County, held at Ebensburg on the 5th day of April 1876. before Hon. John Dean President Judge and Rice John Lloyd and John Flanagan associate Judges

The Petition of Divers inhabitants of Blacklick Township in said County Was presented setting forth, that a public Road has long since been laid out leading from Ebensburg and Indiana Turnpike Roads near the house of Henry Campbell to the Vicinity of Eliza Furnace at the Forks of Blacklick. that said road in its present location has become inconvenient and burdensome and would better accommodate the public travel by vacating that portion of it, lying between a point on the farm of Robert Gillen, and the old Salt Well near Eliza Furnace &c. and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the the same according to law &c.

The Court upon due Consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Henry Sculaw, John Ferguson and John Samoreaux to view the grounds

proposed for said road. Who after having first been duly sworn or affirmed to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity. shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said Viewers appointed view the same, and a majority of the said Viewers, agree, that there is occasion for such Road and for such change of location, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of the Petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a Road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property thus to locate and supply. The persons interested in said road, having previously given public notice by written & printed advertisements of the time and place where the said Viewers shall meet for the purpose of locating said road at least ten days before such meeting.

If the Viewers aforesaid, shall decide to locate and supply that part of said road it is made their duty to obtain from the persons, through whose land the Road may pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them in opening the same, and in every case where the Owners of said lands refuse releasing their claim to damages

the said Viewers shall assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of the Viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed in said Office, with the papers relating to said Road

and the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road with reference to the improvements through which it passes, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed.

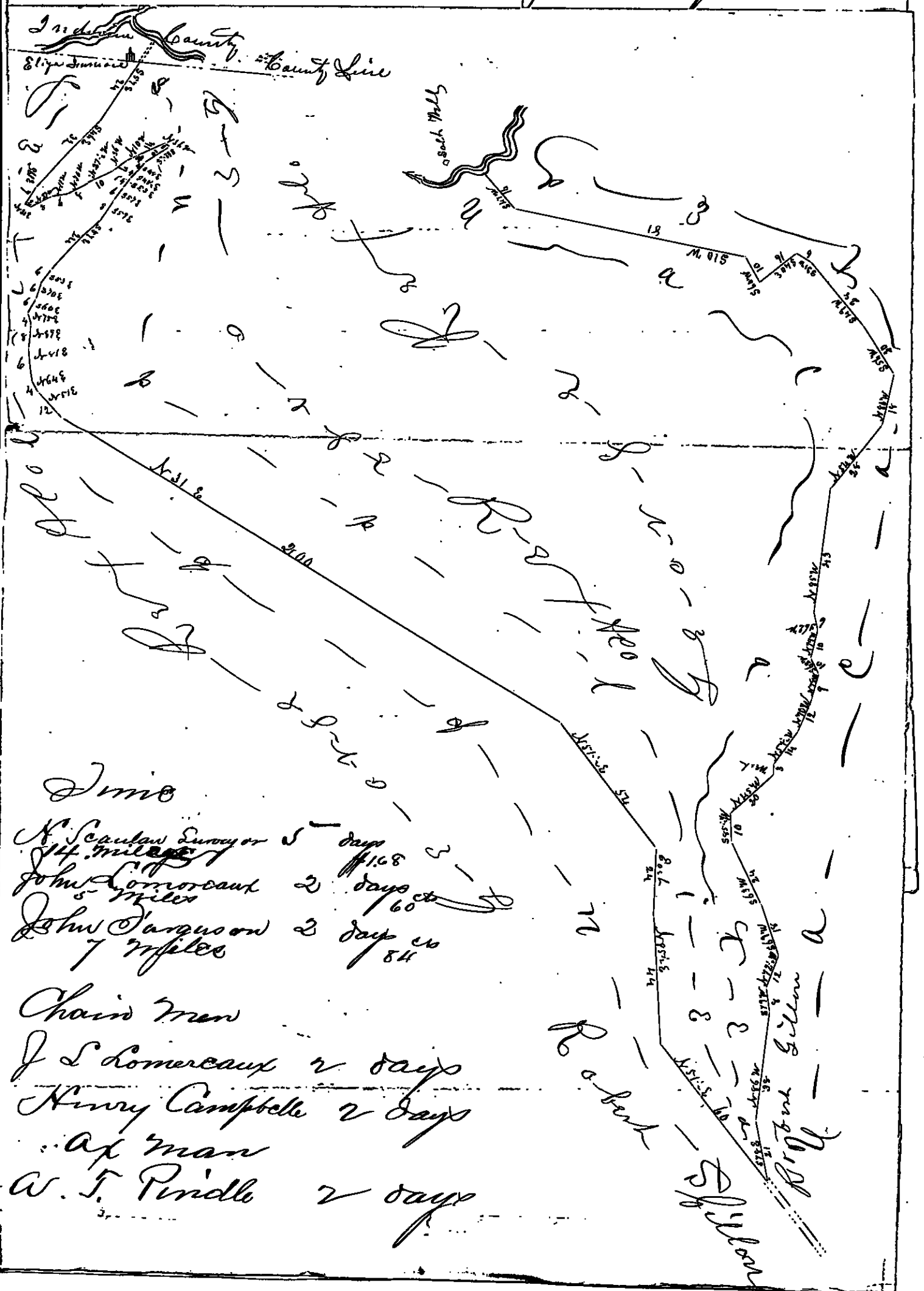
We the undersigned
Viewers appointed within annexed order being
all present on the road proposed to be
vacated and supplied all being first several
sworn according to Law and owners of land
having due and timely notice, their relations
of parties owning improved land adjoining
and where said road passes through are hereto
attach, After having carefully viewed the
Premises we do vacate the following public
road Beginning near farm of Robert Gellow
in Blacklick Twp, said County of Cambria,
thence through lands of Robert Gellow unim-
proved South seventy eight East, twenty one
perches, North Eighty six West thirty eight
perches, South seventy nine West eight perches
North seventy two and one half West twelve
perches, South sixty nine West, eighteen perches
South sixty three West, twenty four perches,
South eighty two and half degrees West, ten perches,
North forty five degrees West twenty perches West, three
perches North fifty seven and half degrees West fourteen
perches North seventy ~~degrees~~ West, twelve perches North
seventy eight degrees West, nine perches, South sixty two
