At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of
the Peace held at Elberton in and for said
County on Monday the third day of September

A. D. 1877. Before the Honorable Judges of the same Court.

The Petition of George Albert was presented setting
forth that he labors under great inconvenience for want of a
Private Road from his Dwelling House in Lower Godwin Down to
a Point on the Highway. Having no means of getting from or to his
Dwelling House without going through the land of others. And therefore
praying the Court to appoint suitable persons to view and locate the same.

The Court upon due consideration of the premises
Order and appoint William R. Stick, Henry Gore and Stephen Stedman
to view the ground proposed for said Private Road. Who have first given
Public Notice in the manner prescribed by Law of the time and place
of their meeting. And having been all duly sworn or affirmed to
discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity. And to
forward to view and lay out said road as agreed by the
Members of the Petitioner as may be having respect to the best
good for a road and the shortest distance and in such
manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

If the Viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said
Road it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through
whose lands the road may pass releases from any damages
that may arise to them in opening the same; and in every case
when the owner of such lands refuses to release their claims
for damages the said Viewers shall assess the damages and make
report thereof signed by a majority of the Viewers present, and transmit

together with all referred to the next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held in said Office such the Papers Relating to said road.

And the said Viewers shall make Report of their
proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to
be held in said Court, Accompanying the same with a Plot
or Draft of said road and the Curves and Distances and
Reference to the improvements that which the said road may
require. In which Report they shall state that they have
been sworn or affirmed: And also, whether they judge the
said road to be for a Public or Private Road.

To the Honorable Judges of the within named
Court of Cambridge County,

We the subscribers appointed to view the said road therein mentioned,
do report that in pursuance of said order,
having given notice by written hand bills stuck
up of our time appointed to view the said road
upwards of ten days prior to our meeting, so
that all those interested might attend if they saw
proper. And therefore we met on the fifth
day of November A.D. 1877 having been
duly sworn and affirmed as herein
directed we have viewed the ground

proposed for said road, and to return
the same as a private road according to the
following Courses & distances, a plot or draft
whereof is hereto annexed, And also we do
assess the damage of the distance of twelve
rods of said road that runs through John
Kaertz land which is to be twelve feet wide
amounts to Twelve and a half dollars and the
balance of said ground along alley the said
John Kaertz agrees to give him a clear release
Beginning at a corner of George Alberts
and Joseph Hoops lots thence South twelve and
a half degrees west twelve perches to a post this
line runs through John Kaertz land, thence
through the said Kaertz land and along an
alley South seventy two degrees east twenty five
and a half perches to the public road leading from
Cambria City to Mill Creek. Witness our

above written,
