At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of
the Peace held at Ellesby in and for said
County on Monday the third day of September Anno

A.D. 1877 Before the several judges of the same Court.

The Petition of George Colbster was presented setting forth that he labor under great inconvenience for want of a
Private Road from his Dwelling House in Lower Gorder Down Rop. to
a Post on the Highway. Having no means of getting from or to his
Dwelling House without going through the land of others and therefore
praying the Court to appoint suitable persons to view and let the same.

The Court upon due consideration of the premises
Ordered and appointed William R. Stick, Henry Gore and Stephen Chapman
to view the ground proposed by said Private Road who have first given
full information in the manner prescribed by law of the time and place
of their meeting and having been all duly sworn or affirmed to
desirous the duties of their appointment faithfully and to
execute the same and by so doing as agreed to the
Wishes of the Petitioner as may be had respect to the
ground or areas and the shortest distance and in such
manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

If the said men aforesaid shall decide in favor of location said
Road it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through
whose lands the road may pass releases from any damages
that may arise to them in opening the same; and in every case
when the owner of such lands refuse refusing releasing their claim
for damages the said men shall assess the damages and make
report thereof signed by or behalf of the said persons and transmit

together with all Relates to the next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held in said Office such the papers relating to said road.
and the said Towns shall make Report of their
proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be
held in said City, Accompanying the same with a Plan
or Draft of said road and the Curves and Distances and
Reference to the improvements along which the said road may
pass. In which Report they shall state that they have
been sworn and affirmd. And also, whether they judge the
said road keep or be a Publick or Private Road.

To the Honorable Judges of the within named
Court of Cambria County,

We the subscribers app-
ointed to view the said road therein mentioned,
do report that in pursuance of said order,
having given notice by written hand bills stuck
up of our time appointed to view the said road
upwards of ten days p[re]v[io]us to our meeting, so
that all those interested might attend if they saw
proper. And therefore we met on the fifth
day of November A.D. 1877 having been
duly sworn and affirmed as herein
directed we have viewed the ground

proposed for said road, and do return
the same as a private road according to the
following Courses & distances, a plot or draft
whereof is hereto annexed, And also we do
assess the damage of the distance of twelve
rods of said road that runs through John
Haertz land which is to be twelve feet wide
amounts to twelve & half dollars and the
balance of said ground along alley the said
John Haertz agrees to give him a clear release
Beginning at a corner of George Alberts
and Joseph Givops lots thence South twenty and
a half degrees west twenty perches to a post this
line runs through John Haertz land, thence
through the said Haertz land and along an
alley South sixty two degrees east twenty five
& a half perches to the public road leading from
Cumberland City to Mill Creek, Witness our
hands and seals the day and year first
above written,
