

To the Hon. the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace, within
and for the County of Cambria.

The undersigned, persons appointed to view, vacate and supply
the road described in the foregoing order, having attended to that
duty, respectfully

Report:—

All were present at the view of the ground or road to be
vacated and supplied, and all were ^{first} severally sworn in
pursuance of said order. No objection was made to the vacation
and supply proposed. All claim for damages by reason of
the supply was released by Mr. J. Commerce. The ground is
dry and feasible, the grade unobjectionable, and the road pretty
worked and passable whenever the fences are removed.

We are of opinion that the public will be better accommo-
dated by a road here than by the road now traveled. We
therefore lay out for public use the following described road:
Beginning at the side of the road leading from Lloydsville
to Allemans at the late residence or site of John Lander
and running North 11° West through improved land
of John J. Commerce, thirty-six rods to the road leading
from Fiske to Allemans, at the Baptist Church.

And believing it will become useless, inconvenient
and burdensome to the public when the aforesaid
road shall be opened for travel, we vacate the
road, beginning at the road leading from said
Baptist Church to Allemans, at Mr. Commerce's
grist mill, and running South $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West, twenty-
nine rods; thence South $12\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West, twelve rods;

At a. Com. of General Quarter Sessions of
the Peace held at Elmsbury in and for
said County on the 3rd day of April 1847.

The Petition of divers inhabitants of White Townships in said
County was presented setting forth that that part of the
Public Road in White Townships near the former residence
of John Seander to the East side of John St. Hammer
has become incumbered and burdensome and therefore
praying the Com. to Appoint Surveyors to view Vests
and Supply the same.

The Com. upon due consideration of the premises
do order and appoint A. H. Fisk John St. Fisk
and Perry Parrell to view the road proposed to be
Vested and Supplied, who, having first been duly
Sworn and affirmed to discharge the duties of their Appointments
with fidelity shall proceed to Vests and Supply the same.
And if all the said Views show the same And a
Majority of them agree that there is occasion to
Vests and Supply said road. They shall proceed to do
so as agreeably to the wishes of the Petitioners as may
be, having respect to the best ground for a road
and the shortest distance and in such manner
as shall do the least injury to private property.

The persons interested in said road having
formerly given public notice by written or printed advertisements
of the time and place when said Views shall meet for the
purpose of Vests and Supplying said Road at least ten days before

such meeting.

If the Vicars aforeaid shall decide in favor of Vacating and supplying said road it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands the road may pass releases from any damages that may arise to them in opening the same. And in any case when the owner of such lands refuse to release their claims to damages, the said Vicars shall assess the damages, and make reports thereof signed by a majority of the Vicars present, and transmit the same together with all releases to the Court of Quarter Sessions. to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said Vicars shall make reports of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a Petition or Draft of a Bill made with reference to the improvements that which the same may pass. In which report they shall state the City has been done or offered. And also, whether they deem the same well adapted for a Public or Private road.
