
The Petition of one in behalf of Alleghy and
Cassell Turnpike in said City was presented setting
forth that a road has long since been laid out from
Luther's Settlement in Cassell through Winters; part of which
Road. Beginning at a point at or near the residence
of James Shabough in Cassell to a point at or near
the residence of George Libby in Alleghy township, in
the open of Peters Shore to Vatsel and Sappho.
And therefore praying the Court to appoint persons to lay
Vatsel and Supply the same.

The Court upon due consideration. Rul'd of the
Petition do order and appoint Henry Scanlon Esq.
Jack Kippeth and Henry Blum to lay the Road
from the Vatsel and Sappho, who after has but
been duly sworn or affurd a ready way to
perform the duty of their Appointments with honesty, and
to go upon the premises where said road is located. And
if all the men appointed lay the same and a majority
of them agree that there is occasion to Vatsel and Supply
said road they shall proceed to do so as speedily to
the wishes as may be, having respect to the best good
of the road and the shortest distance and in such
manner as shall do it least injury to property.

The persons interested in having Said Road Vacated
and Supplied having previously given full notice
by printed or written Advertisements of the time and
place where said Roads shall meet, for the purpose
of Vacating and Supplying said road at least ten
days before such meeting.

If the Roads aforesaid shall decide upon
Vacating and Supplying said road, it is hereby
made their duty to obtain from the persons through
whom land the part of the road supplied shall pass
leases from any damages that may arise to
them from opening the part supplied. And in every
case where the owner of such land refuses releasing
their claim to damages, the said roads shall assess
the damage, if any, and make up to them
signed by a majority of them present. And transmit
the same together with all leases with City Council
Session to be held in said office.

And the said Roads shall make Report
of their proceedings herein to the next City Council Session
to be held for said City accompanying the same with
a Plot or Draft of the part of said road Vacated and
Supplied, and the times and distances and
refers to the importance that will the same
may pass. And in such Report they shall
state that they have been given or affixed, and
also, whether they judge the same necessary



the Honorable Judges of the same Court.

The Petition of this inhabitant of White and Cleved
township was presented representing that they labor under great
inconvenience in want of a Publick Road commencing at
the farm of Dame Hollis in White township and thence
to lead to the lumber road between the farms of Timothy
Leary and Michael Farrell in Cleved township.
And praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and
lay out said road.

The Court upon due consideration of the premises
do order and appoint Henry Scalon Esq. Col. W. A. McAnally
and Joseph Van Ormer to view the ground proposed for said
road who, after having first been duly sworn or affixed to per-
son the date of their appointment with fidelity, are to go upon
the premises where said road is proposed to lead out and
make said men view the same, and a majority of them
agree thereto, there is occasion for such road, the sheep found
when laid out the same as a great number of sheep
of the flocks as might have right to the best grass
for a road and the shortest distance and in such
manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

The persons intended in said road have first
given publick Notice by written or printed Advertisement
of the time and place where said men shall meet at least

ten day before the time of such meeting.

If the said Commissioners shall decide upon laying out said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons that lie along the road, may pass, Releases from any damage that may arise to them from opening the same. And in every case when the said Commissioners lay out or cause clearing the place to damages, the said Commissioners shall assess the damages and make upsets thereof, signed by all magistrates concerned, and bear onto the same together with all damages to the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in said office.

And said Commissioners shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said City, accompanying the same with a Petition & Draft of said road and the arms, and dimensions and expenses both incurred by the same while it passes. In which Report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed and also whether the said road keeps to an English or French road.




