Court to vacate the same and supply said public  
road on South side of hill to the better advantage  
of the citizens generally beginning at Millers Lane  
on said public road and intersecting said public  
road at Hopkins Old House &c.

The Court upon due consideration had of  
the premises do order and appoint Henry Scanlan,  
David Van Dyke and J. D. McCartney to view the  
ground proposed to be vacated and supplied who  
after having first given due and legal notice of  
the time and place of meeting by printed or  
written advertisements, and having been duly quali-  
fied according to law to discharge the duties of  
their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed  
to view the same and if all the said viewers view  
the same and a majority of them agree that there  
is occasion for said road to be vacated and supplied  
they shall proceed to vacate and supply the same  
as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as

may be having respect for the best ground for a road and the shortest distance and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

If the said viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating and supplying said road it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose land the road may pass releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same; and in every case where the owners of such land refuse releasing their claim to damages the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road and the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which the same passes. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed, and also whether they judge said road necessary for a public or private road.





no occasion for such road or parts thereof







The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint N. M. Gregg, Evan Lewis, John Woodson, George Hager, John Minahan, Charles Shultz, & Lewis R. Jones, viewers, who after being first duly sworn or affirmed according to law to perform their duties under the Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided, with impartiality and fidelity shall proceed to view the premises described in said petition, having regard to both the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said street, and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages; and shall also make assessments for contribution upon all such properties as shall be benefited by the opening, widening or extension of said street, such sums respectively as may have been benefitted over and above all disadvantages.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein in writing to the next session of our said Court, describing the properties

Sec. 1, Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgesses and Town  
Council of the Borough of Millville and it is hereby enacted by  
and ordained by the authority of the same That the lines of  
Conemaugh Street shall be as follows

The North Westerly line shall commence at the corner of Lot of  
the Cambria Iron Company on Main St. thence South Sixty  
one (61) degree West One hundred and Nineteen (119) feet to a  
corner; thence South Eighty seven (87) degree West Eighty  
seven (87) feet; thence North Seventy two and one half ( $72\frac{1}{2}$ )  
degree West One hundred and sixteen (116) feet; thence North  
Sixty eight (68) degree West One hundred and Fifty four  
(154) feet; thence North Fifty five (55) degree West One  
hundred and forty three (143) feet; thence North Forty  
five (45) degree West One hundred and Eighty three (183)  
feet to line of School Alley. The South Easterly line of  
said Street shall be as follows; Beginning at the corner  
of Lot of Emanuel James on Main Street Twenty (20)  
feet distant from the North Easterly line of Conemaugh
