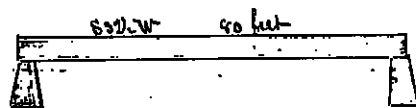

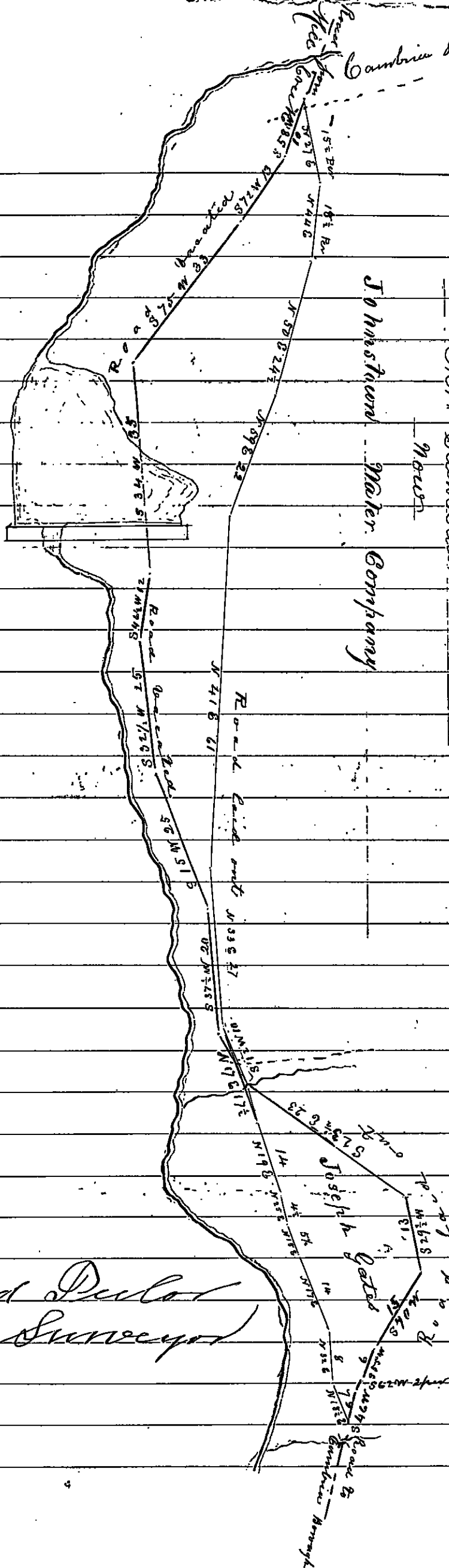

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Chambersburg in and for said County on the 2nd day of June A.D. 1849 before the Honorable John Dean President Judge and John Flanagan and John D. Thomas Esquires Associate Judges.

The petition of divers citizens of the Township of Yoder in said County was presented setting forth, That a public road beginning at the Borough of Cambria in said County and extending through the Township of Yoder to a point on the Public road leading from Johnstown to Mill Creek where said road intersects, was laid out and confirmed by the Court; that the said road has become inconvenient in its present location and would better accommodate the public travel by being changed so as to begin and end at the same points, but to have a portion of it where it passes through the land of Mrs. St. Clair and other adjoining lands, so changed as to place it on higher ground somewhat away from Millman; and praying the Court to inquire of and change the said road and for that purpose to appoint three persons qualified according to law to view the said road and the ground proposed for the said change, and inquire of the premises, and make report of their proceedings at the next term of the Court &c.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint David Peeler, Joseph Masters and John Fulton to view

the road proposed to be vacated and supplied, and if all said viewers appointed view the same and a majority of said viewers agree that part of said road proposed to be vacated and supplied has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, they shall proceed to supply the same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property. The persons interested in said road having previously given public notice by written or printed advertisements of the time and place where said viewers shall meet for the purpose of viewing said road at least ten days before such meeting;

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating and supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through whose lands the same may pass releases from any damages that may arise to them in opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims to damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed in said office with the papers relating to said road;

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road vacated and supplied with refer-

ences to the improvements through which it
passes, in which report they shall state that
they have been sworn or affirmed and also whether
they judge said road necessary for a public
or private road

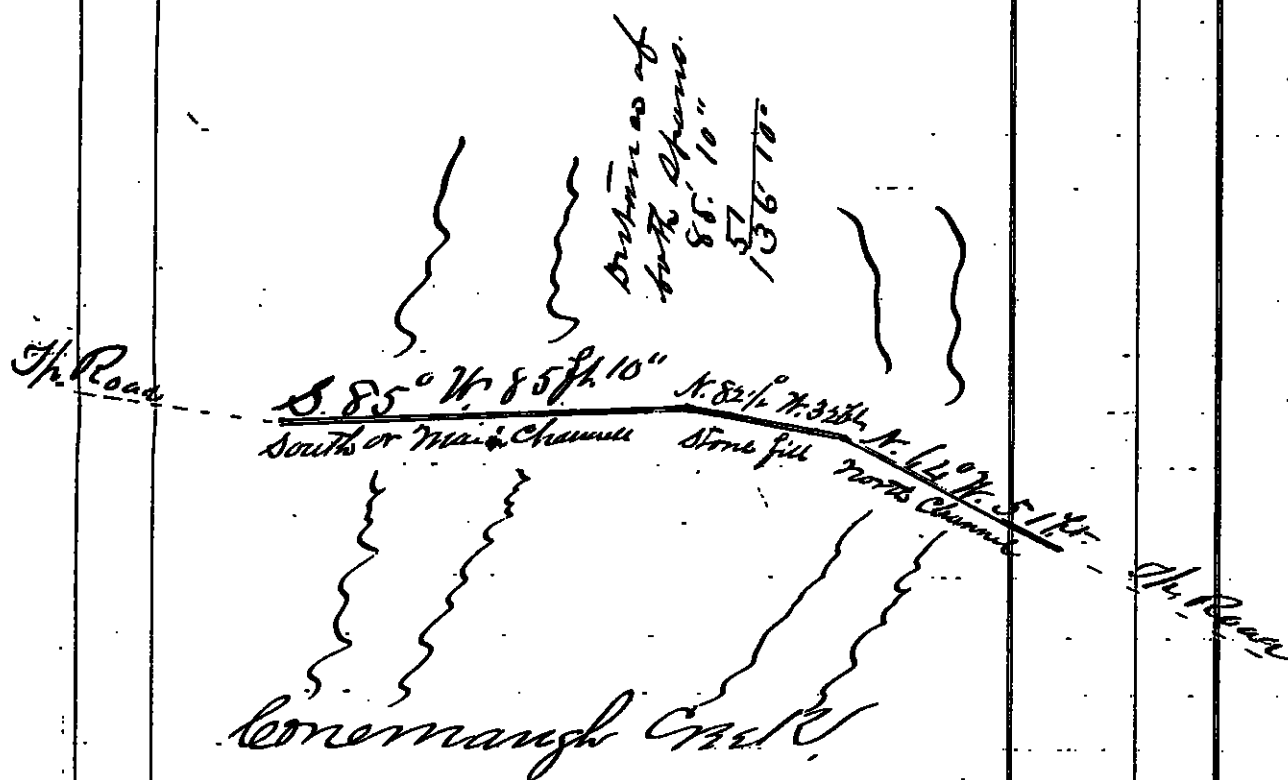

County. We the Jurors appointed by order of said

ing to law make this our report, that we
have made a careful examination of
the premises and find the present (old) bridge
very dangerous to the public and would recom-
mend the immediate construction of a new
bridge. We return the following as the best and most
suitable location for said bridge erection. Begin-
ning on the township road on the South East bank of the
Dormagh Creek in the Village of Sunnyside
Croy Township. Thence across said Creek or main
Channel South 85 degrees West 85 ft. & 10 in. to a stone pile. Thence
across said fill North 82 1/2 degrees West 32 ft. to North 1/2
Channel of said Creek. Thence across said Channel
North 64 degrees West 51 ft. to the North West bank of
said Creek. Making the whole distance of both
spans one hundred & (135 ft) and thirty feet
in inches being the same location as the old
bridge stands upon. We further report that in the
construction of a bridge it will require all new
material; also two new stone piers twelve to
fifteen feet high and in view of the heavy
of furnishing material upon the ground for
such a long bridge and the erection of same in
such a manner as the public would require;
we believe the expense would be too heavy a burden

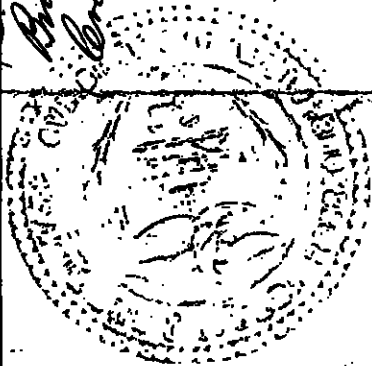
