At a Court of Quarter Sessions held at Elmsburg
in and for said County, on Tuesday the nineteenth
day of July A.D. 1881, before the Honorable Judges
of said Court: The petition of divers inhabitants
of ~~Allegany~~ ^{Allegheny} Townships in said County
was presented, setting forth, that a road hath lately been laid out by
order of the Court, from Loretto Springs in Allegheny Township, to Gallitzin
Christy's Mill and Coal bank, on the road leading from Dawson's Mills
to Gallitzin, which road if confirmed by the Court will be very injurious
to said petitioners, and burdensome to the inhabitants through which
the same passes, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons
to review the said road and parts adjacent, and make report thereof
according to law: The Court upon due consideration had of the
premises, appointed John W. McCortley, John Wagues and Henry Scanlon
Reviewers, who having first been duly sworn or affirmed according to
law, to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, are to go
upon the premises and Review said road, and make report of their
proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for
said County: The Reviewers are to make publications by written or
printed advertisements of the time and place when they shall
meet for the purpose of discharging the duties of their appointment,
and further, should any changes be made in said road as formerly
laid out, it will be the duty of said Reviewers to obtain releases
from the owners of lands through which road may pass, ^{for damages}, and should
any of such owners of lands refuse to give releases for damages,
if any, it will be duty of said Reviewers to assess damages if
any, to such owners of lands, and transmit the same with
their proceedings herein, and further they shall state in their Report
whether they judge such road as laid out for public or private
use, and that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned Viewers ap-
pointed by said Court to view the road mentioned in the
aforesaid order of Court do report that we gave due and timely
notice of time and place of said viewing by three written ad-
vertisements pasted in the most public places in Allegheny and Calhoun
Townships a copy of said notice is hereto attached And we do
hereby further report that having met at time and place mentioned
in said notices and after all first being duly sworn according
to law to perform the duties of our appointment we began at
a Post on Public Road leading from Fort to Sawsons Mills thence
1 South fifty one and one half degrees East by line of land of James Eckmude
and C R H Himmelsbight fourteen perches Post thence 2 South thirty
four and one half degrees East twenty two perches Post thence 3 South
fifty two and one half degrees East thirty five perches Post thence 4 South
thirty four and one half degrees East fourteen and one half perches
thence 5 South Eighty degrees East Seventeen and one half perches thence
6 North Sixty Eight degrees East fifteen perches thence 7 South fifty
Seven and one half degrees East six perches thence 8 South thirty de-
grees East twelve perches thence 9 South Eleven degrees East crossing head
road to Saw Mill and Clearfield Creek fifty eight perches to Post thence
10 South forty one degrees East fourteen perches thence 1 South thirty
Eight degrees East forty nine perches Post thence 2 South Eighty nine de-
grees East at thirty perches to Township road leading from Andrews Mill

Hawsons and Gallitzin road thence by said road 3 South fifty seven

of Henry Sauken George Weir and others South Sixty nine and one half degrees

twenty seven perches thence 2 South sixty four degrees East thirty

at thirteen perches intersect Township road from Sawsons Mills to Gallitzin
then near residence of Gallitzin Christy in Gallitzin Township which
said proposed road in Our Opinion will be very Expensive to open
that is the Expense of opening said road will be more than the
Townships of Gallitzin and Allegheny are able to bear that a portion
of said road if opened will be dangerous to travel it being a
side cut along the face of a very steep hill and we are further
one of the Opinion that the travel in that section of the Settlement
does not require said road but that it would Expense maintenance
and burthensome to the inhabitants thereabouts and that
the same is not necessary for a public road or highway All
