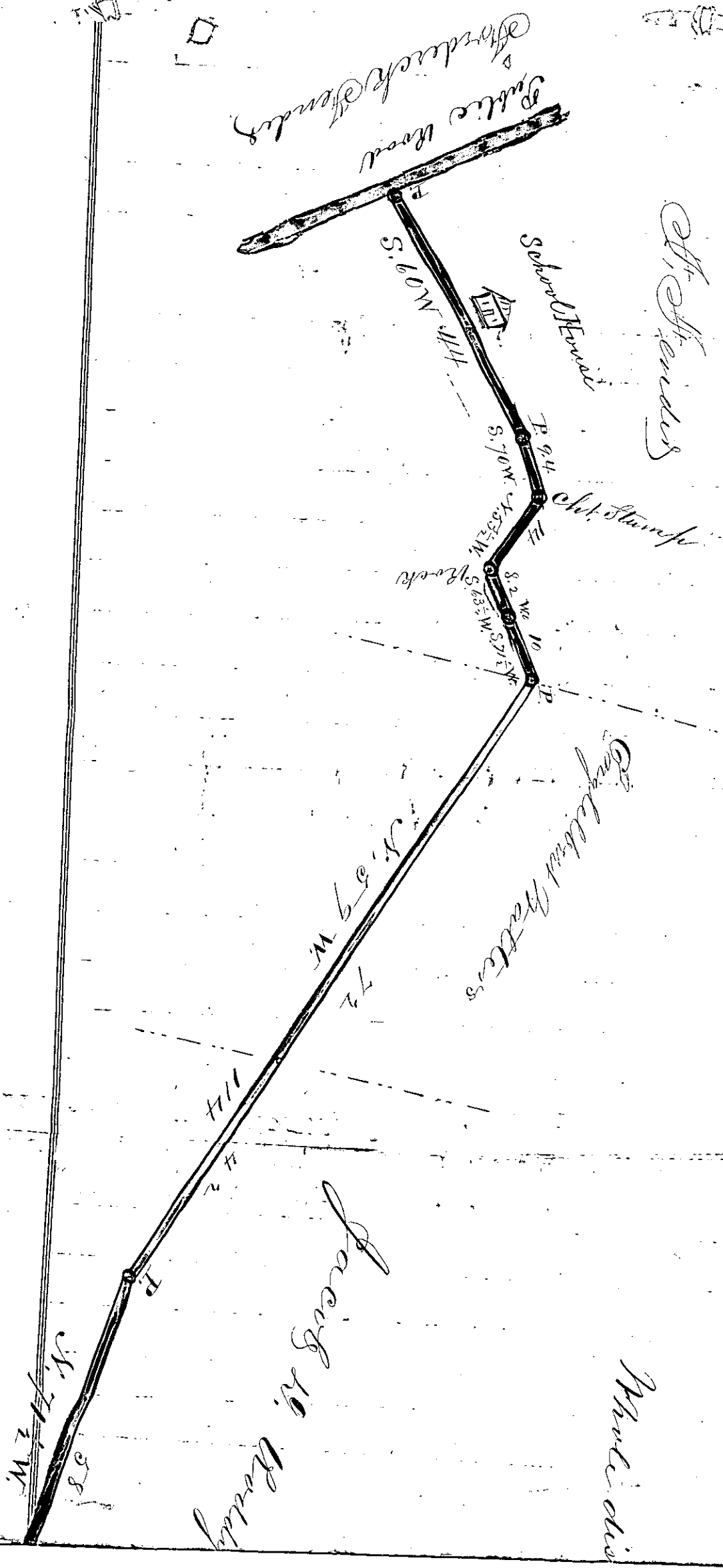

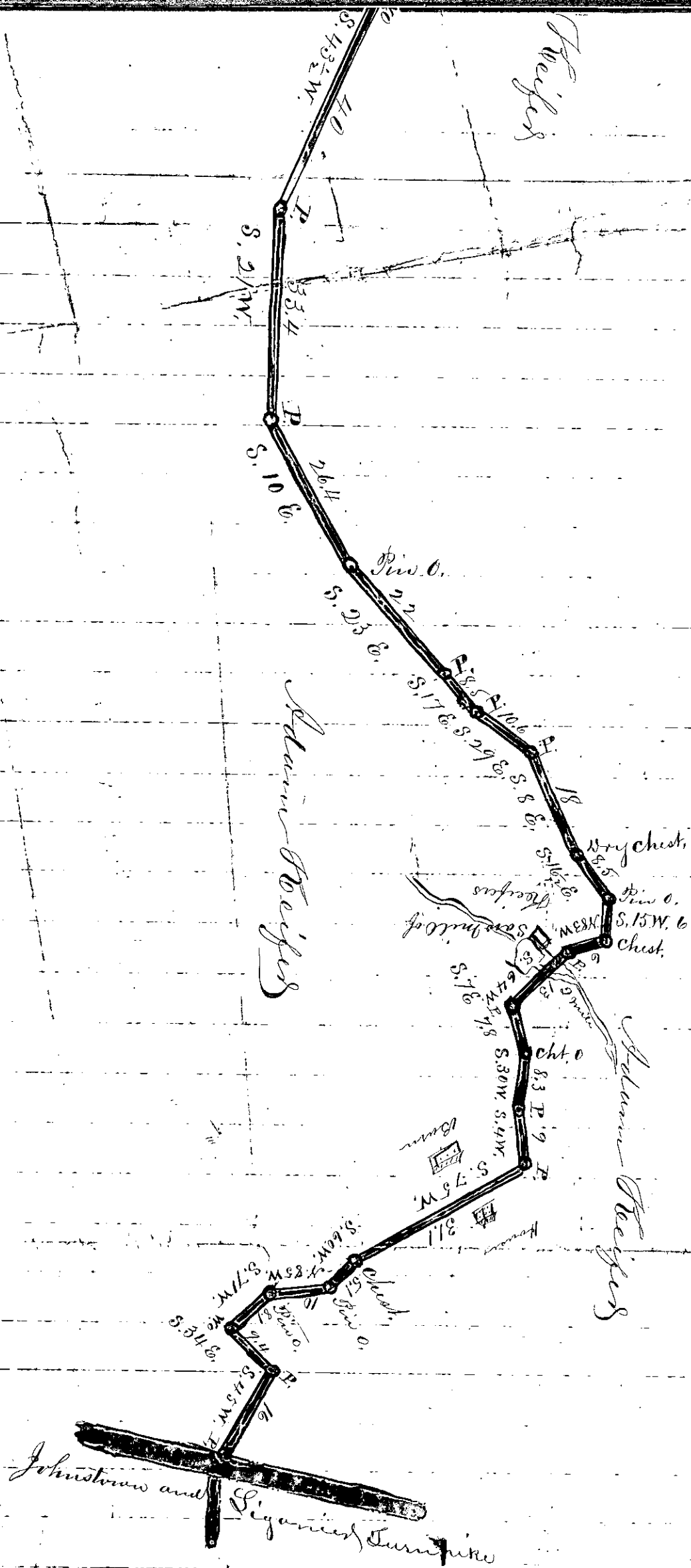

South sixty six degrees west fifty eight
& four tenth perches to a post, thence North
eighty eight degrees west four perches to a
post, thence North eighty degrees west
fourteen perches to Ch^t. O, thence South eighty
degrees west nineteen perches a stump, thence
North seventy degrees west seven & six
tenth perches to a Ch^t. O, thence South forty
eight degrees west sixteen perches to Adam
Heifers line thence by same course through
said Heifers land whole distance of
this line is thirty & a half perches to a Pin O,
thence South twenty two degrees west thirteen
& two tenth perches to a Pin O, thence South forty
three degrees west thirty & three tenth perches to a Pin,
thence South fifty three degrees west twenty one
& a half perches to W. O, thence ^{South} forty three & a
half degrees west forty perches to a post, thence
South twenty one degrees west thirty three & four
tenth perches to a post, thence South ten de-
grees east twenty six & four tenth perches to a
Pin O, thence South twenty three degrees east twenty
two perches to a post, thence South seventeen
degrees east eight & five tenth perches to
a post, thence South twenty nine degrees
east ten & six tenth perches to a post, thence
South eight degrees east eighteen perches
to a very Ch^t, thence South sixteen & a half

degrees east eight & five tenth perches to a
Pail oak, thence South fifteen degrees west
six perches to a chest, thence North eighty
three degrees west six perches to a post
below Adam Keifers saw mill, thence
South sixty four degrees west five perches
cross trail road & Watton Run whole
distance of this line thirteen perches to
a post near ^{Black} Smith shop, thence South
seven degrees east seven & eight tenth
perches to a Chest, O, thence South thirty
degrees west eight & three tenth perches to
post, thence South four degrees west nine
perches to a post, thence South seventy
five degrees west (this line runs be-
tween Adam Keifers House and
Barn) thirty one & one tenth perches
to a Chest, thence South sixty de-
grees west five & one tenth perches
to Pin O, thence North eighty five de-
grees west ten perches to a Pin O, thence
South seventy one degrees west eight
& one tenth perches to N. O, thence South
thirty four degrees east nine and
four tenth perches to post in field,
thence through said field South forty
five degrees west sixteen
perches to post on the Johnston &

Ligonier Turnpike on land of
Adam Keifers, And also find
no objections by any of the parties
owning lands that this road passes
through, as they have all released

Keifer's in said Township, in consideration
of said Road being laid out and framed
as a public road, do hereby release all
damages caused or to be caused to us and
either of us by the opening of said road,
and we agree not to claim any damages
for the opening or construction of the same.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County on the seventh day of March A.D. 1881

Before the Honorable Judges of the said Court The petition of sundry citizens of Upper Yoder Township in said County was presented representing that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road commencing at a point near Fred Fendlers and a School House in said Township and ending at a point near Adam Keifers on Ligonier Pike in said Township and praying the said Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint William Slick, John E. Woods and Henry Shentel to view the ground proposed for said road who after having first given due and legal notice by printed or written advertisements of the time and place of meeting and having been duly qualified according to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity shall proceed to view the same and if a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to

the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose land the road may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case when the owners of such land refuse releasing their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages (if any) and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road and the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which the same passes. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed and also whether they judge the said road necessary for a public or private road.

We the subscribers
appointed by the within order of Court
to view the ground proposed for said
road, And that in pursuance of said
order, we first gave due notice by written
handbills stuck up along the route of said
road stating the day when we would meet
to examine and view said road (upward
of ten days previous to our meeting). We also
met on the 20th day of May A. D. 1881 and
after all being duly sworn and affirmed
we proceeded to view the ground proposed
for said road, And that we have laid
out and do report a road for Public use
according to the following Courses & distances
a draft whereof is here to annexed.
Viz. Beginning at a post on a public road
on land of Frederick Fenders near a
School House thence through said Fenders
land South sixty degrees west twenty four
perches opposite School House whole distance
of said line forty four perches to a post, thence
South seventy degrees west nine and four
tenths perches to Ch^t. stump, thence North
fifty three & a half degrees west fourteen
perches to a Rock, thence South sixty three

and a half degrees west eight and two tenth perches to a P.O. thence South seventy one & a half degrees west ten perches to a post on land of Englebert Watters thence through said Watters land North fifty nine degrees west seventy two perches to Jacob H. Roddy's land thence through said Roddy's land and same corner, the whole distance of this line is one hundred and fourteen perches to a post, thence North seventy one & a half degrees west fifty eight perches to a post on line of Henry Shenkel, thence through said Shenkel's land
