near Conrad Gilde. And praying the Court to appoint
proper persons to view and lay out the same according
to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the
premises do Order and appoint Samuel W. Miller
James King and Arwine Matz to view the ground
proposed for said Road. Who after having first given
due and legal notice by printed or written advertisements
of the time and place of meeting, and having been
duly qualified according to law to discharge the
duties of this appointment with fidelity, shall proceed
to view the same, and if all the said Viewers view
the same, and a majority of them agree that
there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed
to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of
the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best
ground for a road and the shortest distance and
in such manner as to do the least injury to
private property.

If the Viewers aforesaid shall decide
in favor of locating said road, it is further

Made their duty to obtain from persons through whom land the road may pass Releases from any Damages that may Accrue to them from opening the same, And in any Case where the Owners of such Land refuse releasing their Claim to Damages the said Viewers shall Assess the Damages, if any, And make Report thereof signed by a Majority of the Viewers present, and transmit the same together with all Releases, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, to be filed with the papers relating to said Road.

And the said Viewers shall make Report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in said County, Accompanying the same with a Plot or Draft of said Road, And the Courses and Distances, And Reference to the improvements through which the same passes. In which Report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed, And also whether they Judge the said Road necessary for a Publick or Private Road.

The undersigned appointed as per annexed order
viewers to report upon the propriety of vacating a public road
leading from the Old State Road at or near lands of Moses
Kring to the old Bedford Road at or near Rachels Run in
Adams Township, Cambria County, respectfully report.

That after being duly sworn or affirmed and
having given due notice of the time for meeting met on the
road and passed over its entire length as well as on the
line of the other road leading in the same general direction.
After a careful examination of the matter we are of the
opinion that the road as laid out is necessary to accommo-
date the general public and is the best and most practicable
route over the mountain as it avoids all the steep grades of
the other route and when it is fully opened as it should be
will be the only road traveled over the mountain in Adams
Township, between Johnstown and Bedford.

And we further report that the road when
fully opened will accommodate a greater number of the
citizens of Adams Township than any other route.

We are therefore unanimously of the opinion
that the prayer of the petitioners should not be granted, and
that the road should not be vacated.

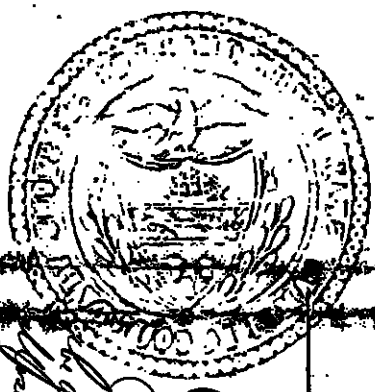

The Petition of Citizens of Barr and Blacklick

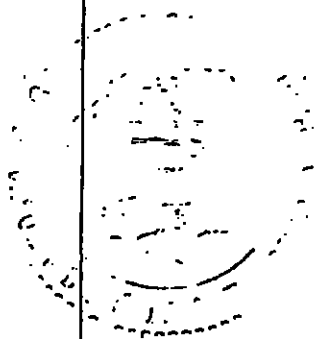

1st No Notice was given to owners of improved land through which the road was laid out.

2nd The road is laid out close to, and parallel with, the old Portage Rail Road, which is a public road, in use over twenty one years, and is not vacated by the Report of the Viewers.

3rd The Viewers did not obtain from the Owners of the land through which the road passes releases from damages that may accrue to them by the opening of the said road, or if the Owners refused to release, the Viewers have failed to assess damages that may be sustained.

4th On 8th Apr 1857 this Court granted an order to open a Public Road from Summitville to Plane ch 3.

This road is located on the bed of the old Portage Rail Road, has been in use ever since, and that part of it, running up Plane ch 4, is close to and parallel with the road reported by the Viewers.
