a point on said road on lands of Michael  
Nagle in Gallitzin township for the following  
reasons:

First. The present road runs on the line  
of Gallitzin and Dean townships; the  
proposed supply road is wholly within  
Gallitzin township; it would therefore be  
unjust to the tax payers of Gallitzin town-  
ship to put upon them unnecessarily or  
without a sufficient reason the entire  
expense of keeping up the said road.  
Second. The present road is much shorter than  
the proposed supply, it being the most  
direct route between the points named;  
it has a good solid bed; it has been  
in use as a public road upwards of  
fifty years and if it be desired  
the steep hills can be avoided without  
materially changing the line of the present

road by going upon open ground ad-  
jacent.

Third. The proposed supply road is sub-  
ject to snow drifts in winter and is  
in wet seasons impassible.

Fourth. Although the proposed supply road  
has been open for the last two years,  
so that it has been optional with the  
public which road they should use  
the present public road was and is  
continually used for travel.

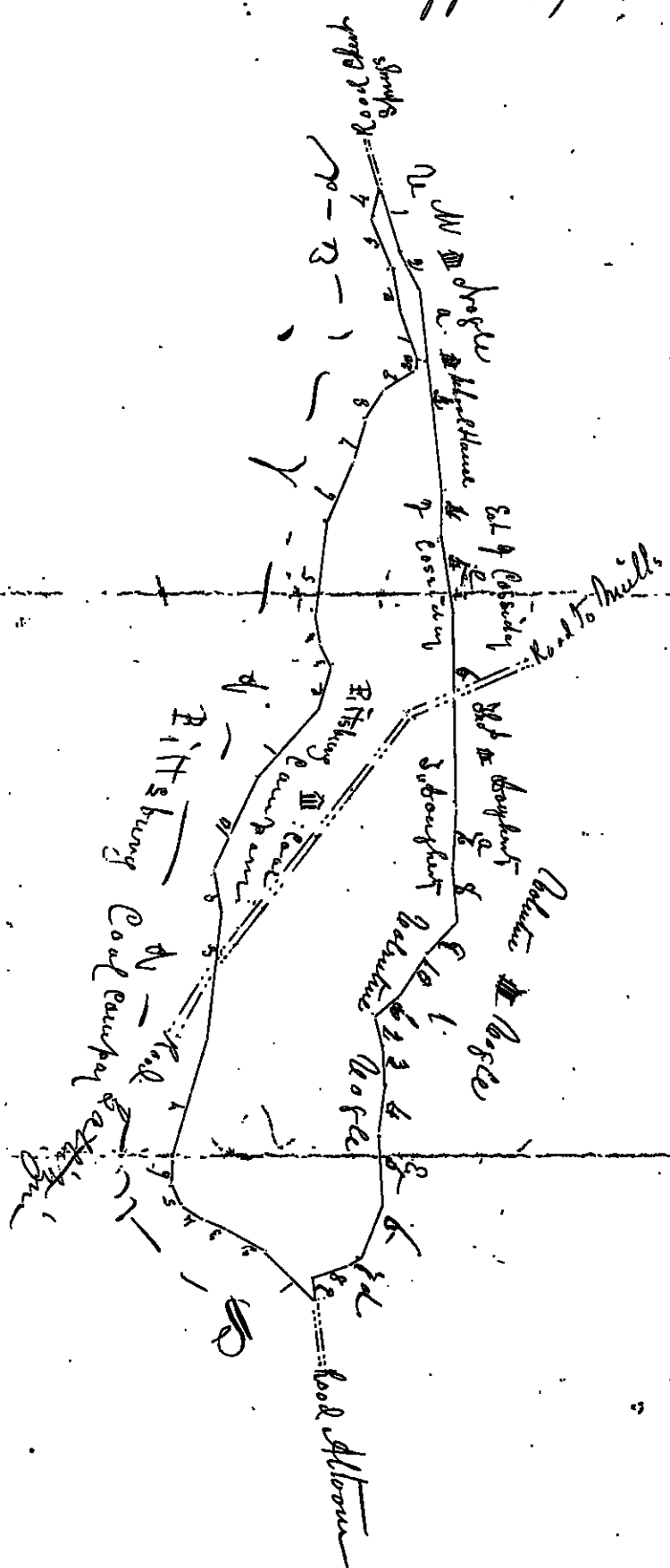

The petition of sundry Citizens of Dean and  
Gallitzin Townships in said County was presented  
representing that a portion of the road leading  
from Chest Springs to Altoona beginning at  
Dawell Run in Dean Township and ending  
at a point on said old road on land of Michael  
Nagle in Gallitzin Township has become useless  
inconvenient and burdensome and praying the  
Court to appoint suitable persons to view and  
vacate the same and supply the same by  
a new road to commence at said Dawell Run  
and to intersect the old road on lands of said  
Michael Nagle in Gallitzin Township.

The Court upon due consideration had of  
the premises do order and appoint Henry  
Scanlan, W. J. Kriss and J. N. McGuire to  
view the ground proposed to be vacated and  
supplied who after having first given due and  
legal notice of the time and place of meeting by  
printed or written advertisements, and having  
been duly qualified according to law to discharge  
the duties of their appointment with fidelity  
shall proceed to view the same and if all the  
said viewers view the same and a majority of

them agree that there is occasion for said road to be vacated and supplied, they shall proceed to vacate and supply the same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating and supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands the road may pass releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of said land refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which the same passes. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed and also whether they judge said road necessary for a public or private road.
