

To the Honorable the Judges of the within
named Court,

We the subscribers appointed by
the within order of Court to view the ground
proposed for said road, And that in
pursuance of said order, we first gave
due notice of the time and place when we
would meet to examine and view said
road, And we also met on the ground on
the 31st day of August and the 6th day of
Sept 1882 and all being duly sworn we
proceeded to examine the ground proposed
for said road, And that we have laid
out and do report a Road for public use
according to the following course and
distances, (and to be thirty feet wide)
A draft whereof is hereto annexed,
viz Beginning at a Gum corner on lands of
Mr McJames ~~land~~ and near Beech
Spring thence through said Mr James land
North eighty four degrees west five & a half
perches to Post corner of Isaac Bowser's
lot thence by the line of Mr McJames & said Bow-
ser's lot South sixty nine ^{degrees} west seven & nine
tenths perches to a Gum corner, thence North
seventy nine degrees west with Mr James land on
the left & Bowser on the right at 16.8 perches come
to John H. Wambough's land on right and at 25.8 ps

we came to Thomas Gallaghers corner of land
on the left, and same bearing at 32.2 ps came
to Live Marshes land on the right, at 45 ps more
came to corner of Peter Keelen land on right
& at 23.2 perches more to post end of line of said
Keelans, the whole distance of this division line is
one hundred & seven tenth perches, thence through
Thomas Gallaghers land North forty seven
degrees west four & two tenth perches to a chestnut, thence
North seventy nine degrees west eight perches to a
post, thence North forty seven degrees west eleven
perches to a post, thence North seventy one degrees
west twenty ^{two} & seven tenth perches to a maple, thence
South fifty eight degrees west six & seven tenth
perches to a chestnut, thence North sixty two degrees
west two & seven tenth perches to a post, thence
North eighteen degrees east twelve perches to a B, O
thence North thirty five degrees east seven & two tenth
perches to a B, O, thence North six degrees east four &
two tenth perches to post in old road near where Gallaghers
old barn stood, thence up along said old road
& through Thomas Gallaghers land South seventy
five degrees west fourteen perches to a post, thence
North seventy five degrees west seven & two tenth perches
to a Locust, thence North forty degrees west sixteen
& eight tenth perches to a post, thence North thirty
degrees west thirteen perches to a post, thence
North twenty two degrees west ten & a half perches to stone

thence North thirty two degrees west ten perches to post,
thence North ten degrees west thirty six perches
to a Chestnut, thence North sixteen & a half degrees
west sixteen perches to a post, thence North thirty
one degrees west eighteen perches to a post,
thence North eighteen degrees west eighteen perches
to a post, thence North eighty four degrees
west seventeen perches to Locust stump edge of
old road, thence North sixty nine degrees west eleven
& a half perches to a post, thence North thirty six
degrees west twenty three perches to a post, thence
North sixty six degrees west twenty five
& a half perches to line of Jackson
Horners land eight & a half more perches
to post, whole distance of this line thirty
four perches near an old dwelling house
of Jackson Horners on an old Road,

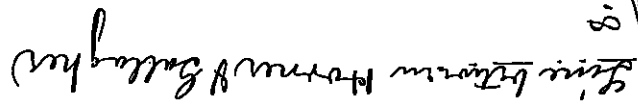

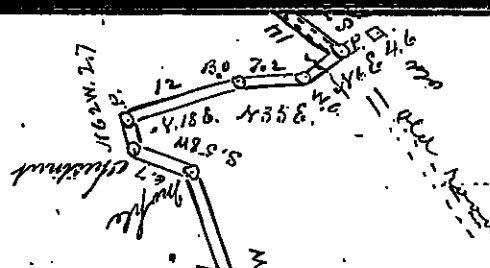

Camden County N.J.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace
held at Elmsburg in and for the County of Camden
on the 8th day of August A.D. 1882 before the Hon-
orable Judges of the said Court. The petition of ~~various~~
~~city~~ sundry citizens of Lawrenceville township in
said County was presented setting forth "That a public road is
needed in said township to lead from the house of Jackson Hornes
on the old Fairfield road to a point on the township road at Back
Spring" and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view
the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration
had of the premises do order and appoint Campbell Sheridan,
Jackson Hornes and William Slick to view the ground pro-
posed for said road, who after first having given due and legal notice
by written or printed advertisements, of the time and place of meeting
and having been duly qualified according to law to discharge the
duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view
the same, and if all the said viewers view the same, and a majority
of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed
to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners
may be, having respect to the best ground and the shortest distance
and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property.
If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said
road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through
whose land the same may pass, releases from any damages that
may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case
when the owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for
damages, the said viewers shall take damages, if any, and make
report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and
transmit the same together with all releases, to be filed with
the papers relating to said road. And the said viewers shall
make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court.

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Recorded in Road Book
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1 of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County, are
2 accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, the
3 courses and distances and reference to the improvements through
4 which the same pass. And which report they shall state dis-
5 tinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed, and also, whether
6 they judge said road necessary for public or for private use
