

Cambria County, Pa:

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Ebensburg, in and
for said County, on Wednesday the 15th
day of November A.D. 1882, before the
Honorable Judges of said Court. The petition
of sundry citizens of the Townships of Clearfield and Deaw in
said County was presented, representing "That a public road
has long since been laid out by order of Court, but which
is not yet open. Beginning in the old township road, about
thirty rods west of the house of Michael Byrne, and thence
leading across Clearfield Creek at or near where the Rodgers
or Louke Saw Mill formerly stood, and thence by the
several courses of said road, to the township road below
Dysarts Old Coal bank in the Townships of Deaw and
Clearfield, and that said road has become inconvenient
in its present location, and would be very expensive
to said Townships to open the same, and that it would
better accommodate the public travel by being changed
so as to begin and end at the same points, that is, to
begin at the point on the Old Road, about thirty rods
west of house of Michael Byrne, and thence to lead by
the nearest and best route along the several courses
of the Old road so as to cross the Clearfield Creek
at the present fording on said road, and thence along
said Old road to the point where the said road is prayed
to be vacated as aforesaid, and therefore praying the
Court to inquire of and change the said road, and for
that purpose, to appoint three persons qualified according
to law to view the said road, and the ground proposed
for said change and inquire of the premises, and make
report of their proceedings herein according to law.

1 The Court upon due consideration had of the premises
2 appointed Henry Scanlan, Patrick Fiverty and
3 Silas Ryan to view the ground proposed to be vacated
4 and supplied, who after having first given due and
5 legal notice of the time and place of meeting by
6 printed or written advertisement, and having been duly
7 qualified according to law to discharge the duties of
8 their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view
9 the same, and if a majority of them agree that
10 there is occasion for said road to be supplied, they shall
11 proceed to vacate and supply the same as agreeably to
12 the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the
13 best ground for said road, and the shortest distance, and in
14 such manner as to do the least injury to private property.
15 If the said Viewers shall decide in favor of vacating and
16 supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty, to
17 obtain from the persons through whose land the road may
18 pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them
19 from opening the same, and in every case where the
20 owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages,
21 the said Viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make
22 report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present.
23 And the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings
24 herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said
25 County, together with all releases, damages assessed, if any,
26 and a plot or draft thereof of parts vacated and supplied
27 and references to the improvements through which parts
28 supplied may pass, and whether they judge the same necessary
29 for Public or Private use: and in which report, they shall
30 state distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed
31 according to law.

We Henry Seaulau Patrick Smirly and
Silas Ryan the Jurors appointed by Order of
Court hereto annexed do report that having
gone due and truly notice of time and place
of the meeting of the Jurors by three written notices
posted in three public places adjacent to said ro-
ad in Cleasfield and Green Townships a copy of
said notices is hereto annexed And we do further
report that we having met at time and place design-
ated by said notices and after first all being sworn
according to law to perform the duties of our off-
icement with fidelity did view and locate the
following parts of said road in consequence of low
flat ground where said road crosses Cleasfield Brook
and from same to Coal bank being swampy ground
viz Beginning at a point west of Michael Byrne on Public
road leading from Buck Horn to Saint Augustus in
Cleasfield Township thence 1st South two degrees West
fifteen perches 2^d South ten degrees West Eleven perches
3^d South twenty six degrees West Six perches 4th South Eleven
degrees West fourteen perches 5th South thirty two degrees West
Eight perches 6th South fifteen degrees West Eight
perches 7th South fourteen degrees West Eight perches 8th

South nine degrees West Eight perches 7th South six
degrees West five perches 10th South one and one half
degrees East fourteen perches 1st South five degrees West
four perches 2^d South thirteen degrees West six perches 3^d
South seven degrees West two perches 4th South three
degrees East four perches 5th South five degrees East six
perches 6th South six degrees East nine perches 7th South
Eight degrees East three perches 8th South six degrees East
twelve perches 9th South seven degrees West six perches

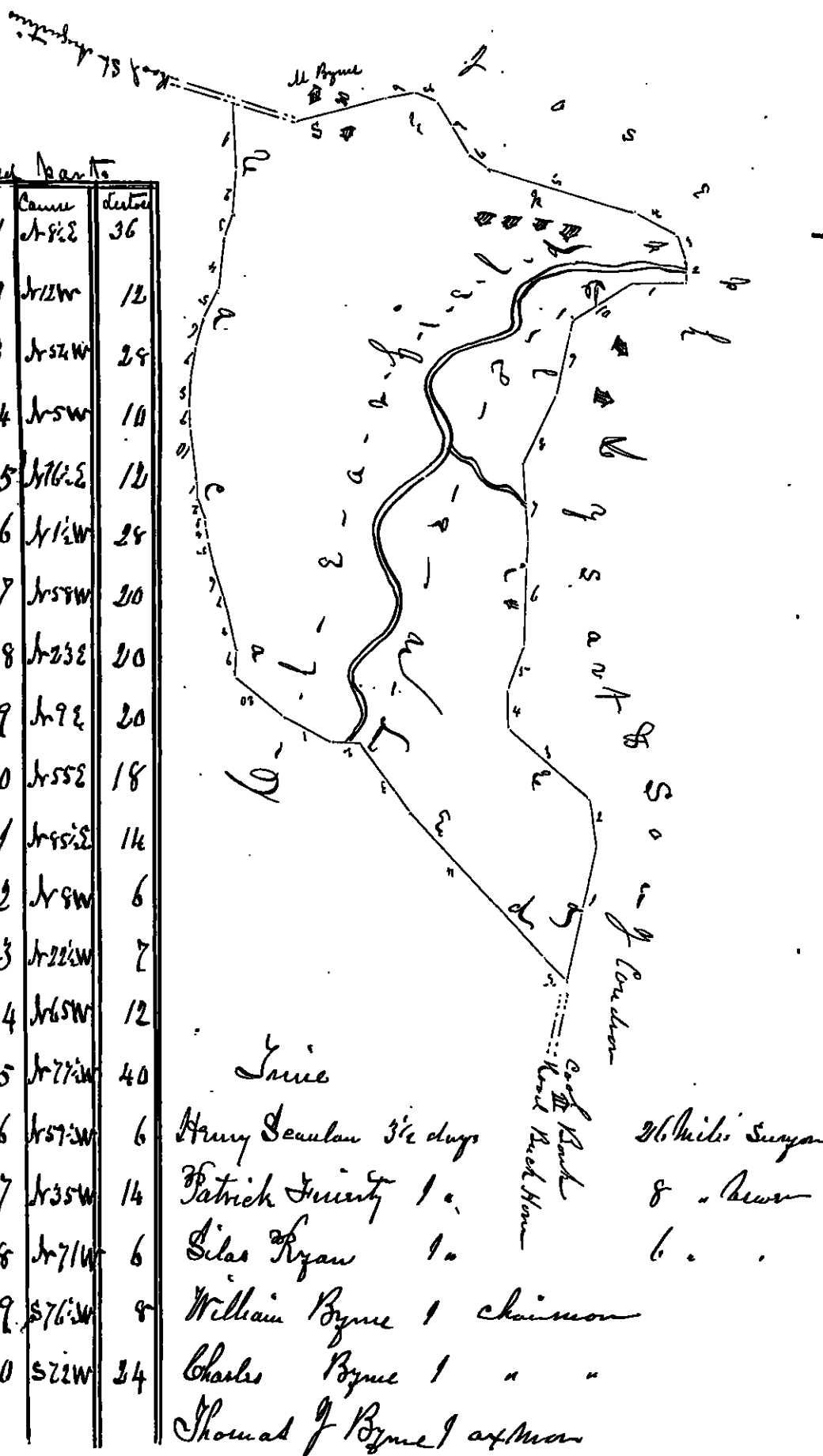
