

Cambria County, Pa:

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Ebensburg, in and
for said County, on Wednesday the 15th
day of November A.D. 1882, before the
Honorable Judges of said Court. The petition
of sundry citizens of the Townships of Clearfield and Deer in
said County was presented, representing that a public road
has long since been laid out by order of Court, but which
is not yet open, beginning in the old township road, about
thirty rods west of the house of Michael Byrne, and thence
leading across Clearfield Creek at or near where the Rodriguez
or Lameke Saw Mill formerly stood, and thence by the
several courses of said road, to the township road, below
Dysarts Old Coal bank in the Townships of Deer and
Clearfield, and that said road has become inconvenient
in its present location, and would be very expensive
to said Townships to open the same, and that it would
better accommodate the public travel by being changed
so as to begin and end at the same points, that is, to
begin at the point on the Old Road, about thirty rods
west of house of Michael Byrne, and thence to lead by
the nearest and best route along the several courses
of the Old Road so as to cross the Clearfield Creek
at the present fording on said road, and thence along
said Old road to the point where the said road is prayed
to be vacated as aforesaid, and therefore praying the
Court to inquire of and change the said road, and for
that purpose, to appoint three persons qualified according
to law to view the said road, and the ground proposed
for said change and inquire of the premises, and make
report of their proceedings herein according to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises
1 appointed Henry Scanlon, Patrick Tierney and
2 Silas Ryan to view the ground proposed to be Vacated
3 and Supplied, who after having first given due and
4 legal notice of the time and place of meeting by
5 printed or written advertisement, and having been duly
6 qualified according to law to discharge the duties of
7 their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view
8 the same, and if a majority of them agree that
9 there is occasion for said road to be supplied, they shall
10 proceed to Vacate and supply the same as agreeably to
11 the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the
12 best ground for said road, and the shortest distance, and in
13 such manner as to do the least injury to private property.
14 If the said Viewers shall decide in favor of Vacating and
15 supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty, to
16 obtain from the persons through whose land the road may
17 pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them
18 from opening the same, and in every case where the
19 owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages,
20 the said Viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make
21 report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present.
22 And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings
23 herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said
24 County, together with all releases, damages assessed, if any,
25 and a plan or draft thereof of parts Vacated and supplied
26 and references to the improvements through which parts
27 supplied may pass, and whether they judge the same necessary
28 for Public or Private use: and in which report they shall
29 state distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed
30 according to law.

We Henry Scaulau Patrick Smyth and
Solas Ryan the Assessors appointed by Order of
Court hereto averse to report that having
gone due and timely notice of time and place
of the meeting of the Assessors by three written Notices
posted in three public places adjacent to said ro-
ad in Blairfield and Brown Townships a copy of
said Notices is hereto annexed And we do further
report that we having met at time and place design-
ated by said Notices and after first all being sworn
according to law to perform the duties of our off-
ice and with fidelity did then and recite the
following parts of said road in consequence of low
flat ground where said road crosses Blairfield Creek
and from same to Coal bank being swampy ground
viz Beginning at a point west of Michael Byrne on Public
road leading from Buck How to Saint Augustines in
Blairfield Township thence 1st South two degrees West
fourteen perches 2^d South ten degrees West eleven perches
3^d South twenty six degrees West six perches 4th South eleven
degrees West fourteen perches 5th South thirty two degrees West
eight perches 6th South nineteen degrees West eight
perches 7th South four degrees West eight perches 8th




