

To the Honourable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of Cambria

The petition of the undersigned
citizens of Taylor Township in said
County respectfully represents

That a public road in said
Township beginning at the Bridge of
Millville, and following the old Penn-
sylvania Canal, (now abandoned) to the
Bunker Factory, was laid out and
confirmed by the Court more than ten
years ago, and that said road has
become inconvenient in its present location,
and would better accommodate the public
travel by being changed so as to
begin and end at the same point, but
to be shifted farther from the river
at lands of the Cambria Iron Company
along and near to a place known as
Brake rocks.

The petitioner therefore prays the Court
to require and change the said road,
by vacating a portion thereof and supplying
the same and for this purpose to appoint
persons qualified according to law,
to reeve the said road, and the ground prepared
for the said change; and require of the premises
and make report at the next term of Court, that they will

Cambria County, A.S.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg; in and for said County, on the sixth day of March A.D. 1882 before the Honorable Judges of said Court: The petition of sundry Citizen of Taylor Township in said County was presented, representing, "that a public road in said Township, beginning at the Borough of Millville, and following the Old Pennsylvania Canal (now abandoned) to the Bucket Factory, was laid out and confirmed by the Court more than ten years ago, and that said road has become inconvenient in its present location, and would better accommodate the public travel by being changed, so as to begin and end at the same points, but to be shifted further from the River at lands of the Cambria Iron Company, along and near to a place known as Snake Rocks;" and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view said road, and Vacate and Supply the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint David Peeler, William Riblett, and William Galbraith to view the ground proposed to be Vacated and supplied; who after having given due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting, by printed or written advertisements, and qualifying themselves according to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if all of said viewers view the same, and a majority of them agree that there is occasion to Vacate and supply said road, they shall proceed to do so as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, the shortest distance and to do the least injury to private property. If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of Vacating and supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands the road supplied may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their

claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof, signed by a majority of the viewers present, and transmit the same, together with all releases with their report. And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of road vacated and supplied, and references to the improvements through which the same passes; in which report, they shall state distinctly that they had been sum or affirmed according to law, and whether the judge road supplied for Public or Private use.





To the Honorable the Judges within named:-
We, the undersigned, appointed by the annexed
order do report: That in pursuance thereof
after being severally duly sworn and affirmed
and after giving due and legal notice of the time
and place of meeting, all the viewers, appointed
by the said order, viewed that portion of the
road therein described, and to be vacated and
supplied, viz: Commencing at a point on said
road at line of D. Hess and extending thence
Northward a distance of two hundred
rods to Laurel Run, and we find that the same
is inconvenient in its present location and we
therefore vacate the same, and we have sup-
plied the road so vacated, having respect for
the shortest distance and the best ground for
such new road, which we have laid out in
such manner as to do the least injury to
private property, and as far as practicable
agreeably to the desires of the petitioners, and
do return for public use the following de-
scribed supplied road to wit: Beginning
at a point on said road at line of D. Hess;
thence North 10 degrees East, 52 perches; thence
North 1½ degrees East, 10 perches; thence North
20 degrees West, 20 perches; thence North
39 degrees West, 14 perches; thence North
71 degrees West, 20 perches; thence North
51 degrees West, 10 perches; thence North
35 degrees West, 12 perches; and thence
North 18 degrees West, 54 perches to bridge
across Laurel Run.

The undersigned further report that

we have procured from Cambria Iron Company, the only owner of land over which said road passes, a release in writing of all claim to damages that may arise from opening the same, and we annex a plot or draft of said road vacated and supplied, and references to the improvements through which the same passes, and herewith return the release obtained.
