Borough respectfully represents: That the Town
Council of said Borough on the 18th day of July A.
D. 1882, passed the following ordinance viz:

" Ordinance No.

An Ordinance Extending Sherman Street in the Sixth
Ward of the Borough of Johnstown.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town
Council of the Borough of Johnstown, and it is hereby
ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. That Sherman Street in the Sixth Ward be,
and the same is hereby extended from the north side
of Overhark Street, its present southern terminus, south
to the Borough line, the eastern and western boundary
line of said Sherman Street as extended by this
ordinance to be a direct continuation or extension of said
line, as already established and opened.

Section 11. That all laws and ordinances of the Bur-
ough respecting streets and alleys be, and the
same are hereby extended to and over said Sherman
Street, as extended, as fully and to all intents and
purposes as they extend to and over the other streets
of the Borough.

21 as they may have been benefitted, over and
22 above all disadvantages; and the said viewers
23 shall make a report of their proceedings in
24 writing to the next session of said board, descri-
25 ing the properties upon which assessments have
26 been made, specifically stating whether for
27 contribution or for damages, with the amounts re-
28 spectively; and as in duty bound, your petitioner
