

Cambria County ss.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for
said County on the seventh day of April
A.D. 1887. Before the Honorable Judges of
said Court

The petition of Sundry Citizens of Carroll Township
in said County was presented representing that
a public road has been long since laid out and
partly opened viz from Maguines Mill (now Marks)
to a point on the state road from Cherry Tree to
Hollidayburg near Mills of Sebastian Syberts
in Carroll Township. A portion of said road has
become inconvenient and burthensome in con-
sequence of steep hills ravines and schools, and
praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view
vacate and supply said road.

The Court upon due consideration had of
the premises do order and appoint Henry Scanlan
Jacob Kirkpatrick and Anthony Anna to view
the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied
who after having first given due and legal notice
of the time and place of meeting by printed or writ-
ten advertisements, and having been duly qual-
ified according to law to discharge the duties
of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed
to view the same and if all the said viewers view
the same and a majority of them agree that
there is occasion for said road to be vacated

and supplied, they shall proceed to vacate and supply the same, as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property.

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating and supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose land the road may pass releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which the same passes.

In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed, and also whether they judge said road necessary for a public or private road.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by Said Court do report
that after having due and timely notice by three written notices posted
in three public places in Carroll Township of time and place of the
meeting of Said Viewers And the Viewers did meet at Said time
and place and after all being first duly sworn according to law to
perform the duties of our appointment did view and locate the follow-
ing parts of Said road in our opinion being useless and inconvenient to
the public in consequence of low swampy ground it never being fully
opened for Public Travel or use as a highway viz Beginning at a Point
on Said road at a Post on farm of John Ott in Carroll Township thence
North twenty three degrees East fourteen perches thence North fifty one and one half
degrees East fourteen perches thence North fifty five degrees East thirteen perches thence
North fifty four degrees East thirteen perches thence North eighteen degrees East six-
teen perches thence North twenty one degrees East twelve perches thence North
thirty eight degrees East six perches thence North thirty nine degrees East seven perches
thence North thirteen and one half degrees West sixteen perches thence North twenty
eight West thirteen perches thence North thirty eight degrees East twenty eight
perches thence North seventy degrees East six perches to a Point in public road
leading from Marks Mills to Harts Sleeping place And we do supply
Said parts of Said road located as follows viz Beginning at a Post
on farm of John Ott in Carroll Township thence North fifty degrees East
fifteen perches Post thence South fifty eight and one half degrees East sixty
nine perches Post thence South sixty two and one half degrees East forty

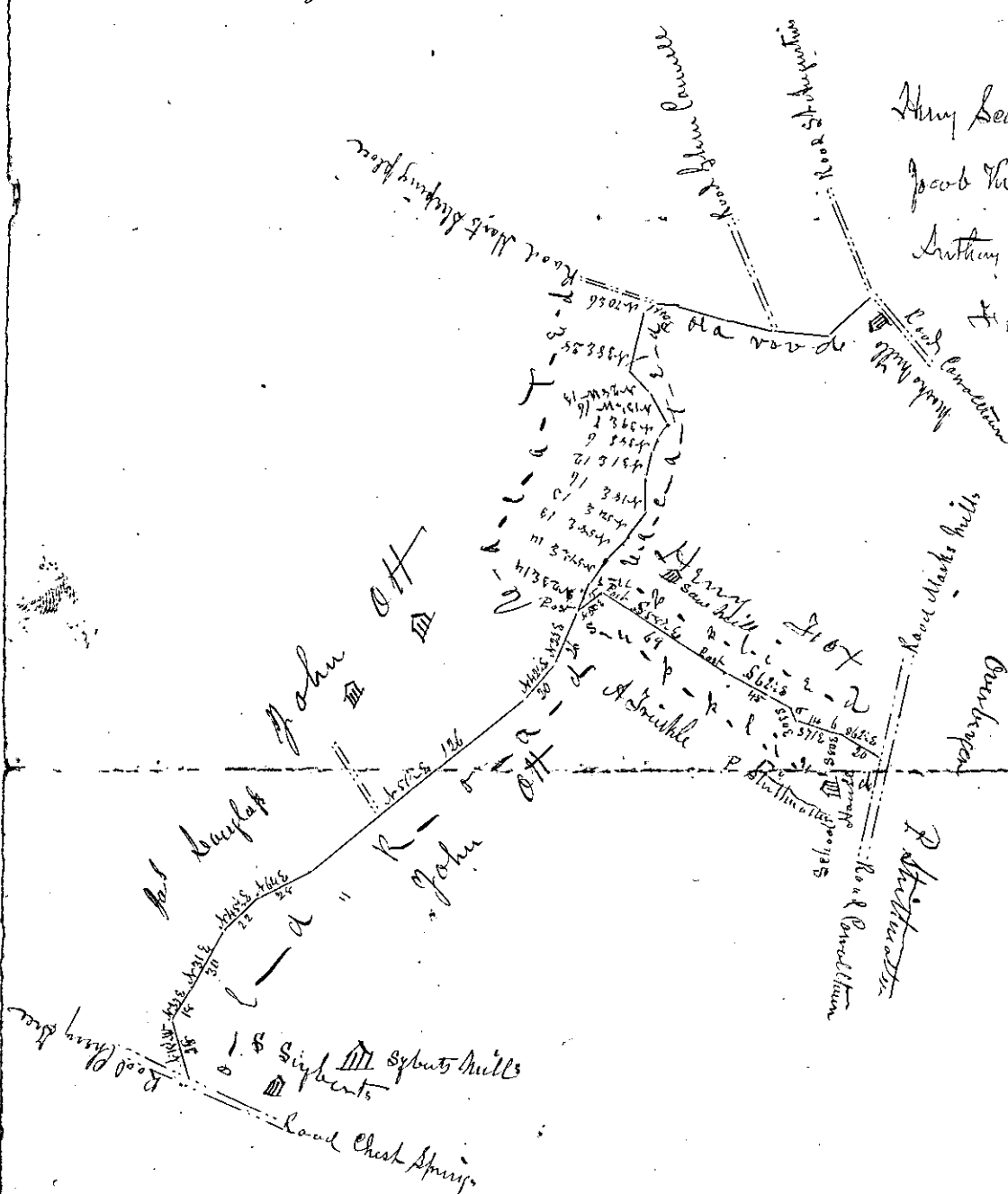

To the Honorable the judges within named

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within order of Court to review the road therein mentioned respectfully report. That after having given due notice of the said review by three written advertisements we met at the time and place appointed and after all being first duly sworn according to Law proceeded to perform the duties of our appointment. And in viewing the premises we found the Courses and distances generally correct as laid on the accompanying draft by ~~the~~ former viewers. We hereby vacate that part vacated by the said review for the same reasons as stated in their foregoing report.

We deem the part supplied necessary for a road. But on account of the very small number of people that can be accommodated by the said road we are of opinion that the same should be a private and not a public road. And in case our duty herein extends to the old part of said road not vacated and leading from the western end of the part supplied to a point near Sibut's Mill. Then we would say that that part also, and for the same reason as the supplied part ought to be a private road. We further report that the owners of land on and along the said road were nearly all present at the review and no damages were claimed by any of them by reason of the said road passing through their lands.
