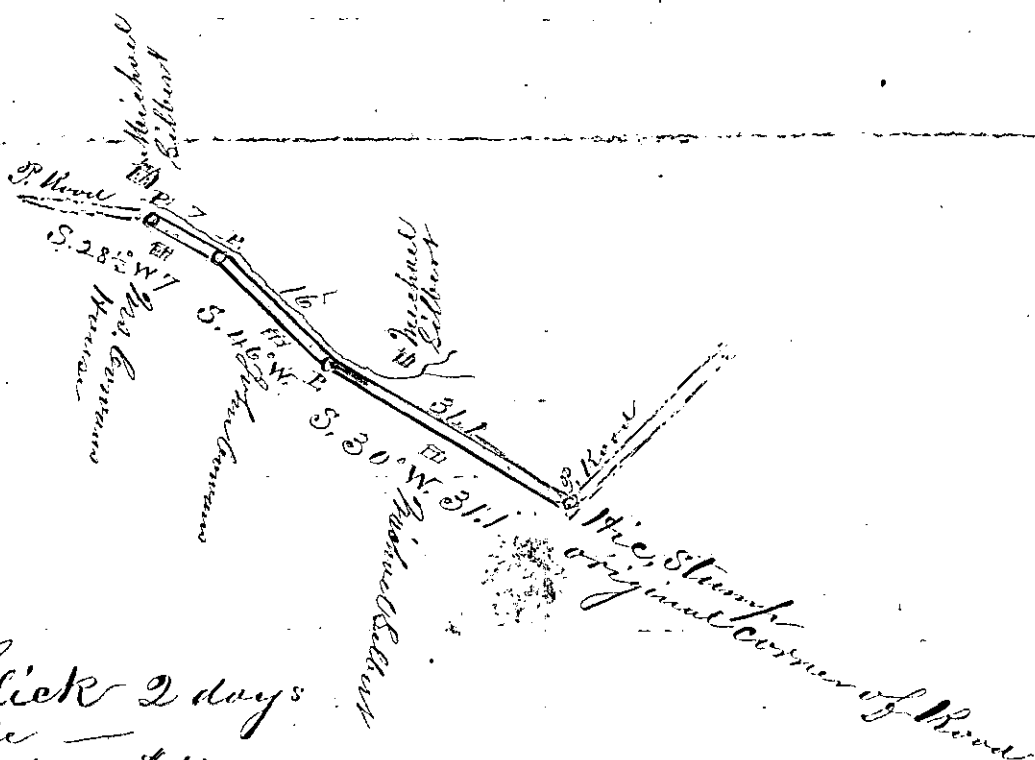


To the Honorable the Judges of the  
within named Court,

We the subscribers  
appointed by the within order of Court  
to view part of a road and change location  
of same, leading from Cambria Borough  
to New Germany or Dutchtown in  
Lower Goder Township, and after giving  
due notice of the time and place when  
we was to meet, And on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of <sup>fall</sup>  
November A.D., 1881 we met and after  
being duly sworn and affirmed we proceed-  
ed to view <sup>part</sup> that proposed of said road to be  
changed, And that we have changed  
the location of said road, and have laid  
out and do report a road for Public use  
according to the following course  
and distances, and to be thirty feet  
wide; A draft whereof is hereto an-  
nexed, Beginning at a post, in center  
of original road and a few perches South of one  
of Michael Silberts Houses then through lands  
of Michael Silberts and Mrs. Corwans South twenty  
eight & a half degrees west seven perches to a post, then  
by said Silberts & John Corwans land South forty six  
degrees west sixteen perches, to a post, then through  
Michael Silberts land South thirty degrees west


thirty one and one tenth perches to Hickory  
 stump an original corner of road  
 thence by original Road &c,  
 Witness our hand and seals  
 this day and year first above  
 written



At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County, on Wednesday the second day of November A.D. 1881 before the Honorable Judges of said Court: The petition of sundry citizens of Lower Yoder Township in said County was presented, representing, that they are laboring under great inconvenience by reason of the width and grade of the Public Road leading from Cambria Borough to New Germany or Dutchtown in said township, and that it would be more convenient and better for the public, that about six hundred feet of the same be changed by grading and widening, from a point commencing at Lower House of Michael Gilbert and ending at Upper House of said Michael Gilbert, and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view said road and ground proposed for the said change and make report of their proceedings according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises did order and appoint William Slick, Stephen Stutzman and Cornelius Marsh to view the ground proposed for said change of road, who after having first been duly sworn or affirmed according to law shall proceed to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity, and if all of them view the same, and a majority of them agree that said change of road is necessary, they shall proceed to make such change having respect to the best ground and to do the least injury to private property. The parties interested in said road having previously given notice by written or printed advertisements of the time and place where such viewers shall meet at least ten days before said meeting. If the viewers shall decide in favor of changing said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands said road may pass releases from any damages

that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims for said damages, the said Viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the Viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases, and the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same passes, in which report they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law also; whether they judge the said road necessary for a public or private road
