

Cassia County ss:

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace
held at Elensburg, in and for said County, on the fourth
day of December A. D. 1882 before the Honorable Judges
of said Court. The petition of sundry Citizens of Jackson
Township in said County was presented, representing, that
a road has been lately laid out by order of Court from a point on the
road from A. St. Rathbun's to Fairview, near the residence of William Gillan,
to a point on the road leading from Martin Minidaya's to Johnson, near
the residence of Joseph Coughlin in Jackson Township, which road if
confirmed by the Court, will be very injurious to said petitioners and
burdensome to the inhabitants of the Township through which the same
will pass, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to
review the said road and parts adjacent, and make report thereof
according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises
appointed Henry Scamman, Michael Carr and James M. Seiger as
Reviewers; who after having been duly sworn or affirmed according to law,
to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, are to go upon the
premises and Review said road and parts adjacent, and make report of
their proceedings hereon to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said
County. The said Viewers are to give due and legal notice by printed or
written advertisements of the time and place where they intend meeting for
the purpose aforesaid. And further should any changes be agreed upon by
a majority of said Viewers, in said road as formerly laid out, it will
be their duty to obtain releases from the owners of lands through which
said road as changed may pass for damages, and should any of said
owners of lands refuse to give releases for damages, if any, it will be the duty of
said Viewers to assess damages, if any, to such owners of lands, and transmit the
same with their proceedings hereon and further report whether they judge said road
as laid out for Public or Private use, and furnish a draft of said road with
report, improvements through which the same passes, and state also, that they
had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

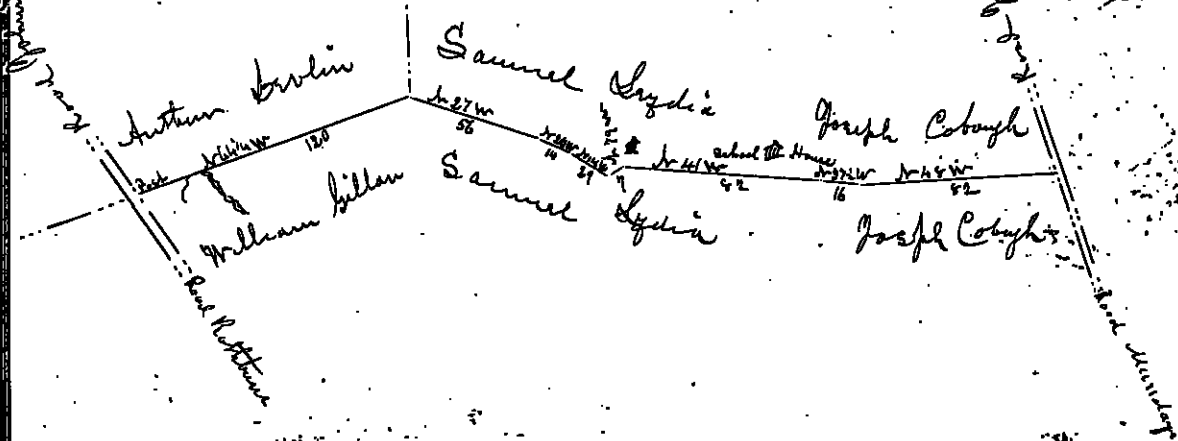

given due and timely notice of time and place of the
meeting of the reviewers by four written advertisements
pasted up in four most public places to said
road in Jackson Township one of said notices be-
ing hereto annexed and we do further report
that having met agreeably to said notice and after
being all affirmed and sworn as directed according
to law did review said road Beginning at point
where line of land of William Gillan and Arthur Brodie
Crosses Township road leading from Rothmans to Joun-
son thence by said line of land North fifty four and
one fourth degrees West one hundred and twenty perches to
point on Samuel Byrnes line thence North twenty seven
degrees West fifty six perches by private road and contin-
uing by said private road North twenty degrees West
fourteen perches still by same road North fourteen
degrees West twenty nine perches continuing by same
road North twenty nine degrees West seven

perches three North forty one degrees West Eighty two
 perches three North thirty seven and one half degrees
 West fifteen perches three North forty eight degrees
 West Eighty two perches to point on public road leading
 from Martin Murrays to Johnston which road
 if confirmed will be injurious useless burdensome
 and inconvenient to the inhabitants the part of said
 road which will be very expensive to open in consequence
 of several three expensive bridges and road as
 laid out exceeds five degrees elevation and to put
 said road on grade will injure private property
 more than the road would be useful and in
 our opinion is not necessary for public travel and
 should not be confirmed
