

Camden County N.J.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the
Peace held at Elmsburg in and for the County of
Camden on the eighth day of August A.D. 1882
before the Honorable Judge of the said Court the pre-
tition of sundry citizens of Susquehanna Township in
said County was presented setting forth That viewers appointed by
the said Court, reported on 29 March 1882 that they had laid out
and returned for public use the following road viz: Beginning from a
point on the Indiana & Camden County line, at or near head of
Mary Ann Boring to intersect a Township road leading from
St. Nicholas to Gamman's Mill on land of H. H. McCutchen Sus-
quehanna Township, that said road is burdensome if opened
to the citizens through whose land the same is laid out, and will
be expensive to the Township to open, and pay the damages, and
will be inconvenient to the persons using the same, and pray-
ing the Court to appoint proper persons to review the said road
and the ground proposed therefor and make report according to law

The Court upon due consideration of the premises appointed
Augustine McConnell, John Wilbur & Joseph Stricklin reviewers
who after having first given due and legal notice of the time and
place of meeting and having been duly qualified according to law
to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity are to
go upon the premises and review said road and should they
make any changes in the location of said road it will be the
duty of said reviewers to obtain releases ^{for damages} from the owners of lands
through which they locate the said road and in every case when
the owners refuse releasing their claims for damages the said
reviewers shall assess the damages, if any, that may accrue
to the said owners from the opening of said road and make re-
port thereof signed by a majority of the reviewers present and
transmit said report together with all releases to be filed

To the Honorable the judges within named

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within order of Court to review the road therein mentioned respectfully report; That having been present on the ground proposed for said road, and having all been first severally sworn in pursuance of said order we did review the same and have laid out and do return the following road viz: Beginning at a white oak on the line of Indiana County in a valley known as "Keith's Hollow" Thence through improved land of Sarah Kirlincy South 30 degrees East 72 perches, thence South 59 degrees East 64 perches, Thence through unimproved land of James Anderson. South 87½ degrees East 36 perches thence South 48 degrees East 24 perches thence South 68 degrees East 20 perches, thence South 40 degrees East 46 perches to a public road within 40 perches of its intersection of the public road from Nicktown to Garman's Mills. A draft whereof is hereto annexed. Which road we are opinion is necessary for a public road. The land owners along said road have refused to release it of damages; But the reviewers believing that the road will be a benefit to each of them have assessed no damages. The said land owners were duly notified of the review.
