

Cambria County, Pa.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace, held at Ebensburg, in and for
said County, on the sixth day of March
A. D. 1882, before the Honorable Judges of said
Court: The petition of sundry Citizens of
said County was presented, setting forth, that they labor under
great inconvenience for want of a Public Road or Highway,
"to lead from a point on the Indiana County line, where the
Blacklick Furnace road ends, to where the Old State Road
intersects the Pringle Road near William Shumanns in
Jackson Township in said County" and therefore praying
the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out
the same according to law: The Court upon due consideration
had of the premises, do order and appoint S. W. Miller,
Henry Rager and J. R. Davis to view the ground proposed
for said road; who after having first given due and legal
notice by printed or written advertisements of the time and place
of meeting, and having been first been duly qualified according to
law, to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall
proceed to view the same, and if all of the said viewers view
the same; and a majority of them agree that there is occasion
for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably
to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the
best ground and the shortest distance, and in such a manner
as to do the least injury to private property. If the viewers aforesaid
shall decide in favor of locating said road, it is hereby made
their duty, to obtain from persons through whose lands the
road may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to
them from opening the same, and in every case, where
the owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims for
damages, the said viewers shall apportion the damages (if any)

and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and transmit the same, together with all releases, to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which the same passes; and in which report they shall state distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law, and further, whether they judge said road necessary for Public or Private use.

given by written advertisements of the time and place where
they would meet for the purpose of discharging their duty
according to law. And that having been first severally
been sworn or affirmed in the manner and form prescribed
by said order: all of said viewers to wit S. H. Miller, Henry
Rager and J. R. Davis meet at the time and place
advertised, and having viewed the ground for the proposed
road all of us concurring and agreeing that the same
is necessary for Public use did lay out, and now
return the same for a Public road Beginning at
the Indiana County line in Beards lane thence South
Eighty five and a half degrees East seven paches to end of lane
South Thirteen degrees East sixteen and a half rods to a post
in old Road South thirty five degrees East eight rods in old road
South forty eight and a half degrees East Eighteen rods. South Seventy
three degrees East ten rods North Eighty and three fourth degrees East
ten rods. North seventy and a half degrees East seventeen rods Post
North Eighty nine and one half degrees East Eleven rods to Stone North
fifty nine and one half degrees East twenty rods to a stump North
sixty seven and one half degrees East thirteen rods to a post North
