

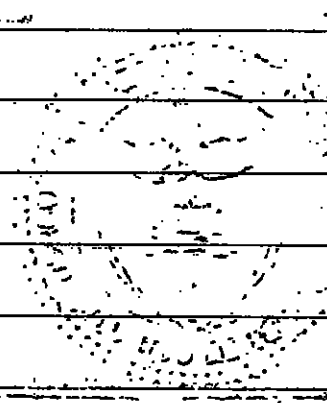

To the Honorable the Judges of the
Court of Quarter Sessions of the
Peace in and for the County of
Cambria. State of Pennsylvania.

We the undersigned, persons appointed
by your Honor, to review the road
mentioned in the annexed order, do
report, that having been sworn ac-
cording to law, and due notice
of the time and place of meeting hav-
ing been given.

We met at the appointed time and
place and proceeded to perform the
duties of said appointment. Starting
at Martin Markins we ran the following

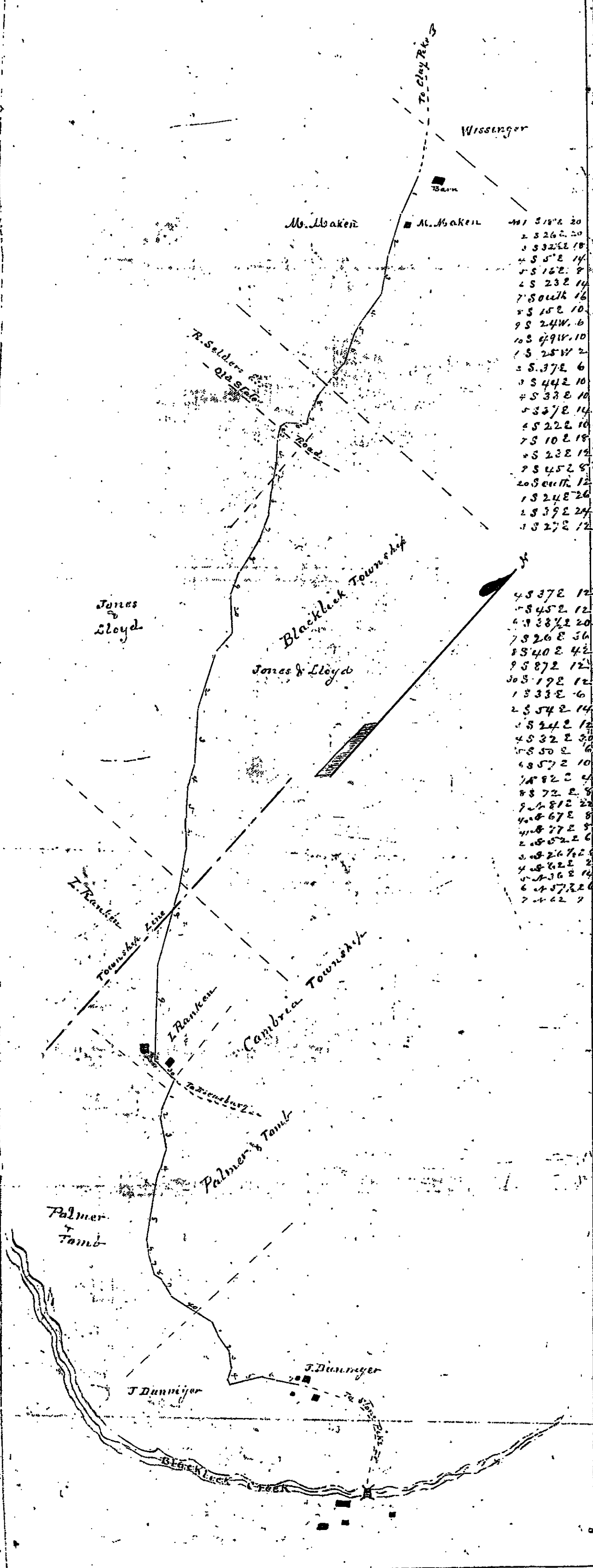

That parts of two public roads long since laid out in said townships, have become useless, inconvenient, and burdensome to the inhabitants of said townships; the one of them leading from the house of John Cunningham in Cambria township to the Blacklick township line on land of Lewis Rankin; and the other leading from Martin Makins' barn in Blacklick township to the house of Joseph Dummore in Cambria township.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray your Honors that the parts of said roads as above described, may be vacated according to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

At a Court of General Quarter Session
of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and
for said County on the twentieth day
of July A. D. 1883 before the Honorable
Judges of the said Court

The petition of sundry citizens of Cambria & Blacklick
townships in said County was presented setting forth
that parts of two public roads long since laid out
in said townships have become useless inconve-
nient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said
townships, one of them leading from the house of
John Cunningham in Cambria township to the
Blacklick township line on land of Lewis Rankin;
and the other leading from Martin Makin's barn
in Blacklick township to the house of Joseph
Dumaine in Cambria township and praying
the said Court that the parts of said roads as
above described might be vacated according to the
Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided.

The Court upon due consideration had of the
premises do order and appoint Henry Scanlan
Samuel Reed and Edward Cavers to view the said
roads who after first having given due and legal
notice of the time and place of meeting by printed
or written advertisements, and having been duly quali-
fied according to law to discharge the duties of their
appointment with fidelity shall proceed to view the
said roads and, if a majority of the said viewers
agree that said roads or either of them have become
useless inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabi-
tants of the said townships and the public in

general they shall proceed to vacate one or both of them as prayed for and make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County accompanying the same with a plot or draft of the road or roads they shall vacate with reference to the improvements through which the same pass - in which report they shall state that they had been sworn or affirmed.

We the undersigned Viewers
do report that having gave due and timely notice of time and place
of the meeting of the Viewers by six printed and written notices posted
up in six most public places in Townships of Cambria and Blochlick,

Also we have

viewed and vacated the following parts of Road leading
from John Cunningshams residence in Cambria Township to Block-
lick Township line Beginning at a Point where ^{Road} from Joseph Hummer
to Martin Mokins crosses State road from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh
thence by said State road 1 North seventy eight degrees East sixteen per-
ches 2 North sixty eight and one half degrees East twenty perches 3 North

seventy and one half degrees East twenty perches 4 North Eighty
 degrees East Sixteen perches 5 South Eighty two degrees East twenty
 eight perches 6 South Seventy six degrees East thirty perches 7 South
 fifty seven degrees East six perches 8 South Seventy seven degrees East ten per
 ches to Point in Indiana and Ebersburg road the last described State
 road from appearance has been abandoned for years as it fell with
 timber so as to be altogether impossible thence by said Indiana and
 Ebersburg Road 9 South forty eight degrees East twenty perches 10 South
 thirty three degrees East eight perches 1 South twenty eight degrees East
 ten perches 2 South forty two degrees East twelve perches 3 South
 thirty seven degrees East four perches 4 South forty six degrees East twenty
 eight perches 5 South Sixty degrees East six perches 6 South forty five
 degrees East thirty eight perches 7 South forty degrees East forty perches
 8 South forty eight degrees East ten perches to Point at residence of John
 Cunningham in Cambria Township which said last State road as well
 the courses and distances just described should be located in our opi
 nion being in consequence of swampy hilly ground has become
 useless inconvenient and burdensome to the traveling public and
 citizens of Cambria & Blochly Township

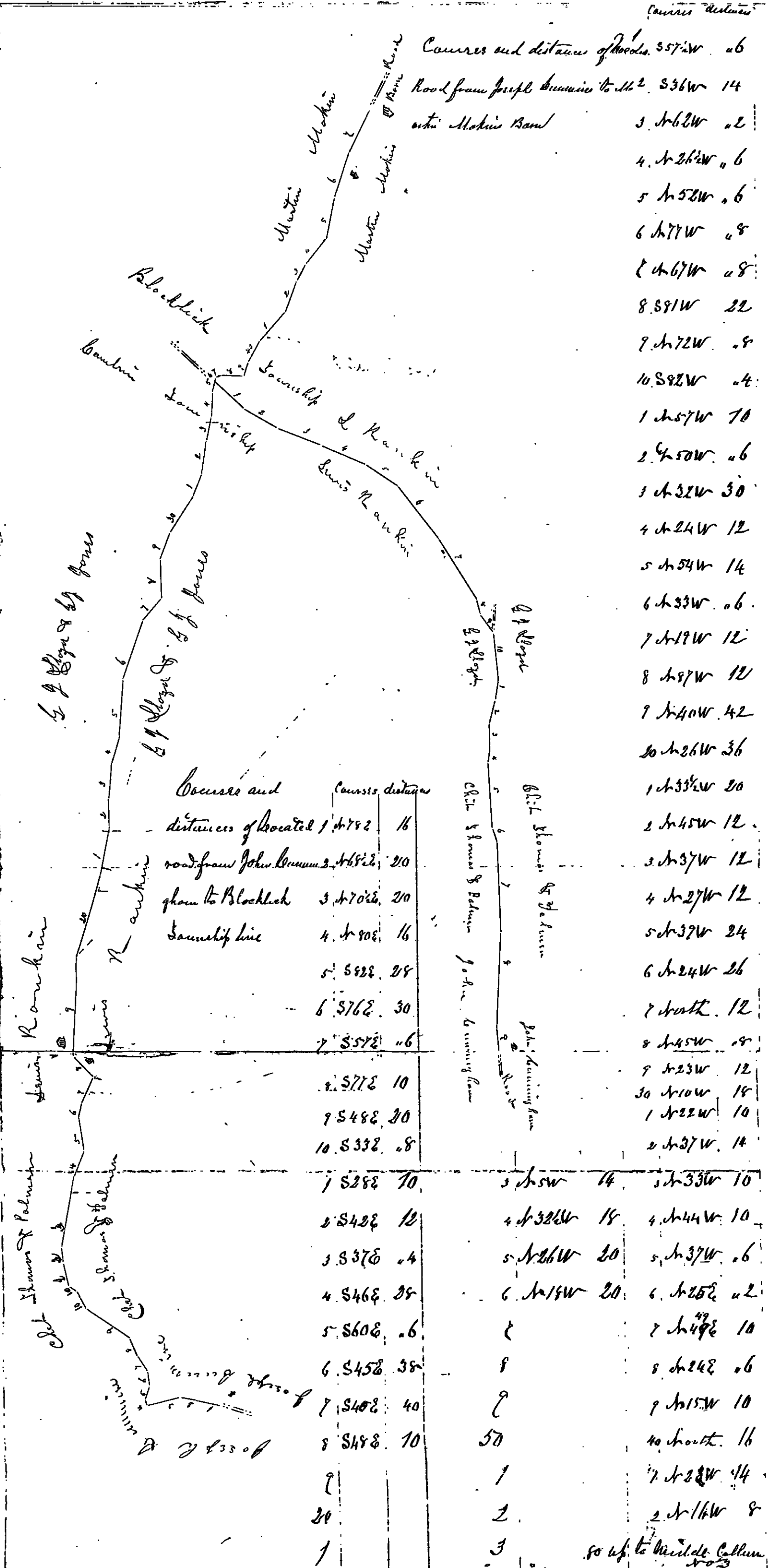
