

to Utahville, less hills and the distance is shorter. The public road with which the proposed road connects at Roseland School House leads to Walter's and Smith - east, or nearly so, to Glasgow. It would be about two miles, or two miles and a quarter from Roseland School House, along the proposed road to the Utahville road down to Utahville. It is about two miles from the point where the proposed road begins near the Roseland School House to Glasgow. ~~I~~ I don't know that there is a great deal of difference from Glas-  
-gow to Utahville by the present road and the proposed road. The proposed road is laid on good ground and good grade. It would be between a half and three quarters of a mile from my place to Roseland School House. I have no other roads to get out from my place. I have no road to get to mill, school or any-  
-thing of the kind. This road connects the Utah-  
-ville road at Young Evolry about a mile from Utahville. It is three quarters of a mile if not more from Evolry to John Dillon. The draft  
is not altogether correct. The distance from Roseland to Young Evolry is in my judgment about the same as the distance from Flynn's dam to Hill's bridge, while from the draft the distance would seem to be greater from Roseland to Evolry than from Flynn's  
dam to Hill's bridge.

Leave Ex. by Mr. Read:

I live about eighty or a hundred rods off of the proposed road, but direct from my place to the County line it is about eight

On the matter of Report of viewers to lay out a road from near the Roseland School House in Rude's Twp. to a point on the Clearfield County line, near the residence of Joseph Trostel.

Deposition of witness taken before Alvin Evans, a Notary Public in and for the County of Cambria, at his office in the borough of Ebensburg, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of August, A. D., 1882, by virtue of the annexed sub, and in accordance with the annexed notice, in the part of the Petitioners.

Ann Yunkin, sworn:

I was one of the viewers on this road. The road I viewed terminates at the County line in Cambria County. It connects with a road laid out at the County line with a road laid out in Clearfield County.

(Mr. Rude objects that the survey and confirmation and proceedings to lay out a public road in Clearfield County can be proven only by a copy of the record, and not by parol.)

The length of the road in Cambria County is something less than three quarter of a mile. I suppose a hundred dollar would open the road. I believe the road necessary. There would be a good many benefited by the opening of this road, there would be John Healler, John Kuhn, Geo. B. Richardson, Geo. H. Bowman, and other parties would be benefited - the big end of the township and a great part to Glen Connell; it is a better road

rod. The road does not go through my land but runs between me and the Clark land. It runs through cleared land between myself and Clark for about fifteen rod and then runs down through Clark's cleared ground and passes then through Geo. H. Bowman's land. From where the proposed road leaves the line between myself and Clark, going towards the County line, it passes through Clark's land. The line of the road as it passes between Salathin and my land passes through about ten rods not cleared, besides the distance I have mentioned through cleared land. I am the only person, at present, living along the line of the proposed road from Roseland to the County line. Joseph Toopell and his son live in the line of the road from Henry Everly to the County line. The son lives between his father and Everly. I suppose Joseph Toopell lives about fifty rod from the line of the proposed road. The two-thirds of the road from Everly to the County line is opened. That road was opened by Mr. Toopell - Joseph Toopell. The parties of whom I speak, as being benefited by the proposed road, live between Roseland and Glynn's claim, excepting Geo. H. Bowman.

Question: Do not John Richards, John Kuhn, Geo. B. Richards and Geo. H. Bowman and other parties above that towards Glasgow, in going to Muherville go by way of the Fallen Timber road or by way of the road from Glasgow to Muherville?

Answer: They can't better themselves - In so doing they are going right away from Muherville and have to get in there other roads to get back

Question: Is not the draft, submitted by the communists, substantially correct or exhibited from Roseland School House to Flynn's dam?

Answer: I think <sup>that</sup> part is about as near correct as could be made. John Richards live about a half mile or more from the Fullen Timber road. It is about two miles from Roseland School House to Flynn's dam. It is fully two miles from Roseland School House to the cross-roads near Glasgow. It is about a mile and a half from Flynn's dam to Hill bridge - it may not be quite so much. It is about two miles from Hill bridge to Henry Everly, and from Hill bridge to Etahville it is about three miles. I couldn't tell <sup>the</sup> exact distance from Etahville to the cross-roads near Glasgow. The railroad runs from Glasgow to Etahville.

Re Ex by Mr. Johnstone

I have lived in that neighborhood for ten or eleven years. As I heard him, James S. Gallagher, say that that was the place the road ought to go. I understood him to refer to the road as laid out by the miners.

Re Ex by Mr. Reade

I did not hear all the discussion between Mr. Richards and Mr. Gallagher. I did not hear either Mr. Gallagher or Mr. Richards name the road about which they were conversing. Mr. Gallagher stated that the School House should be moved. There was some talk about a road from Flynn's dam to Roseland cutting in the both sides of the run.

The new school house to which I refer, is up towards Bonanza and on the road to Roseland. Mr. Gallagher may have referred to the other road of which there had been some talk about, ~~six~~<sup>time</sup> ago, or even two or three years ago they had a petition out; but there was nothing done. I made no road through my own land to claim out, I could not do it on account of the hills. There is <sup>an</sup> old timber road up from Flynn's dam which I used in the winter time. I have one hundred and twenty acres of land.

## Aaron Youngkin

George B. Richards, affirmed:

I live about a quarter of a mile from Roseland. I had a conversation with James Gallagher to-day in relation to the proposed road; I asked him "Mr. Gallagher what is your opinion in regard to this new road laid out by Mr. Youngkin and Mr. Troppel" he stated "that's where the road ought to be". I know the location of the road. I believe it to be necessary. I have heard Aaron Youngkin give all his testimony just now. I believe that I agree with him so far as know in regard to the road.

Cross Examined by Mr. Read:

Mr. Gallagher, in the conversation I had with <sup>him</sup> to-day, spoke about the school house up East of John Kuhn; he said that school house ought to be built down about Flynn's bridge. I don't recollection of having

any other conversation with Mr. Gallagher, at the time he spoke about the road, excepting bidding him the time of day. Well, I believe I spoke to him and asked him what his opinion was in regard to the new road out-a place called "Yunkin & Trofelli" and he stated "that's where the road ought to be". Mr. Gallagher may have understood me as speaking of the other road from Flynn's dam to the new school house. I believe there was some talk, a few years ago, about a road from Flynn's dam up to the school house. I live on the road between Roseland and Flynn's dam. From where I live to Flynn's dam it is about a mile and a half. It is about two miles and a quarter from my place to the cross road near Glasgow. I make it about three miles and three quarters from Flynn's dam to the cross road.

Geo B Richards

Joseph Trofelli, affirmed:

I live in Beccaria ~~town~~<sup>line</sup>, in Clearfield County. I was present at a conversation between Mr. Gallagher and Mr. Richards. Mr. Richards asked Mr. Gallagher what he thought of the road leading past Aaron Yunkin and Joseph Trofelli and he said "it was in the place the road ought to be" - it was in the right place. I was one of the viewers on the road from the Cumbria County line to the Shirkville road. Then we viewed the road from the Shirkville to the Cumbria County <sup>line</sup>; the Cumbria County <sup>road</sup> had not then been view-

ed, but the Cambria County road now intersects the road we laid out from the Etahville road to the County line. I have heard the testimony of Aaron Yunkin.

(Mr Rinde objects that the fact of location of a public road laid out by order of court cannot be proved by parol testimony - the objection relates to that portion of road in Clemfield County.)

I believe the testimony of Mr Yunkin, throughout, to be correct. I believe the road to be necessary.

Answered by Mr Rinde:

The road from ~~what~~ Roseland to Hatten Mill has been opened out more than thirty years ago. Hatten has a saw mill and brick mill there - they have been there a long time. The people from Roseland go down that way to the mills. It would be easier to go from Roseland down the present road to Hatten Mill than by taking the proposed road to Henry Everly's and from Everly down to the mills.

Question: Then you testify that Mr Gallagher said that the road across from Roseland, <sup>past Plum Spring and Joseph Tappell's</sup> to the Etahville road at Everly, was where it might <sup>have</sup> been put in the first place, did you understand him to refer to the road from Roseland to Hatten Mill, if not to the road, to what other road did you understand him to refer?

Answer: I understood him to refer to the road from Roseland past Aaron Yunkin and my place to Everly on the Etahville road. Mr Gallagher said after his conversation with Richard that the school house ought not to have been moved, but

when moved should have been placed down by Flynn bridge. The road in Clearfield County runs through my property. It was this last Spring that the road in Clearfield County was laid out. The supervisor has not worked any on this road in Clearfield County. This road cuts off about three acres of my land and then runs along the line between Sam Leyanty and myself. There are no further opposing the road in our County so far as I know. The road has been confirmed, so I understand. I was along with the supervisor a while on the Cambria County side. I don't own any land in Cambria County.

Joe Troppel

Rev. B. Richards, recalled:

In speaking of it being two miles and a quarter to cross road I supposed the course referred to road at property of Glasgow him, but to the cross road near Daniel Mathew would be about two miles and three quarters.
