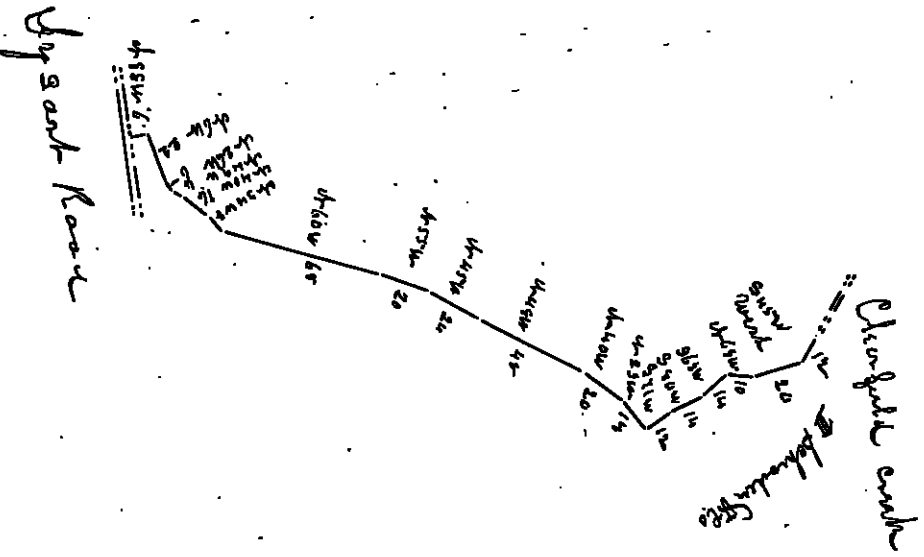

to Buckhorn thence by said road to be located North Eighty
Eight degrees West six perches by same North Six degrees West
Twenty two perches by same North twenty six degrees West six perches
by same North forty nine degrees West six perches by same
North forty degrees West sixteen perches by same North thirty four
degrees West eight perches by same North sixty degrees West
sixty eight perches North fifty five degrees West twenty perches
by same North forty five degrees West twenty four perches by
same North forty eight degrees West forty eight perches by same North
forty degrees West twenty perches by same North twenty three degrees

West fourteen perches by same South Seventy one degrees
West Twelve perches by same South Eighty degrees West four
teen perches by same South Sixty three degrees West fourteen
perches North Sixty Eight degrees West ten perches by same
West twenty perches three South forty five degrees West
twelve perches to point in said road upon Clearfield
Creek on land Schroeder & Co all of said located
