

Cambria County, Pa.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg, in and for said County, on the third day of September A.D. 1883, before the Honorable Judges of said Court. The petition of sundry Citizens of ~~said County~~ ~~was presented~~, representing that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a public road, beginning at the Fairfield road at or near Alex. Mackhousen and running through Morrellville, terminating at the Laurel Hill Road at or near Mr. Thomas, in said County, and therefore praying the Court to appoint suitable persons to view the ground proposed and lay out said road. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed William Hick, J. C. Sheidow and Isaac Patch, to view the ground proposed for said road, who after having first given due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting by printed or written advertisements, and having been duly qualified according to law, to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for such road, and the shortest distance, and in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property. If the viewers shall decide in favor of locating said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from those persons through whose lands said road may pass, releases for any damages that may accrue to them by opening the same; and in every case, where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and transmit the

same, together with all releases, to be filed with the papers relating to said road, and the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, together with a plot or drafts thereof, the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which said road passes, and whether they judge the same necessary for Public or Private use; and in which report they shall state distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

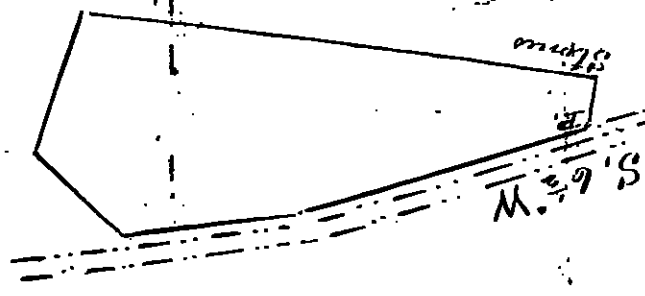
## Road Viewers Notice

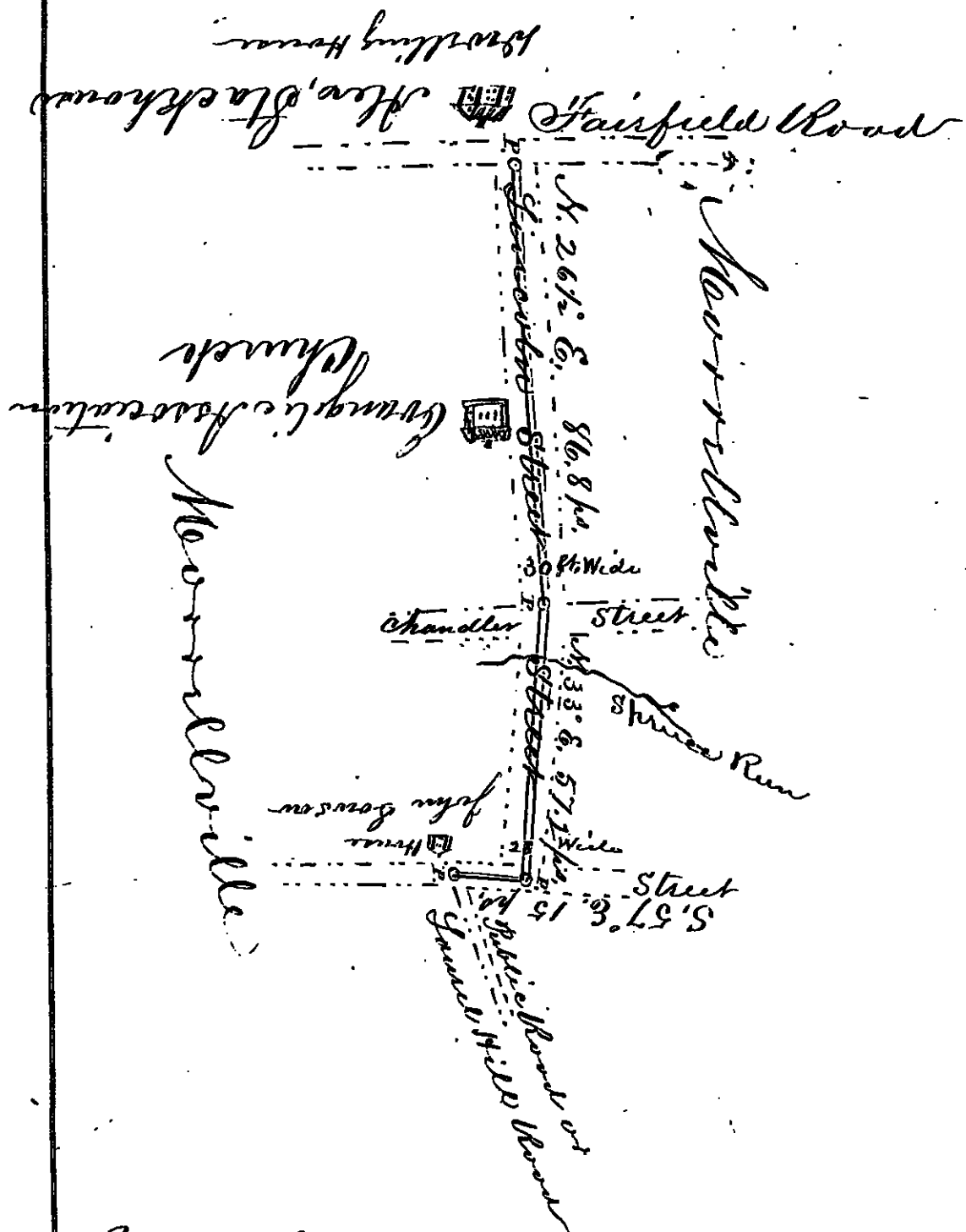
