of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and
for said County, on Monday the fourth
day of September A. D. 1882 before the
Honorable Judges of said Court: The petition
of Edward Owens of said County was presented, representing
that he labors under great inconvenience for want of a
Private Road, "to lead from the public road at or near
Thomas Griffiths Saw Mill in Cambria Township, and
running to the saw mill of said petitioner in said Township
and County" and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper
persons to view and lay out the same according to law.
The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed
Viewers to view the ground proposed for said road; who
did report a certain road in pursuance of said appoint-
ment, to the Judges of said Court on the third day of
January A. D. 1883 at which said time the said road
was confirmed *visi* and ordered to be opened &c. and
Whereas, on the said third day of January A. D. 1883
Exceptions having been filed to the report of said Viewers,
the same was continued from time to time, until the
thirteenth day of November A. D. 1883 at which time
the Honorable Judges of said Court ordered a Review
of the premises and parts adjacent and appointed
William H. Sechler, William M. Jones and James G.
Hafson as Reviewers, to view the premises aforesaid,
who, after giving due and legal notice of the time and
place of meeting by written or printed advertisements,
and, having been duly qualified according to law,
shall proceed to view the same, and if all of the said
Reviewers view the same, and a majority of them

agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for said road, and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property. If the Reviewers aforesaid decide in favor of locating said road; it is thereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose lands said road may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case, where the owners of such lands, refuse releasing their claims for damages, said Reviewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof, signed by a majority of the Reviewers present, and transmit the same, together with all releases, to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said Reviewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, together with a plot or draft thereof, the courses and distances, and references to the impassments through which said road may pass, and, whether necessary for Public or Private use, and state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

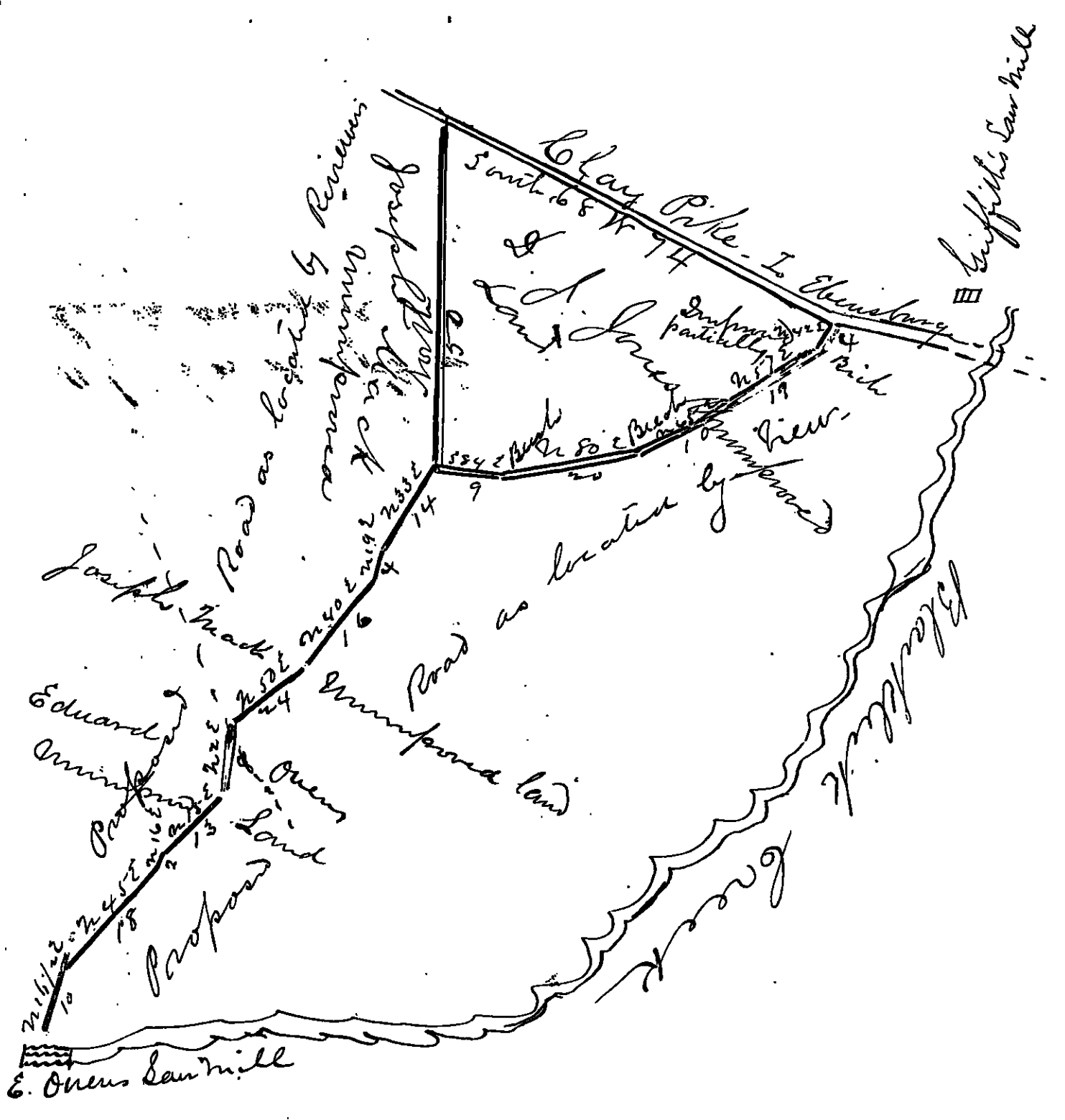
We the undersigned persons

on Wednesday February 27th 1884 for the pur-

their appointment and having been
first duly sworn they viewed the ground
over which the proposed road is to pass,
first examining the road laid out by the
view, see Report filed Dec 4th 1882, and adopted

The road from the Saw Mill to Mack's land being all through the unimproved land of Eduard Owen, thence thro' Joseph Mack's land, unimproved, north fifty degrees East twenty four perches, thence north forty degrees East sixteen perches, thence North nineteen degrees East nine perches, thence North thirteen degrees East fourteen perches to line of land of S. J. Jones, thence on unimproved land of said S. J. Jones and by the line dividing lands of Joseph Mack and said Jones. North fifty perches to the Clay Pike, a public road leading to Ebenburg. And the road so laid out we do return for private use being of the opinion that it necessary for a private. And further we are of the opinion that no damage is done to the land of S. J. Jones as the road is located by the Review and therefore decline to award or assess him any damages. Eduard Owen, petitioner, and S. J. Jones were both present at the view.

In the Court of Quarter Session of Lumbria County

Exceptions to the report of viewers to lay out a private road in Lumbria Township from ^{the} saw mill of Edward Owen to a point on a public road known as the Relay Pike.

1st, That the proposed private road is not necessary, as there is a road from the saw mill of Edward Owen to the public road on which the private road reported by the viewers terminates, which has been in use for more than thirty years.

2nd, That the report of the viewers is defective, in this, that it alleges that the private road runs through the land of David J. Jones, when, in fact, it runs through land belonging to Eleanor Jones.

3rd, That there are now, running through the land of said Eleanor Jones, two roads, and the opening of the proposed private road would result in much greater injury and damage to her property than the amount assessed by the viewers.

4th, That, if the road should be opened as now laid out, it would cut off the entire water supply from that portion of her (Mrs. Jones) land lying north of the proposed road.

5th, If a private road is necessary for the convenience of said Edward Owen, on that side of the creek where the road is laid out by the viewers, it should not run through the land of the said Eleanor Jones, but should run along the line between her land and the land of Joseph Mack; and in

locating the road in this line, the distance
from where it strikes said line to its ter-

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions held at Ebensburg in and for said County on the 12th day of September A. D. 1883 before the Hon. Judge of the said Court: The petition of the Commissioners of Cambria County was presented representing that a Bridge over the Clearfield Creek on the road from St. Augustine to Altoona between Clearfield and Deam townships was necessary and that it would be too expensive for the townships of Clearfield and Deam to erect said bridge, and the same having been entered of record, said petitioners procured an estimate to be made as nearly as might be of the expenses of the same amounting to \$557.⁰⁰ and did proceed to have the said bridge erected by entering into contract with Henry Campbell for the building of the same, by which contract the County of Cambria is to bear one-half the expenses of erecting said bridge and the townships of Deam and Clearfield to bear equally the other half and that the said bridge is now completed and therefore praying the Court to appoint six fit persons to inspect said bridge and the workmanship thereof agreeably to the act of Assembly; The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed Philip Cooper, William J. Adams, James M. Gough, Wm. C. Krissel, John Dougherty, and Dennis Cawley as inspectors aforesaid, who after having been duly sworn or affirmed according to law to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity, and to view the premises aforesaid, and make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County; in which report they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.
