next Court.

At a Court of General Quarter
Sessions of the Peace held at Chambersburg in and for the County of Cambria on the first day of October A.D. 1844, before the Honorable Judges of said Court. The petition of many citizens of Conemaugh Township in said County was presented representing that they labor under great inconvenience on account of the grade of the public road leading from a point near Franklin Borough to a point near the farm of Dr. C. Emerson in Conemaugh Township; the grade being such that it cannot be used with safety and is not fit for hauling or driving on, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view, vacate, and supply the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration of the premises did order and appoint S. H. Miller, Benjamin Kist and Samuel Varner to view the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied who after giving due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting by printed or written advertisements and having been duly qualified according to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same and if a majority of them agree that there is occasion for said road to be vacated and supplied they shall proceed to vacate and supply the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground and the shortest distance and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property. If the viewers of said road shall decide in favor of vacating and supplying said

it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose land the supplied road may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the present, and transmit the same together with all releases to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County accompanying the same with a plat or draft of such part of said road vacated and supplied, the course and distances and reference to the improvements through which parts supplied may pass. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed and also whether they give the same for public or private use.

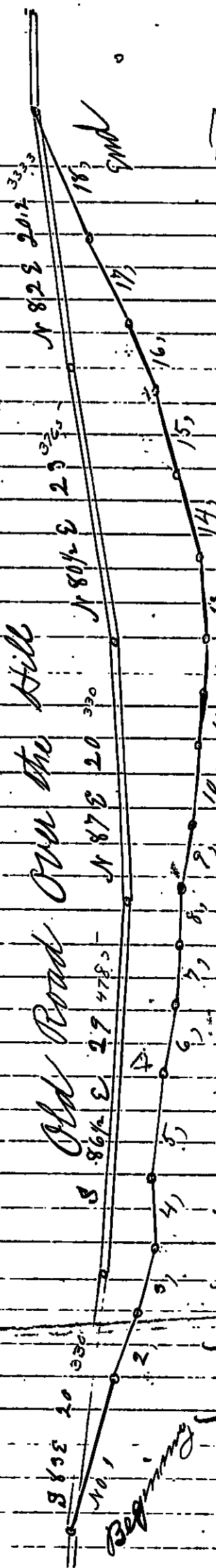
Whole length of

To the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions
of the Peace in the within or annexed Order named.

We the Subscribers the persons appointed by said Court
to view, vacate, change and Supply the Road therein
mentioned. Report that Public notice having been given
by written advertisements of the time and when they would
meet for the purpose of discharging their duties according
to law and that having been first Severally Sworn or Affirmed
in the manner and form prescribed by the said Order, That
all of said Viewers to wit: S. W. Miller, Benjamin East
and Samuel Wagner, met at the time and place
advertised and having viewed the ground proposed to be
vacated, changed and supplied, and all of us concurring
and agreeing that a change was absolutely necessary
and that the said Road so changed is necessary for
public use, did vacate and Supply and lay out
and now return the same for a public Road viz:
Beginning in the middle of the present Road Below the "Story
hill" thence South seventy four and three fourth degrees East
twelve rods to a stake thence South seventy one and one fourth
degrees East, five and two tenth rods to stake, thence South
seventy five degrees East, four and eight tenth rods to stake near
Hickory, thence North eighty eight degrees East five and three
tenth rods to a stake, thence South eighty four and one half degrees
East, seven and eight tenth rods to a stake, thence South eighty
one degrees East five and two tenth rods to a stake, thence South
eighty eight degrees East, four and a half rods to a stake, thence
South eighty nine and one half degrees East, four and one tenth rods
to stake, thence South eighty and one half degrees East, four and
seven tenth rods to stake, thence South eighty six and one fourth
degrees East, six and one tenth rods to stake, thence South eighty five
and three fourth degrees East, three and seven tenth poles to stake
thence South eighty eight degrees East, four and two tenth rods to stake
thence North eighty five and a half degrees East, six and one tenth
rods to stake, then North seventy four and one fourth degrees
East, six and four tenth rods to stake, then North seventy five
degrees East, six and one half rods to stake, thence North eighty
eight and one half degrees East, five and four tenth rods to
stake thence North sixty five degrees East, seven rods
to stake then North sixty four and one half degrees East
ten rods to the present Road, East of C. I. Co's field

And said Viewers further Report that they endeavored to obtain Release from the Passers through whose land said change is made.

And they further that they have considered the damages of the land of the C. I. Co. the only property through which said change passes and consider that they will sustain no damages and therefor assess none.

With Reference to the property and changes of old Road a plot or draft is hereto Annexed.
