

In the Quarter Sessions of Cambria County.
On the matter of the report of the viewers
vacating part of the Road from Sports-mill
road to the Fallen Timber road in Dean Township."

Ex ceptio to said report of Viewers:

1. st That the said view to vacate part, that is,
that portion of the road between Patrick Madden's
house and the Clearfield creek at Sewers' Bridge,
is erroneous and void because the said portion
reported to be vacated is about one half mile in
length, is a portion of the public road laid out
and confirmed absolutely, by this honorable Court
in the 9, December 1863, Road docket Vol. 3 p. 27 & 28,
entitled: "Order to open a Public Road leading from
the house of William Bergeon on the Philipsburg
road, to intersect the Altoona and Clearfield
Plank Road at or near the house of Aaron
Dougherty in Clearfield Township."

2. That the said report is void and illegal
because the same purports to vacate a small part of
the middle, or intermediate part of a public road,
thereby cutting off, and excluding the travel on that
portion of the said public road extending from the Bridge
across the Clearfield creek at Sewers' to the house
of Aaron Dougherty on the Altoona and Clearfield
Plank road, a distance of two miles and one fourth.

and like ^{well} cut off the travel on the other end of said public road extending from the Bridge at Beverset, across the Moleurfield, to the house of Philip Cooper, formerly William Burgoon, at the Philipsburg road, a distance of three miles.

3. That the said Report to vacate said portion of said Road, is erroneous and void for the reason, that said road is not useless, inconvenient and bothersome, but is of great use and convenience to the public in travelling to and from Altona, St. Augustine, Glen-bunnell, Carrolltown, Schest Springs, Lenette, and Chambersburg.
