At a Court of General Quarterly Sessions of the peace held in and for the County of Cambria at Ebensburg on Monday the second day of October AD 1818. Before Hon John Estes

President and John Murray and Philip Stoen Esq' appointed Judges of the same Court. Upon the Petition of sundry inhabitants of the Townships of Cambria and Carroll representing that a Road hath lately been laid out by an Order of Court, from a Point on the Publick Road leading from Ebensburg to William W Gittens about twenty paces south of the North Branch of Black Lick in Cambria Township to intersect the road leading from Ebensburg to Punxatawny at a near the house of William Gittens Jr which Road if confirmed by the Court will be very injurious to petitioners and burdensome to the inhabitants of the township through which the farm runs, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to review the said Road and parts adjacent and make report according to Law &c. Whereupon the Court upon due Consideration had of the premises do order and appoint John D Horne, Christian Buck, Jacob Luther, Dennis Bender James Pagan and John Flick to review the said Roads and if they or any five of them Review the same, Ande and any four of the actual Reviewers Agree that there is occasion for an alteration in the said Roads, they shall proceed to locate the same as agreeable to the wish of the petitioners as may be having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance and in such way as to do the least injury to private property. And they, the said Reviewers shall make a return of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarterly Sessions together with a plan or draught of the Road so named, together with the course and distances and differences to the improvements through which it may pass.

The Petition of divers Inhabitants of Cambria Township

Ebensburg from the Road from Munster to Jefferson, commencing  
at the Bridge above Oldark Mill where the Munster and  
Ebensburg road intersect and ending at the house of John  
McKenzie, being constructed on low ground and crossing stream,  
frequently has become very burdensome to the people subjecting  
them to great expense, and frequently impassable from the impossibility  
of keeping it in repair. And therefore praying the court to  
appoint Surveyors to Vacate and Supply that portion of said  
Road from the Bridge above mentioned to Oldark Mill  
in said township.

Whereupon the Court upon due Consideration had  
of the premises do order and appoint Daniel Danaw, Samuel  
Dillow, Augustus Durbin P. Mc. Coy, Cornelius Duv and Jacob  
Turner, to view the road in the said petition prayed to be vacated  
and supplied, and to consider and judge whether it has  
become really inconvenient and burdensome, and if they  
or any five of them view the road thus any four of the actual  
owners agree that the same is become really inconvenient and burdensome  
as aforesaid, then to make report accordingly to the next  
Court.


