The Petition of the Subscribers Inhabitants of
Summerhill Township

Respectfully sheweth

That a Public Road has been ordered to be opened
between the following Points, to wit, "From the Rankin
town Road, at or near the place where the Road leading
from Helseler mill intersects the road leading from
Croyles mill to Ebersburg at or near Francis Tellmans
field". That the said Road has not yet been fully
opened, and part thereof is useless or inconvenient and
burthen some to the Inhabitants of the township
through which it passes - Your Petitioners therefore
pray that a View be granted to vacate so much
of the said road as lies between the following
points to wit, "From Francis Tellmans field to
the intersection of the said road with the Munster
Road at or near George Emighs Smith Shop."

Cambria County At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the
Peace held at Elensburg for the County of Cambria
on Monday the twenty ninth day of June Instant 1829
Before the Honorable Justices George Roberts & John
Murray, associate Judges of said Court on the application
of Michael Shaffer and John Mory. The Contractors
for Building a Bridge over Steacy Creek where the State
Road leading from Summervett to Elensburg crosses the same
Representing that said Bridge is now finished and praying
the Court to appoint the requisite number of viewers to view
and make report according to the directions of the act of
assembly. Whereupon the Court appointed for viewers on
the part of Cambria County, David Evans (Mason) ~~James~~
Peter Livergood, and David H. Roberts to view the said Bridge
as finished by the said Contractors and make report thereon
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held at Elensburg
for the County of Cambria aforesaid.

Cambridge County / In a Court of General quarters Sessions of the
peace held at the Court House in the County
of Cambridge on the thirteenth day of June
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty nine Before the
Honorable Judges Spencer one the petition
of inhabitants of said County setting forth
that they labour under great inconvenience
for want of a publick road to pass from
the road leading from the East water to the dry gap, at or
near the farm of Richard Nigle to intersect the road from
Phillipsburg to Larrette at or near the farm of James
McClendon and praying the Court to appoint proper persons
to view and lay out the same according to Law. Whereupon
the Court appointed for Viewers James McElwaine Charles
John McElwaine Andrew Anderson Simon Littlejohn
Thomas Adams and John Douglas Junr. to view
the ground for said Road and if any of the said Viewers
view the ground and any of the said Viewers agree
there is occasion for such Road they shall proceed to lay out
the same agreeable to the desires of the Petitioners as much as
having regard to the best ground for said Road and the
shortest distance in such manner as to do the least injury
to private property, and shall make report thereof stating
particularly whether they judge the same necessary
Togethr with a plan or draft thereof and the course and
distances expressed in words at length and not by
figures only and in reference to the Improvements through
which it may pass to the next Court of General Quarters
Sessions of the peace setting forth the names of those who
have viewed the same. Viewers to be first sworn -

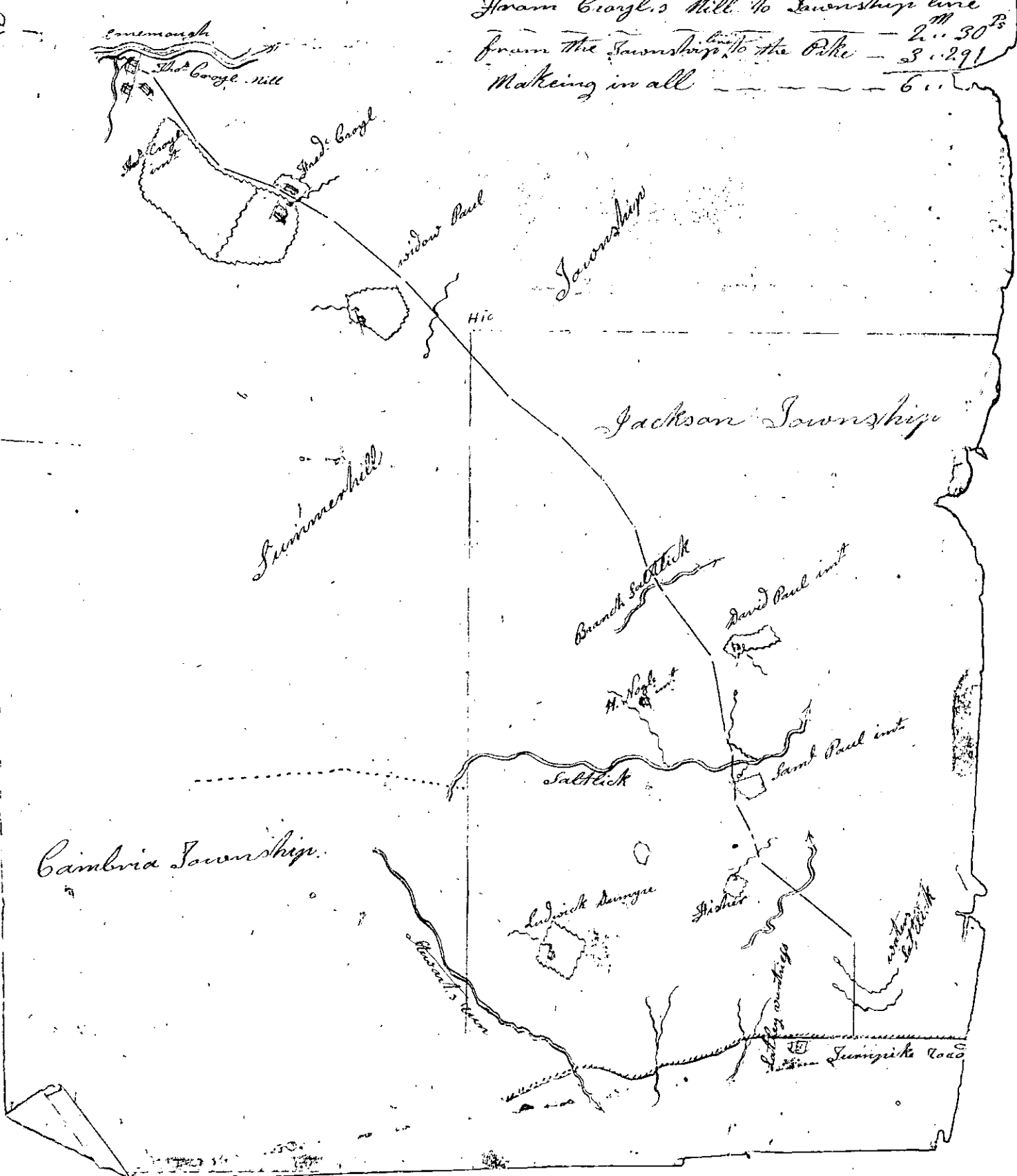
