At a court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the county of Cambria held at Ebensburg in and for said county on the second day of January A. D. 1839, before the Judges of the same Court, Upon the Petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Conemaugh in the said county, setting forth, that whereas the present Township road from Johnstown through the farm of John Miller, on the "Amish Hill" is so very steep as to be entirely impassable by waggons with heavy loads, and highly dangerous when used even with sleds and lighter carriages. The grade has been ascertained to exceed twelve degrees on the greater portion of the road in ascending the hill. From an examination carefully made, it has been proven that a road can be located up said hill, the highest grade of which will not exceed six degrees; they therefore pray the Honorable Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out a public road from the Johnstown & Legonier Turnpike road, at or near the south bank of Honey Creek opposite Johnstown to intersect the present Township road at a point opposite the house of said John Miller, and to vacate so much of the road now in use as shall be supplied thereby. Whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint George W. Kern, George S. King, Jacob Mittenberger, Daniel Stutzman, Samuel Andrews, and William Huber, who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity are to view the ground proposed to be vacated, and also the ground on which the above named road is proposed to be located, and to make report according to law to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

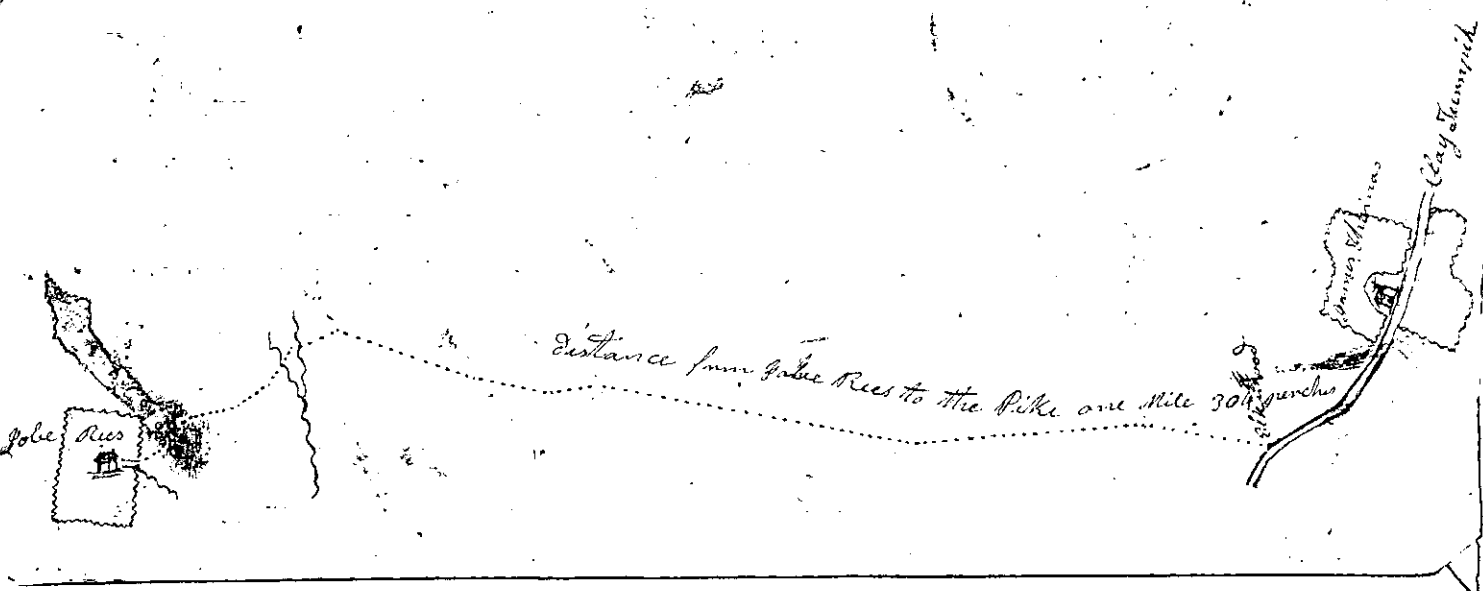
