Upon Petition, setting forth, that they labor under great
inconvenience for want of a public road or highway to
lead from a point on the Turnpike near the house of
Ernoch Rus, a corner of a division of land between
Isaac Rowland and Maria Craig, and to run the divi-
sion line between said farms, and to intersect Murray's
Township road at or near William Owen's Lane in
Blacklick Township; - and also, that a road was former-
