Moon, James Hansen and Francis O'Dell, who after being respectively sworn to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity and to aid the said premises, and therefore engage into the propriety of granting the prayer of the petitioners, and if they or any two of them after coming to the same are of opinion that there is occasion for dividing the said Township into two separate election districts, they shall proceed to ascertain and fix a division line, so that each district, so far as the same shall contain not less than one hundred voters; and it shall be the duty of the Commissioners, or any two of them to make a plot or map of the said Township, and the division line proposed to be made therein, all of which they or any two of them shall report to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, to be held in and for said County, together with their explicit opinion as to the expediency or propriety of granting the prayer of the petitioners in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
