thereon, all of which they or any two of them shall report to the next Court of Quarter  
Sessions, to be held in and for said County, together with their respective opin  
ion as to the expediency or propriety of granting the prayer of the petitioners  
In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed  
according to law,

lay out the same as agreeably to the desire of the  
petitioners as may be, having respect to the best


