through which it may pass. to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said Coun-

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of
the Peace in and for said County
held at Ebensburg on the 17 day of
July 1858, before the Judges of the same,
Upon petition of Divers Inhabitants of

the Township of White, and parts adjacent in said
County, setting forth, That they labor under great
inconveniences for want of a Road, beginning at
the Beaver Dam Sawmill, on the land of George
Walters, thence by the nearest and best route
until it intersects the Cambria and Clearfield
County line at or near where said line crosses Clearfield
Creek on land of James Gill in said Township,
and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view
and lay out the said road according to law, whereupon
the Court upon due Consideration had of the premises
do order and appoint Richard Proudfit, Joel
Gates, John Thomas, Matthias Dathwick, Jacob
Gibbs and Charles Gill, who after being respectively
sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their app-
ointment with fidelity, are to view the grounds pro-
posed for said roads, and if they or any five of them
view the same and any four of the actual viewers ag-
ree that there is occasion for such roads, they shall proceed
to lay out the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as
may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and the
shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least in-
jury to private property, and shall make report there-
