Exceptions,

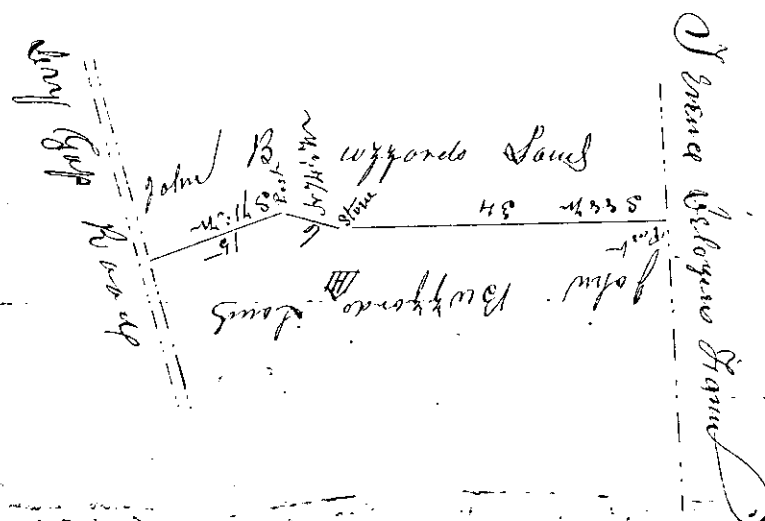

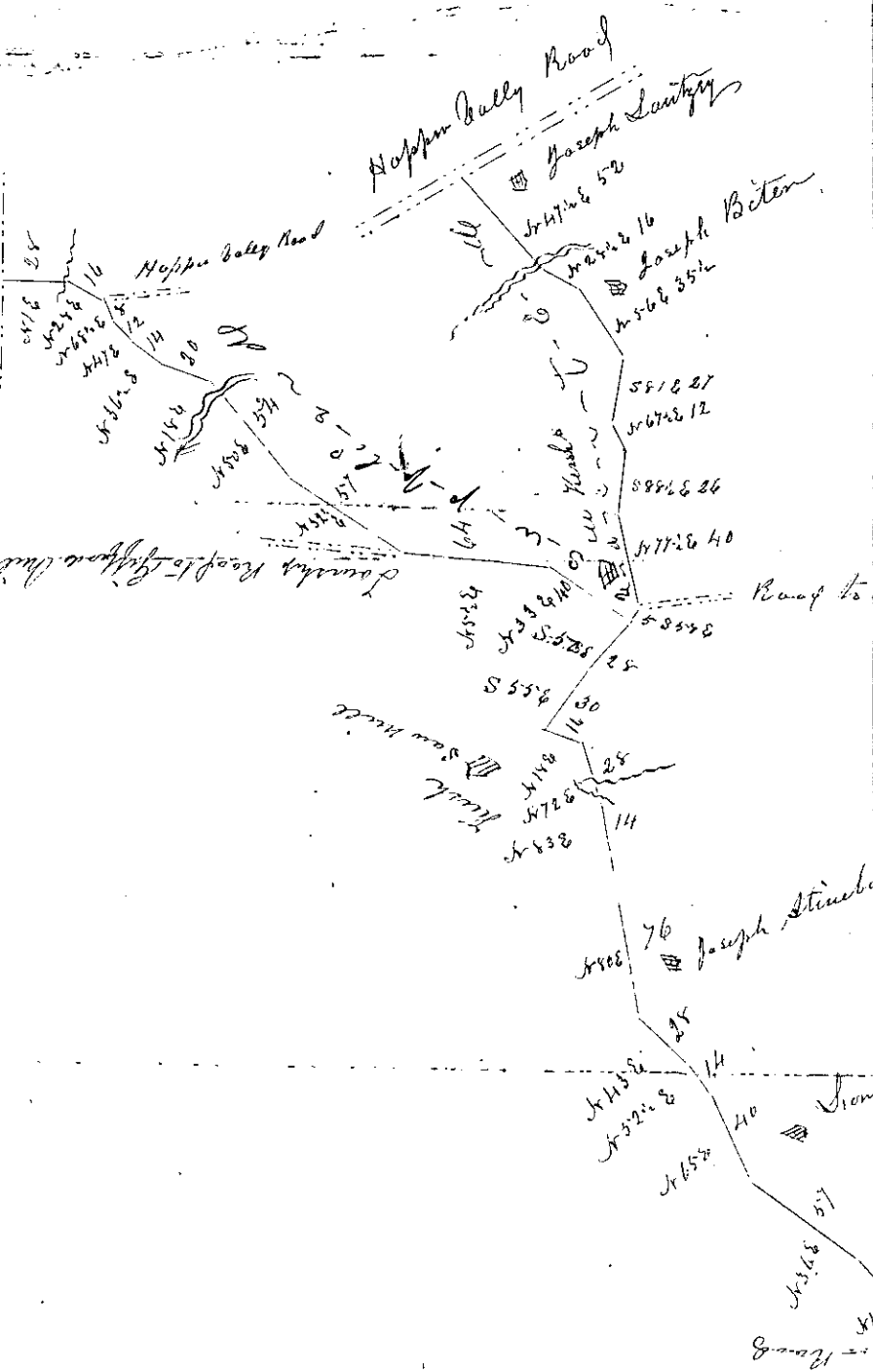
