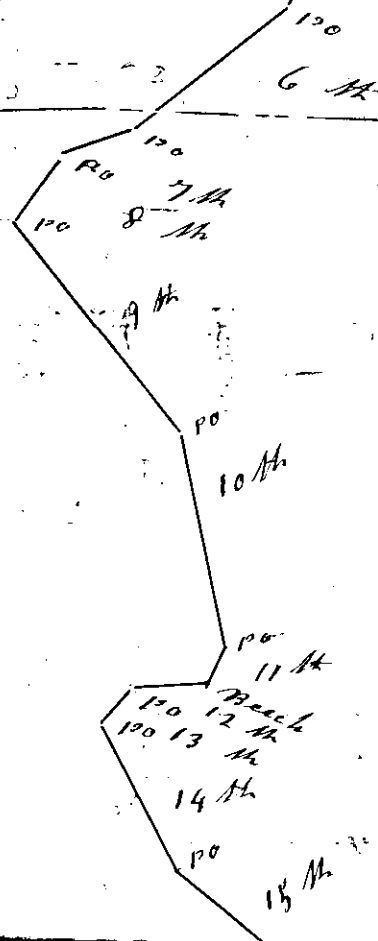

The Petition of the Subscribers, Citizens  
of the Village of Sylvania in Taylor Township,  
County and State aforesaid, Respectfully Sheweth:

That at a recent term of your Honorable Court  
an order was granted for a new "Township Road," to be lo-  
cated in the Village of Sylvania, <sup>commencing at or near</sup>  
a certain point on the P. R. R. <sup>(near the building formerly occupied by some Kerr's Mill)</sup> and intersecting with  
Rail Road Street, in said Village; that Reviewers have  
been appointed and the same located through some of  
the most valuable property in said Village, and further,  
the location will require two bridges, to be built across  
a certain Canal, or Race, belonging to the Quinn, or  
Iron works, and will not only interfere with their property  
but will be a heavy tax to the Township, which would be wholly  
unnecessary, as there are other locations which would be more  
convenient, satisfactory, and less expensive to the people  
of the Township. and in our opinion, there can be no good  
reason for abandoning the present Road, which is conveniently  
located and in good condition: —

Your Petitioners would further
