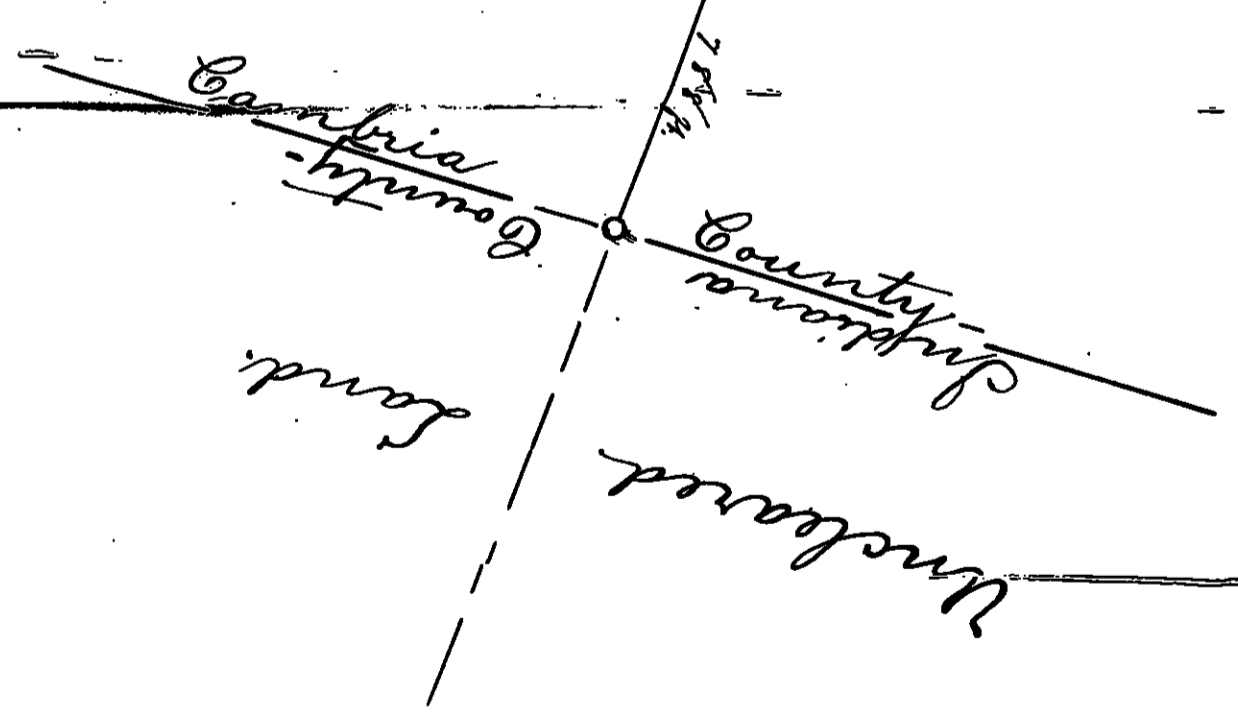

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 21.....day of April,.....A. D. 1914 , before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Blacklick....., in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience on the Seventh day of February 1905, a petition was filed for the appointment of viewers to view the ground for a road from Ivason to the Indiana County line on land of Rush Willett. That on the Sixth of February 1906 the report of viewers was confirmed and an order directed to open the road. That the said road was laid out by the Viewers and shown in a report is described as follows: Beginning at a point on the road leading from Strongstown to Nicktown, being a corner of land of A. H. Longehecker and D. F. Boring, near Ivason Post Office; thence along line between A. H. Longehecker and D. F. Boring, eighty seven degrees and thirty minutes West fifteen hundred and four feet; thence through lands of Horatia Willett North fifty one degrees, West, four hundred and eighty four feet; Thence North fifty three degrees West, Two hundred and ninety feet; thence North fifty seven degrees thirty minutes West, one hundred and ninety seven feet; thence North eight degrees thirty minutes West, three hundred and twenty feet; thence North fifty degrees forty five minutes West, six hundred and sixty feet to a point on the Indiana and Cambria County line, connecting with a road recently laid out in the County of Indiana from a point near to the residence of Thomas Donahoe in said County of Indiana and extending from Corner School House to Indiana County line. That the beginning of said road is at a point on the public road leading from the Clay Pike in Blacklick Township to Nicktown in Barr Township, and is located twenty four hundred feet from the intersecting road leading from Ivason to the road leading from Belsano to Nicktown; and road already opened and in use; and the ending of said road is at a point on the Indiana County line seventy five hundred forty feet from where the said road intersects with the Strongstown and Cherrytree public highway. Your petitioners further state that the said road has become useless and burdensome and not necessary for the travelling public.....

 and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. M. Shoemaker.....surveyor, and.....

John M. Ritter and Adam Shuman.....
 viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the monuments through which the road shall pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by upon the attached order of Court to view a piece of road in Blacklick Township, for the purpose therein stated, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of the township of Blacklick, by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and the the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points of the road to be viewed and in the vicinity thereof; And having been duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment, skill and ability; All of us men in accordance with the notices so given, and having carefully viewed the premises, We are of the opinion that the piece of road referred to in said order and hereafter more particularly designated, should be vacated. Said piece of road which was laid out but never opened begins on the road leading from Strongstown to Nicktown; more particularly on that portion of said road leading from Ivison th Heilwood; at a point on said road North 5 degrees East 176 feet from the intersection of the last mentioned road with the road leading directly from Ivison to Nicktown; being the place of beginning designated on the attached order, and from this point takes the following courses and distances, as designated on the

plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report; North 85 degrees 40 minutes West 1498 feet, North 66 degrees West 120 feet North 36 1/2 degrees West 185 feet, North 51 1/4 degrees West 222 feet, North 57 degrees West 243 feet, North 51 degrees West 95 feet, North 33 degrees West 300 feet, North 50 degrees West 788, more or less, to the line dividing the Counties of Cambria and Indiana: Where said described piece of road connects with a similar piece of road in Indiana County, which is likewise unopened?

Said road from the point of beginning passes through uncleared and wholly unsettled land, to the line of Indiana County and as we are informed the portion of the road lying in Indiana County passes over about two cleared farms; that portion of the road being about one mile and twelve hundred feet in length.

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY.

The Petition of the undersigned citizens of the Township of Blacklick, County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

That on the Seventh day of February 1905, a Petition was filed for the appointment of viewers to view the ground for a road from Ivison to the Indiana County line, on land of Rush Willett.

That on the Sixth of February 1906, the report of viewers was confirmed and an order directed to open the road.

That the said road as laid out by the viewers and shown in a report is described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the road leading from Strongstown to Nicktown, being a corner of land of A. H. Longenecker and D. F. Boring, near Ivison Post Office; thence along line between A. H. Longenecker and D. F. Boring North eighty seven degrees thirty minutes West, fifteen hundred and four feet; thence through lands of Horatia Willett North fifty one degrees West, four hundred and eighty four feet; thence North fifty three degrees West, two hundred and ninety feet; thence North forty seven degrees thirty minutes West, one hundred and ninety seven feet; thence North thirty eight degrees thirty minutes West, three hundred and twenty feet; thence North fifty degrees forty five minutes West, six hundred and sixty feet to a point on the Indiana and Cambria County line, connecting with a road recently laid out in the County of Indiana from a point near the residence of Thomas Donahoe in said County of Indiana, and extending from Orner School House to Indiana County line.
