That a public road long since laid out through Cambria Township, now known as the "John Cunningham" road, being part of an old road leading from Beulah, in Cambria Township, westward to Bethel, in Blacklick Township, beginning at a point in the road leading from Beulah to Bethel, 1027 feet west of the point where the Ebensburg and Blacklick branch of the Pennsylvania Pailroad, near Beulah station, by an overhead bridge, crosses the Ebensburg and Vintondale road, which, at this point, follows the road leading from Beulah to Bethel, and extending along the road leading from Beulah to Bethel in a westerly direction 3240 feet, through and along land of John Cunningham, to a point in the road leading from Beulah to Bethel, at where old stood, or near the house of John Cunningham, \$267 feet west of the above mentioned crossing, has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of the said Township of Cambria.

That another public road long since laid out through Cambria
Township, now known as the "Rankin" road, beginning at a point in
the John Cunningham road, or the road leading from Beulah to Bethel,
3241 feet west of the point where the Ebensburg and Blacklick branch
of the Pennsylvania Railroad, near Beulah station, by an overhead
bridge, crosses the Ebensburg and Vintondale road, which, at this
point, follows the road leading from Beulah to Bethel, and extending in a westerly direction 3351 feet through and along lands of
John Cunningham and L. D. Rankin, to a point at or near the house
and the line between Cambria and Blacklick Townships,
of L. D. Rankin, 6592 feet west of the above named crossing, has become useless, inconvenient and burdensone to the inhabitants of the
said Township of Cambria.


That a diligent search of the Road Docket failed to disclose
